# Senate Bill No. 108

(BY SENATORS LAIRD, STOLLINGS, JENKINS, PLYMALE AND MILLER)

[Passed April 13, 2013; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to repeal §48-25A-1, §48-25A-2 and §48-25A-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; to repeal §48-27A-1, §48-27A-2 and §48-27A-3 of said code; to repcal §49-5D-5 of said code; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new article, designated §61-12A-1, §61-12A-2, §61-12A-3 and §61-12A-4, all relating to creating a Fatality and Mortality Review Team; setting forth membership of the team; setting forth terms of office; providing that members of the team are not to be compensated or reimbursed expenses; setting forth responsibilities of the team; requiring team to establish certain advisory panels; providing that team members will also serve as advisory panel members; requiring the Commissioner of the Bureau for Public Health, in consultation with the team, to promulgate legislative rules; providing for certain actions the team and advisory panels may not take in exercising their duties; requiring an annual report; providing confidentiality; setting forth record-kceping requirements; authorizing access to certain records; and requiring certain agencies to cooperate with the team and advisory panels.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §48-25A-1, §48-25A-2 and §48-25A-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be repealed; that §48-27A-1, §48-27A-2 and §48-27A-3 of said code be repealed; that §49-5D-5

of said code be repealed; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new article, designated §61-12A-1, §61-12A-2, §61-12A-3 and §61-12A-4, all to read as follows:

### ARTICLE 12A. FATALITY AND MORTALITY REVIEW TEAM.

### §61-12A-1. Fatality and Mortality Review Team.

1 (a) The Fatality and Mortality Review Team is created 2 under the Bureau for Public Health. The Fatality and 3 Mortality Review Team is a multidisciplinary team created to 4 oversee and coordinate the examination, review and 5 assessment of:

6 (1) The deaths of all persons in West Virginia who die as
7 a result of unintentional prescription or pharmaceutical drug
8 overdoses;

9 (2) The deaths of children under the age of eighteen 10 years;

11 (3) The deaths resulting from suspected domestic12 violence; and

13 (4) The deaths of all infants and all women who die
14 during pregnancy, at the time of birth or within one year of
15 the birth of a child.

16 (b) The Fatality and Mortality Review Team shall consist17 of the following members:

(1) The Chief Medical Examiner in the Bureau for Public
 Health or his or her designee, who is to serve as the chairperson and who is responsible for calling and coordinating meetings of the Fatality and Mortality Review Team and meetings of any advisory panel created by the Fatality and Mortality Review Team;

24 (2) The Commissioner of the Bureau for Public Health or25 his or her designee;

26 (3) The Superintendent of the West Virginia State Police27 or his or her designee; and

(4) A prosecuting attorney, as appointed by the Governor,
who shall serve for a term of three years unless otherwise
reappointed to a second or subsequent term. A prosecuting
attorney appointed to the team shall continue to serve until
his or her term expires or until his or her successor has been
appointed.

34 (c) Each member shall serve without additional
35 compensation and may not be reimbursed for any expenses
36 incurred in the discharge of his or her duties under the
37 provisions of this article.

## §61-12A-2. Responsibilities of the Fatality and Mortality Review Team and Advisory Panels.

(a) The Fatality and Mortality Review Team shall
 establish the following advisory panels to carry out the
 purposes of this article including:

4 (1) An unintentional pharmaccutical drug overdose
5 fatality review panel to examine, analyze and review deaths
6 resulting from unintentional prescription or pharmaccutical
7 drug overdose;

8 (2) A child fatality review panel to examine, analyze and
9 review deaths of children under the age of eighteen years;

(3) A domestic violence fatality review panel to examine,
 analyze and review deaths resulting from suspected domestic

13 (4) An infant and maternal mortality review panel to
14 examine, analyze and review the deaths of infants and women
15 who die during pregnancy, at the time of birth or within one
16 year of the birth of a child.

- 17 (b) The members of the Fatality and Mortality Review
  18 Team shall serve as members of each of the advisory panels
  19 established pursuant to this article.
- (c) The Commissioner of the Bureau for Public Health, in
  consultation with the Fatality and Mortality Review Team,
  shall propose rules for legislative approval in accordance
  with article three, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code that the
  advisory panels shall follow. Those rules shall include, at a
  minimum:
- 26 (1) The representatives that shall be included on each27 advisory panel;
- (2) The responsibilities of each of the advisory panels,
  including but not limited to, each advisory panel's
  responsibility to:
- 31 (A) Review and analyze all deaths as required by this32 article;
- 33 (B) Ascertain and document the trends, patterns and risk34 factors; and
- 35 (C) Provide statistical information and analysis regarding
  36 the causes of certain fatalities;
- 37 (3) The standard procedures for the conduct of the38 advisory panels;
- 39 (4) The processes and protocols for the review and
  i0 analysis of fatalities and mortalities of those who were not
  i1 suffering from mortal diseases shortly before death;

42 (5) The processes and protocols to ensure confidentiality43 of records obtained by the advisory panel;

44 (6) That the advisory panels must submit a report to the
45 Fatality and Mortality Review Team annually, the date the
46 annual report must be submitted and the contents of the
47 annual report;

48 (7) That the advisory panel may include any additional
49 persons with expertise or knowledge in a particular field that
50 it determines are needed in the review and consideration of a
51 particular case as a result of a death in subsection (a), section
52 one of this article;

(8) That the advisory panel may provide training for state
agencies and local multidisciplinary teams on the matters
examined, reviewed and analyzed by the advisory panel;

56 (9) The advisory panel's responsibility to promote public
57 awareness on the matters examined, reviewed and analyzed
58 by the advisory panel;

(10) Actions the advisory panel may not take or engagein including:

61 (A) Call witnesses or take testimony from individuals
62 involved in the investigation of a fatality;

63 (B) Contact a family member of the deceased;

64 (C) Enforce any public health standard or criminal law or
65 otherwise participate in any legal proceeding; or

(D) Otherwise take any action which, in the
determination of a prosecuting attorney or his or her
assistants, impairs the ability of the prosecuting attorney, his
or her assistants or any law-enforcement officer to perform
his or her statutory duties; and

71 (11) Other rules as may be deemed necessary to72 effectuate the purposes of this article.

73 (d) The Fatality and Mortality Review Team shall submit 74 an annual report to the Governor and to the Legislative 75 Oversight Commission on Health and Human Resources 76 Accountability concerning its activities within the state and 77 the activities of the advisory panels. The report is due 78 annually on December 1. The report is to include statistical 79 information concerning cases reviewed during the year, 80 trends and patterns concerning these cases and the team's recommendations to reduce the number of fatalities and 81 82 moralities that occur in the state.

# §61-12A-3. Access to information; other agencies of government required to cooperate.

(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to
 the contrary, the Fatality and Mortality Review Team and the
 advisory panels established by the team pursuant to this
 article may request information and records as necessary to
 carry out its responsibilities. Records and information that
 may be requested under this section include:

7 (1) Medical, dental and mental health records;

- 8 (2) Substance abuse records to the extent allowed by9 federal law; and
- 10 (3) Information and records maintained by any state,
  11 county and local government agency, except as provided in
  12 subsection (c), section two of this article.
- (b) State, county and local government agencies shall
  provide the Fatality and Mortality Review Team and the
  advisory panels established by the team with any information
  requested in writing by the team or by an advisory pinel.

### §61-12A-4. Confidentiality.

1 (a) Proceedings, records and opinions of the Fatality and 2 Mortality Review Team and the advisory panels established 3 by the team pursuant to this article are confidential and are 4 not subject to discovery, subpoena or introduction into 5 evidence in any civil or criminal proceeding. This section 6 does not limit or restrict the right to discover or use in any 7 civil or criminal proceeding anything that is available from 8 another credible source and entirely independent of the 9 proceedings of the team or advisory panels.

10 (b) Members of the Fatality and Mortality Review Team 11 and members of the advisory panels established by the team 12 may not be questioned in any civil or criminal proceeding 13 regarding information presented in or opinions formed as a 14 result of a meeting of the team. This subsection does not 15 prevent a member of the team or an advisory panel from 16 testifying to information obtained independently of the team or advisory panel which is public information. 17

(c) Proceedings, records and opinions of the Fatality and
Mortality Review Team and the advisory panels established
by the team are exempt from disclosure under the Freedom of
Information Act as provided in chapter twenty-nine-b of this
code.
