A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §61-3-11a, relating to creating a criminal offense of possession of burglar's tools; and establishing penalties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §61-3-11a, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 3. CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY.

§61-3-11a. Possession of burglar's tools; penalties.

- 1 (a) A person is guilty of possession of burglar's tools
- when he or she, individually or in concert with another,
- 3 possesses any tool, instrument or other thing adapted,
- 4 designed or commonly used for committing or facilitating the
- 5 commission of an offense involving forcible entry into
- 6 premises or theft by a physical taking under circumstances
- 7 which leave no reasonable doubt as to his or her:
- 8 (1) Intention to use the tool or tools in the commission of
- 9 an offense involving forcible entry into the property of
- another without the permission of the owner or owners
- 11 thereof; and
- 12 (2) Knowledge that the person individually, or in concert
- 13 with another, intends to use the same in the commission of an
- offense involving forcible entry as described in subdivision
- 15 (1) of this subsection.
- 16 (b) Any person violating the provisions of this section is
- 17 guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall
- be fined not more than \$1,000 or confined in jail for not more
- than one year, or both.
