# Senate Bill No. 477

(Senator Palumbo, original sponsor)

[Passed April 12, 2013; in effect ninety days from passage.]

AN ACT to repeal §3-2-24 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact §3-2-5, §3-2-6, §3-2-7 and §3-2-11 of said code, all relating to electronic registration of voters; repealing outdated code regarding manual voter registration systems; authorizing Secretary of State to promulgate procedures to permit persons to register to vote through a secure electronic voter registration system; providing an exception to address requirements on registration for participants in the address confidentiality program; permitting transmission of electronically stored signatures for registration in certain instances; allowing acceptance of registration with or without an email address; requiring electronic registration be received by close of business on the day of the registration deadline; permitting people to register to vote through approved electronic voter registration systems at certain locations; authorizing the Division of Motor Vehicles to release certain information to the Secretary of State upon notice and consent of the registered voter; and making certain clarifications of current code.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §3-2-24 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, bc repealed; and that §3-2-5, §3-2-6, §3-2-7 and §3-2-11 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

#### **ARTICLE 2. REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.**

# §3-2-5. Forms for application for registration; information required and requested; types of application forms; notices.

1 (a) (1) All state forms for application for voter 2 registration shall be prescribed by the Secretary of State and 3 shall conform with the requirements of 42 U.S.C. §1973gg, 4 et seq., the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 and the requirements of the provisions of this article. Separate 5 6 application forms may be prescribed for voter registration 7 conducted by the clerk of the county commission, registration 8 by mail, registration in conjunction with an application for motor vehicle driver's license and registration at designated 9 10 agencies. These forms may consist of one or more parts, may 11 be combined with other forms for use in registration by 12 designated agencies or in conjunction with driver licensing 13 and may be revised and reissued as required by the Secretary 14 of State to provide for the efficient administration of voter 15 registration.

16 (2) Notwithstanding any provisions of subdivision (1) of 17 this subsection to the contrary, the federal postcard 18 application for voter registration issued pursuant to 42 U.S. 19 C. §1973, et seq., the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens 20 Absentee Voting Act of 1986 and the mail voter registration 21 application form prescribed by the Federal Election 22 Commission pursuant to 42 U. S. C. §1973gg, et seq., the 23 National Voter Registration Act of 1993, are accepted as valid forms of application for registration pursuant to the 24 25 provisions of this article.

26 (3) The Secretary of State is authorized to promulgate
27 procedures to permit persons to register to vote through a
28 secure electronic voter registration system.

29 (b) Each application form for registration shall include:

30 (1) A statement specifying the eligibility requirements for
31 registration and an attestation that the applicant meets each
32 eligibility requirement;

33 (2) Any specific notice or notices required for a specific
34 type or use of application by 42 U. S. C. §1973gg, *et seq.*, the
35 National Voter Registration Act of 1993;

36 (3) A notice that a voter may be permitted to vote the
37 partisan primary election ballot of a political party only if the
38 voter has designated that political party on the application for
39 registration unless the political party has determined
40 otherwise;

41 (4) The applicant's driver's license number or an
42 identification number issued by the Division of Motor
43 Vehicles. If the applicant does not have a driver's license or
44 an identification card issued by the Division of Motor
45 Vehicles, then the last four digits of the applicant's Social
46 Security number; and

47 (5) Any other instructions or information essential to48 complete the application process.

49 (c) Each application form shall require that the following
50 be provided by the applicant, under oath, and an application
51 which does not contain each of the following is incomplete:

52 (1) The applicant's legal name, including the first name,
53 middle or premarital name, if any, and last name;

54 (2) The month, day and year of the applicant's birth;

(3) The applicant's residence address including the
number and street or route and city and county of residence
except:

(A) In the case of a person eligible to register under the
provisions of 42 U. S. C. §1973ff, et seq., the Uniformed and
Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, the address at which
he or she last resided before leaving the United States or
entering the uniformed services, or if a dependent child of
such a person, the address at which his or her parent last
resided;

65 (B) In the case of a homeless person having no fixed 66 residence address who nevertheless resides and remains 67 regularly within the county, the address of a shelter, 68 assistance center or family member with whom he or she has 69 regular contact or other specific location approved by the 70 clerk of the county commission for the purposes of 71 establishing a voting residence; or

(C) In the case of a participant in the Address
Confidentiality Program administered by the Secretary of
State in accordance with section one hundred three, article
twenty-eight (a), chapter forty-eight of this code, the
designated address assigned to the participant by the
Secretary of State; and

(4) The applicant's signature, under penalty of perjury as
provided in section thirty-six of this article, to the attestation
of eligibility to register to vote and to the truth of the
information given. The clerk may accept the electronically
transmitted signature kept on file with another approved state
database for an applicant who applies to register to vote using
an approved electronic voter registration system in

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accordance with procedures promulgated by the Secretary of State.
(d) The applicant shall be requested to provide the following information but no application may be rejected for lack of this information:
(1) An indication whether the application is for a new registration, change of address, change of name or change of party affiliation;
(2) The applicant's choice of political party affiliation, if any, or an indication of no affiliation. An applicant who does not enter a choice of political party affiliation is listed as having no party affiliation on the voting record;
(3) The applicant's residence mailing address if different than the residence street address;
(4) The last four digits of the applicant's Social Security number;
(5) The applicant's telephone number;
(6) The applicant's e-mail address;
(7) The address where the applicant was last registered to vote, if any, for the purpose of canceling or transferring the previous registration; and

106 (8) The applicant's gender.

107 (e) The Secretary of State shall prescribe the printing
108 specifications of each type of voter registration application
109 and the voter registration application portion of any form
110 which is part of a combined agency form.

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(f) Application forms prescribed in this section may refer
to various public officials by title or official position but in no
case may the actual name of an officeholder be printed on the
voter registration application or on any portion of a combined
application form.

116 (g) No later than July 1 of each odd-numbered year, the Secretary of State shall submit the specifications of the voter 117 registration application by mail for statewide bidding for a 118 119 contract period beginning September 1 of each odd-numbered 120 year and continuing for two calendar years. The successful 121 bidder shall produce and supply the required mail voter 122 registration forms at the contract price to all purchasers of the 123 form for the period of the contract.

#### §3-2-6. Time of registration application before an election.

(a) Voter registration before an election closes on the
 twenty-first day before the election or on the first day
 thereafter which is not a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday.

4 (b) An application for voter registration, transfer of
5 registration, change of name or change of political party
6 affiliation submitted by an eligible voter by the close of voter
7 registration is effective for any subsequent primary, general
8 or special election if the following conditions are met:

9 (1) The application contains the information required by 10 subsection (c), section five of this article. Incomplete 11 applications for registration containing information which are 12 submitted within the required time may be corrected within 13 four business days after the close of registration if the 14 applicant provides the required information; and

15 (2) The application is received by the appropriate clerk of
the county commission no later than the hour of the close of

17 registration or is otherwise submitted by the following18 deadlines:

19 (A) If mailed, the application shall be addressed to the 20 appropriate clerk of the county commission and is 21 postmarked by the postal service no later than the date of the 22 close of registration. If the postmark is missing or illegible, 23 the application is presumed to have been mailed no later than 24 the close of registration if it is received by the appropriate 25 clerk of the county commission no later than the third day 26 following the close of registration;

(B) If accepted by a designated agency or motor vehicle
licensing office, the application is received by that agency or
office no later than the close of registration;

30 (C) If accepted through a registration outreach program,
31 the application is received by the clerk, deputy clerk or
32 registrar no later than the close of registration;

33 (D) If accepted through an approved electronic voter
34 'registration system, the application is received by the clerk of
35 the county commission or other entity designated by the
36 Secretary of State no later than the close of business on the
37 final day of registration; and

38 (3) The verification notice by the provisions of section
39 sixteen of this article mailed to the voter at the residence
40 indicated on the application is not returned as undeliverable.

# §3-2-7. Hours and days of registration in the office of the clerk of the county commission; in-person application for voter registration; identification required.

1 (a) The clerk of the county commission shall provide 2 voter registration services at all times when the office of the

3 clerk is open for regular business.

(b) An eligible voter who desires to apply for voter 4 registration in person at the office of the clerk of the county 5 commission shall complete a voter registration application on 6 7 the prescribed form and shall sign the oath required on that 8 application in the presence of the clerk of the county commission or his or her deputy: Provided, That an 9 10 individual may apply for voter registration using an approved electronic voter registration system if available at the office 11 12 of the clerk. Such system may electronically transfer the voter's signature stored in the database of another state 13 14 agency in accordance with procedures promulgated by the 15 Secretary of State. The applicant shall present valid identification and proof of age. The clerk may waive the 16 17 proof of age requirement if the applicant is clearly over the 18 age of eighteen.

19 (c) The clerk shall attempt to establish whether the 20 residence address given is within the boundaries of an 21 incorporated municipality and, if so, make the proper entry 22 required for municipal residents to be properly identified for 23 municipal voter registration purposes.

24 (d) Upon receipt of the completed registration25 application, the clerk shall either:

26 (1) Provide a notice of procedure for verification and
27 notice of disposition of the application and immediately begin
28 the verification process prescribed by the provisions of
29 section sixteen of this article; or

30 (2) Upon presentation of a current driver's license or
31 state-issued identification card containing the residence
32 address as it appears on the voter registration application,
33 issue the receipt of registration.

#### §3-2-11. Registration in conjunction with driver licensing.

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(a) The Division of Motor Vehicles or other division or 1 2 department that may be established by law to perform motor 3 vehicle driver licensing services shall provide each qualified registrant, as an integral and simultaneous part of every 4 process of application for the issuance, renewal or change of 5 6 address of a motor vehicle driver's license or official 7 identification card pursuant to the provisions of article two, 8 chapter seventeen-b of this code, a voter registration 9 application as prescribed in section five of this article when 10 the division's regional offices are open for regular business. An individual may apply for voter registration using an 11 12 approved electronic voter registration system if available at 13 a Division of Motor Vehicles regional office.

14 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to 15 the contrary, the Division of Motor Vehicles is required to 16 release the first name, middle name, last name, premarital 17 name, if applicable, complete residence address, complete 18 date of birth of an applicant and the applicant's electronic 19 signature, entered in the division's records for driver license 20 or nonoperator identification purposes upon notice and 21 written consent of the applicant. The notice and consent is a 22 required component of an electronic voter registration 23 application made available to the general public by the 24 Secretary of State. The release of an applicant's signature by the Division of Motor Vehicles to the Office of the Secretary 25 26 of State applies to any voter registration application approved 27 through an electronic voter registration system approved by 28 the Secretary of State regardless of the location of the online 29 user and provided the user grants written consent.

30 (c) A person who fails to sign the voter registration
31 application or who fails to return the voter registration
32 application to a driver licensing facility or to an appropriate

voter registration office is considered to have declined to
register. Information regarding a person's failure to sign the
voter registration application is confidential and may not be
used for any purpose other than to determine voter
registration.

38 (d) A qualified voter who submits the application for 39 registration pursuant to the provisions of subsection (a) of 40 this section in person at a driver licensing facility at the time 41 of applying for, obtaining, renewing or transferring his or her driver's license or official identification card and who 42 presents identification and proof of age at that time is not 43 44 required to make his or her first vote in person or to again 45 present identification in order to make that registration valid.

46 (e) A qualified voter who submits by mail or by delivery 47 by a third party an application for registration on the form 48 used in conjunction with driver licensing is required to make 49 his or her first vote in person and present identification as 50 required for other mail registration in accordance with the 51 provisions of subsection (g), section ten of this article. If the 52 applicant has been previously registered in the jurisdiction 53 and the application is for a change of address, change of 54 name, change of political party affiliation or other correction, 55 the presentation of identification and first vote in person is 56 not required.

57 (f) An application for voter registration submitted 58 pursuant to the provisions of this section updates a previous 59 voter registration by the applicant and authorizes the 60 cancellation of registration in any other county or state in 61 which the applicant was previously registered.

62 (g) A change of address from one residence to another 63 within the same county which is submitted for driver 64 licensing or nonoperator's identification purposes in accordance with applicable law serves as a notice of change
of address for voter registration purposes if requested by the
applicant after notice and written consent of the applicant.

- 68 (h) Completed applications for voter registration or 69 change of address for voting purposes received by an office 70 providing driver licensing services shall be forwarded to the 71 Secretary of State within five days of receipt unless other 72 means are available for a more expedited transmission. The 73 Secretary of State shall remove and file any forms which have not been signed by the applicant and shall forward 74 75 completed, signed applications to the clerk of the appropriate county commission within five days of receipt. 76
- (i) Voter registration application forms containing voter
  information which are returned to a driver licensing office
  unsigned shall be collected by the Division of Motor
  Vehicles, submitted to the Secretary of State and maintained
  by the Secretary of State's office according to the retention
  policy adopted by the Secretary of State.
