AN ACT to repeal §30-27-15 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; to amend and reenact §30-27-3, §30-27-5, §30-27-8, §30-27-11 and §30-27-12 of said code; and to amend and reenact §30-37-7 of said code, all relating to the Board of Barbers and Cosmetologists; licensing schools of aesthetics, barbering, cosmetology, manicuring and massage; transferring authority to approve licensure for certain schools; clarifying powers and duties of the board; providing requirements for professional licensing, license renewal and work permits; establishing certain student registration requirements; and providing definitions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §30-27-15 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be repealed; that §30-27-3, §30-27-5, §30-27-8, §30-27-11 and §30-27-12 of said code be amended and reenacted; and that §30-37-7 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 27. BOARD OF BARBERS AND COSMETOLOGISTS.

§30-27-3. Definitions.

1 As used in this article, the following words and terms 2 have the following meanings, unless the context clearly 3 indicates otherwise:

4 (a) "Aesthetics" or "esthetics" means any one or any
5 combination of the following acts when done on the human
6 body for compensation and not for the treatment of disease:

7 (1) Administering cosmetic treatments to enhance or
8 improve the appearance of the skin, including cleansing,
9 toning, performing effleurage or other related movements,
10 stimulating, exfoliating or performing any other similar
11 procedure on the skin of the human body or scalp;

(2) Applying, by hand or with a mechanical or electrical
apparatus, any cosmetics, makeups, oils, powders, clays,
antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams or chemical preparations
necessary for the practice of aesthetics to another person's
face, neck, back, shoulders, hands, elbows and feet up to and
including the knee;

(3) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or
grooming of another person's face, neck, back, shoulders,
hands, elbows and feet up to and including the knee;

21 (4) The waxing, tweezing and threading of hair on22 another person's body;

23 (5) The wrapping of another person's body in a body24 wrap;

26 (7) The lightening of hair on the body except the scalp.

(b) "Aesthetician" or "esthetician" means a personlicensed under the provisions of this article who engages inthe practice of aesthetics.

30 (c) "Applicant" means a person making application for a
31 professional license, license, certificate, registration, permit
32 or renewal under the provisions of this article.

33 (d) "Barber" means a person licensed under the34 provisions of this article who engages in the practice of35 barbering.

(e) "Barbering" means any one or any combination of the
following acts when done on the human body for
compensation and not for the treatment of disease:

39 (1) Shaving, shaping and trimming the beard, or both;

40 (2) Cutting, singeing, shampooing, arranging, dressing,
41 tinting, bleaching, or applying lotions or tonics on human
42 hair, or a wig or hairpiece; and

(3) Applications, treatments or rubs of the scalp, face, or
neck with oils, creams, lotions, cosmetics, antiseptics,
powders, or other preparations in connection with the
shaving, cutting or trimming of the hair or beard.

47 (f) "Barber crossover" or "cosmetologist crossover" is a
48 person who is licensed to perform barbering and
49 cosmetology.

(g) "Barber permanent waving" means the following acts
done on the human body for compensation and not for the
treatment of disease:

- 53 (1) The bleaching or tinting of hair; and
- 54 (2) The permanent waving of hair.

(h) "Barber permanent wavist" means a person licensedto perform barbering and barber permanent waving.

57 (i) "Board" means the West Virginia Board of Barbers58 and Cosmetologists.

(j) "Certificate" means an instructor certificate to teachin a school under the provisions of this article.

61 (k) "Certificate holder" means a person certified as an
62 instructor to teach in a school under the provisions of this
63 article.

64 (1) "Cosmetologist" means a person licensed under the65 provisions of this article who engages in the practice of66 cosmetology.

(m) "Cosmetology" means any one or any combination
of the following acts when done on the human body for
compensation and not for the treatment of disease:

(1) Cutting, styling, shaping, arranging, braiding,
weaving, dressing, adding extensions, curling, waving,
permanent waving, relaxing, straightening, shampooing,
cleansing, singeing, bleaching, tinting, coloring, waxing,
tweezing, or similarly work on human hair, or a wig or
hairpiece, by any means, including hands, mechanical or
electrical devices or appliances;

77 (2) Nail care;

(3) Applying by hand or with a mechanical or electrical
device or appliance, any cosmetics, makeups, oils, powders,
clays, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams or chemical
preparations necessary for the practice of aesthetics to
another person's face, neck, shoulders, hands, elbows and
feet up to and including the knee;

84 (4) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or
85 grooming of another person's face, neck, shoulders, hands,
86 elbows and feet up to and including the knee;

- 87 (5) The wrapping of another person's body in a body88 wrap; and
- 89 (6) Performing aesthetics.
- 90 (n) "General supervision" means:
- 91 (1) For schools, a master or certified instructor is on the92 premises and is quickly and easily available; or
- 93 (2) For salons, a professional licensee is on the premises94 and is quickly and easily available.

95 (o) "Hair braiding" means any one or any combination of
96 the following acts when done on the human body for
97 compensation and not for the treatment of disease: Braiding,
98 plaiting, twisting, wrapping, threading, weaving, extending
99 or locking of natural human hair by hand or mechanical
100 device.

(p) "Hair Styling" means any one or any combination of
the following acts when done on the human body for
compensation and not for the treatment of disease:

(1) Cutting, styling, shaping, arranging, braiding,
weaving, dressing, adding extensions, curling, waving,
permanent waving, relaxing, straightening, shampooing,
cleansing, singeing, bleaching, tinting, coloring, waxing,
tweezing, threading or similarly work on human hair, or a
wig or hairpiece, by any means, including hands, mechanical
or electrical devices or appliances;

(2) The rubbing, cleansing, exercising, beautifying or
grooming of another person's face, neck, shoulders, hands,
elbows and feet up to and including the knee.

(q) "Hair Stylist" means a person licensed under theprovisions of this article who engages in the practice of hairstyling.

(r) "License" means a professional license, a salonlicense or a school license.

(s) "Licensed school" means a facility which has been
approved by the West Virginia Council for Community and
Technical College Education pursuant to section nine, article
two-b, chapter eighteen-b of this code, to educate persons to
be licensed or issued certain permits under the provisions of
this article.

(t) "Licensee" means a person, corporation or firmholding a license issued under the provisions of this article.

(u) "Nail care" means any one or any combination of the
following acts when done on the human body for
compensation and not for the treatment of disease:

(1) The cleansing, dressing, or polishing of nails of aperson;

133 134	(3) The cosmetic treatment of the feet up to the knee and the hands up to the elbow.
135 136 137	(v) "Nail technician" or "manicurist" means a person licensed under the provisions of this article who engages in the practice of nail care.
138	(w) "Permit" means a work permit.
139	(x) "Permitee" means a person holding a work permit.
140 141 142 143	(y) "Professional license" means a license to practice as a aesthetician, barber, barber crossover, barber permanent wavist, cosmetologist, cosmetologist crossover or nail technician.
144 145 146 147	(z) "Registration" means a registration issued by the board to a person who rents or leases a booth or chair from a licensed salon owner and operator, or both, or a registration issued by the board to a person who is a student in a school.
148 149	(aa) "Registrant" means a person who holds a registration under the provisions of this article.
150 151	(bb) "Salon" means a shop or other facility where a person practices under a professional license.
152 153	(cc) "Salon license" means a license to own and operate a salon.
154 155 156	(dd) "Student registration" means a registration issued by the board to a student to study at a school licensed under the provisions of this article.

§30-27-5. Powers and duties of the board.

- (a) The board has all the powers and duties set forth in
 this article, by rule, in article one of this chapter and
 elsewhere in law.
- 4 (b) The board shall:
- 5 (1) Hold meetings, conduct hearings and administer 6 examinations;
- 7 (2) Establish requirements for licenses, permits,8 certificates and registrations;

9 (3) Establish procedures for submitting, approving and 10 rejecting applications for licenses, permits, certificates and 11 registrations;

- 12 (4) Determine the qualifications of any applicant for13 licenses, permits, certificates and registrations;
- 14 (5) Prepare, conduct, administer and grade examinations15 for professional licenses and certificates;
- 16 (6) Determine the passing grade for the examinations;
- (7) Maintain records of the examinations the board or a
 third party administers, including the number of persons
 taking the examinations and the pass and fail rate;
- 20 (8) Set operational standards and requirements for21 licensed schools;
- (9) Hire, discharge, establish the job requirements and fixthe compensation of the executive director;

24 (10) Maintain an office, and hire, discharge, establish the 25 job requirements and fix the compensation of employees, 26 investigators/inspectors and contracted employees necessary 27 to enforce the provisions of this article: *Provided*, That any 28 investigator/inspector employed by the board on July 1, 29 2009, shall retain their coverage under the classified service, 30 including job classification, job tenure and salary, until that person retires or is dismissed: Provided, however, That 31 32 nothing may prohibit the disciplining or dismissal of any 33 investigator/inspector for cause;

this article, legislative rules, orders and final decisions of the
board;

48 alleged to have been committed by a licensed school to the

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52 shall conclude any such investigation by July 1, 2013. If the 53 board determines that probable cause exists that a violation 54 occurred, the board immediately shall advise and provide its 55 investigation file to the West Virginia Council for 56 Community and Technical College Education; 57 (18) Maintain an accurate registry of names and 58 addresses of all persons regulated by the board; 59 (19) Keep accurate and complete records of its 60 proceedings, and certify the same as may be necessary and 61 appropriate; 62 (20) Establish the continuing education requirements for 63 professional licensees and certificate holders; 64 (21) Issue, renew, combine, deny, suspend, revoke or reinstate licenses, permits, certificates and registrations; 65 66 (22) Establish a fee schedule; 67 (23) Propose rules in accordance with the provisions of 68 article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement 69 the provisions of this article; and 70 (24) Take all other actions necessary and proper to 71 effectuate the purposes of this article. 72 (c) The board may: 73 (1) Establish joint licenses; 74 (2) Contract with third parties to administer the

75 examinations required under the provisions of this article;

(3) Sue and be sued in its official name as an agency ofthis state;

(4) Confer with the Attorney General or his or herassistant in connection with legal matters and questions.

§30-27-8. Professional license requirements.

1 (a) An applicant for a professional license to practice as 2 a aesthetician, barber, barber crossover, barber permanent 3 wavist, cosmetologist, hair stylist, cosmetologist crossover or 4 nail technician shall present satisfactory evidence that he or 5 she:

- 6 (1) Is at least eighteen years of age;
- 7 (2) Is of good moral character;
- 8 (3) Has a high school diploma, a GED, or has passed the 9 "ability to benefit test" approved by the United States 10 Department of Education;

(4) Has graduated from a licensed school which has been
approved by the West Virginia Council for Community and
Technical College Education or has completed education
requirements in another state and meets the licensure
provisions of the board;

(5) Has passed an examination that tests the applicant's
knowledge of subjects specified by the board: *Provided*, That
the board may recognize a certificate or similar license in
lieu of the examination or part of the examination that the
board requires;

21 (6) Has paid the applicable fee;

(7) Presents a certificate of health from a licensedphysician;

- (8) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible foremployment in the United States; and
- 26 (9) Has fulfilled any other requirement specified by the27 board.
- (b) A license to practice issued by the board prior to July
 1, 2009, shall for all purposes be considered a professional
 license issued under this article: *Provided*, That a person
- 31 holding a license issued prior to July 1, 2009, must renew the
- 32 license pursuant to the provisions of this article.

§30-27-11. Work permit.

- 1 (a) The board may issue a work permit to practice to an 2 applicant who meets the following conditions:
- 3 (1) Has graduated from a licensed school approved by the
 4 West Virginia Council for Community and Technical
 5 College Education or has completed education requirements
 6 in another state and meets the licensure provisions of the
 7 board;
- 8 (2) Is waiting to take the examination;
- 9 (3) Has employment in the field in which he or she 10 applied to take the examination and is working under the 11 general supervision of a professional licensee;
- 12 (4) Has paid the work permit fee;

13 (5) Has presented a certificate of health issued by a14 licensed physician;

- (6) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible foremployment in the United States; and
- 17 (7) Meets all the other requirements specified by the18 board.

(b) A work permit expires at the end of the month afterissuance following the next examination in the specific field.A work permit may be renewed once.

(c) While in effect, a work permitee is subject to therestrictions and requirements imposed by this article.

§30-27-12. Student registration.

(a) Prior to commencing studies in a licensed school, a
 student shall acquire a student registration issued by the
 board.

4 (b) An applicant for a student registration shall present
5 satisfactory evidence that he or she meets the following
6 conditions:

- 7 (1) Is enrolled as a student in a licensed school;
- 8 (2) Is of good moral character;
- 9 (3) Has paid the required fee;
- 10 (4) Has presented a certificate of health issued by a 11 licensed physician; and

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12 (5) Is a citizen of the United States or is eligible for13 employment in the United States.

- 14 (c) The student registration is good during the prescribed15 period of study for the student.
- (d) The student may perform acts constituting barbering,
 barber permanent waving, cosmetology, aesthetics or nail
 care in a school under the general supervision of a master or
 certified instructor.

ARTICLE 37. MASSAGE THERAPISTS.

§30-37-7. Requirements for licensure; renewal of licenses; reinstatement; penalties.

(a) The board shall propose rules for legislative approval
 in accordance with article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this
 code, establishing a procedure for licensing of massage
 therapists. License requirements shall include the following:

5 (1) Completion of a program of massage education at a school approved by the West Virginia Council for 6 7 Community and Technical College Education pursuant to 8 section nine, article two-b, chapter eighteen-b of this code or 9 by a state agency in another state, the District of Columbia or 10 a United States territory which approves educational 11 programs and which meets qualifications for the National Certification Exam administered through the National 12 13 Certification Board for Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork. 14 This school shall require a diploma from an accredited high 15 school, or the equivalent, and require completion of at least

(2) Successful completion of the National Certification
for Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork (NCTMB)
examination, or other board approved examination; and

20 (3) Payment of a reasonable fee every two years required
21 by the board which shall compensate and be retained by the
22 board for the costs of administration.

23 (b) A license to practice massage therapy issued by the 24 board prior to July 1, 2006, shall for all purposes be 25 considered a license issued under this section: Provided, 26 That a person holding a license to practice massage therapy 27 issued prior to July 1, 2006, must renew the license pursuant 28 to the provisions of this article: Provided, however, That a 29 person whose license was issued by the board prior to July 1, 30 2006, and whose license subsequently lapses may, in the 31 discretion of the board, be subject to the licensing 32 requirements of this section.

33 (c) In addition to provisions for licensure, the rules shall34 include:

35 (1) Requirements for completion of continuing education36 hours conforming to NCTMB guidelines; and

37 (2) Requirements for issuance of a reciprocal license to
38 licensees of states with requirements which may include the
39 successful completion of the NCTMB examination or other
40 board approved examination.

(d) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this
section, the board may deny an application for renewal for
any reason which would justify the denial of an application
for initial licensure.

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45 (e) Any person practicing massage therapy during the
46 time his or her license has lapsed is in violation of this article
47 and is subject to the penalties provided in this article.

(f) A massage therapist who is licensed by the board shall
be issued a certificate and a license number. The current,
valid license certificate shall be publicly displayed and
available for inspection by the board and the public at a
massage therapist's work site.
