[Originating in the Select Committee on Children and Poverty; reported February 19, 2014.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §18-21-2 and §18-21-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to the special Community-Based Pilot Demonstration Project to Improve Outcomes for At-Risk Youth; updating certain titles; and making technical corrections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18-21-2 and §18-21-4 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 21. SPECIAL COMMUNITY-BASED PILOT DEMONSTRATION PROJECT TO IMPROVE OUTCOMES FOR AT-RISK YOUTH.

§18-21-2. Creation of a special Community-Based Pilot Demonstration Project to Improve Outcomes for At-Risk Youth.

Effective July 1, 2012, and if funds are available, the 1 2 Secretary of the West Virginia Department of Health and 3 Resources shall select a Human community-based 4 organization to establish a special Community-Based Pilot 5 Demonstration Project to Improve Outcomes for At-Risk Youth in a specified community for a duration of four years. 6 The project will identify, implement and document best 7 practices that can be replicated in other communities. The 8 9 designated community-based organization shall operate the special pilot project under the direction of the Secretary of 10 the Department of Health and Human Resources and shall 11

12 work in collaboration with the State School Superintendent, 13 local county school superintendent, Executive Director of the President of the Community and Technical College System 14 15 Chancellor for Community and Technical College Education, the closest community and technical college and four-year 16 17 college or university, State Workforce Investment Division, 18 Executive Director of the West Virginia Vocational 19 Rehabilitation Services, the local juvenile court system, the 20 local workforce investment board, the Chancellor of the 21 Higher Education Policy Commission for Higher Education, 22 the Director of West Virginia Division of Juvenile Services, 23 the local mental or behavior health organizations and other governmental and community-based organizations. 24

§18-21-4. Organization and goals of the community-based pilot demonstration program.

(a) The pilot program shall be operated by a local
community-based organization under the direction the
Secretary of the West Virginia Department of Health and

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Human Resources and in collaboration with the State School 4 5 Superintendent, county school superintendent, Executive Director of the State Workforce Investment Division, 6 Executive Director of WV Vocational Rehabilitation 7 Services, the local juvenile court system, the Chancellor of 8 the Higher Education Policy Commission for Higher 9 10 Education, President of the Community and Technical College System the Chancellor for Community and 11 Technical College Education, president of the local 12 13 community and technical college and four-year college or university, the Director of the West Virginia Division of 14 15 Juvenile Services, the local mental/behavior health organizations and other governmental and community-based 16 17 organizations and partner agencies to serve as а clearinghouse to coordinate comprehensive youth and family 18 services. The pilot project shall be housed within the 19 community and will be directed by a local community-based 20 nonprofit organization. 21

22	(b) The pilot project shall operate out of a centrally
23	located building to coordinate services to youth and their
24	families in the selected county from birth to seventeen years
25	of age who are referred by the Department of Health and
26	Human Resources.
27	(c) The goal of the pilot program is to improve outcomes
28	for at-risk youth as measured by the following metrics:
29	(1) Early childhood development:
30	(A) Increase in the number of mothers receiving early
31	prenatal care;
32	(B) Increase in number of mothers participating in the
33	Right From the Start Program;
34	(C) Increase in the number of children screened by birth
35	to three year-old program for early development delays;
36	(D) Increase in the number of three year-olds enrolled in
37	Head Start;
38	(E) Increase in the number of four year-olds enrolled in

39 preschool.

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- 40 (2) Preschool youth and teen measures: (A) Decrease in school truancy; 41 42 (B) Decrease in truancy hearings; (C) Decrease in school suspensions; 43 (D) Decrease in school expulsions; 44 (E) Decrease in high school dropouts at a select school; 45 46 (F) Increase in the number of youth participating in a mentoring program; 47 (G) Increase in academic performance for select students; 48 (H) Increase in number of youth participating in summer 49 50 employment; and 51 (I) Increase in number of youth entering postsecondary education or job. 52 53 (3) Parent measures: (A) Increase in the number of individuals registered at 54 the WorkForce West Virginia Center; 55 (B) Increase in the number of individuals enrolled in job 56

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58	(C) Increase in the number of individuals completing job
59	training with a certification or credential;
60	(D) Increase in the number of individuals placed in
61	employment; and
62	(E) Increase in number of children enrolled in the CHIP
