### Senate Bill No. 98

(By Senators Cann, Stollings, McCabe, Williams and Green)

[Originating in the Committee on Education; reported March 27, 2013]

A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new article, designated §18B-11C-1 and §18B-11C-2; and to amend said code by adding thereto a new article, designated §18B-11D-1, §18B-11D-2, §18B-11D-3, §18B-11D-4, §18B-11D-5 and §18B-11D-6, all relating to higher education centers and institutes generally; setting forth legislative findings and intent; providing definitions; requiring certain reports; creating the Shale Research, Education, Policy and Economic Development Center at West Virginia University; setting forth legislative findings and purposes;

requiring certain rules; and providing certain powers and duties of West Virginia University Board of Governors, the center and the center director.

### Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new article, designated §18B-11C-1 and §18B-11C-2; and that said code be amended by adding thereto a new article, designated §18B-11D-1, §18B-11D-2, §18B-11D-3, §18B-11D-4, §18B-11D-5 and §18B-11D-6, all to read as follows: **ARTICLE 11C. COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY CENTERS AND INSTITUTES.** 

### §18B-11C-1. Findings and purposes; legislative intent.

1 (a) The Legislature finds that it is in the best interests of 2 the citizens of West Virginia for state institutions of higher education to function within the bounds of the state-3 established accountability system pursuant to article one-d of 4 5 this chapter and to focus their research efforts diligently on achieving the goals and objectives set forth therein and in 6 7 their institutional compacts developed pursuant to section seven, article one-d of this chapter. 8

(b) The intent of the Legislature in enacting this article is 9 to ensure that state institutions of higher education work 10 11 toward furthering the goals of accountability, effectiveness 12 and efficiency articulated in the public policy agenda and 13 state accountability system, established pursuant to article one-d of this chapter; to avoid unnecessary duplication of 14 15 program development and delivery; to ensure that programs 16 and services are closely aligned with the mission and approved compact of the institution; and to address the public 17 18 policy agenda.

## §18B-11C-2. Definition; creation of centers; criteria; proposal required.

1 (a) For the purposes of this article and article eleven-d of this chapter, "center" means any entity created by a state 2 3 institution of higher education with a distinct mission in a specific area of research and includes "research centers", 4 "research institutes" and "centers of excellence". A center 5 6 consists of an academic team whose stated purposes are to promote collaboration and best practices in the targeted 7

research area, to further new developments and innovative 8 ways of working and to achieve high quality research results. 9 10 (b) Beginning with the effective date of this article, the 11 governing board of a state institution of higher education may 12 not create a college or university center as defined in subsection (a) of this section, regardless of the title by which 13 14 the center is designated, until it first has submitted to the commission or council, as appropriate, a proposal to create 15 16 the center. The proposal shall be submitted at least sixty days prior to the official creation of the center and shall contain 17 18 the following information:

19 (1) Center name and governance structure. –

20 (A) The name of the proposed center and an outline21 showing how the center will be governed and operate;

(B) The name of the director or names of codirectors or,
if a director has not been selected, the process by which this
individual will be appointed; and

25 (C) Designation of the entity responsibility for26 developing rules and policies for the center.

27 (2) Center mission and goals. –

(A) The mission of the center showing how it differs in
focus and scope from all other centers established at the
institution;

31 (B) The need for the new center with supporting
32 documentation drawn from the institutional compact, mission
33 statement and public policy agenda;

34 (C) Demonstration of how the center will contribute in
35 unique ways to expanding knowledge, generating new
36 discoveries and providing positive societal impacts; and

37 (D) An explanation of why a new center is required to
38 complete the planned research activities, including a
39 description of strengths that establishing a center may bring
40 to the institution and the State of West Virginia.

41 (3) *Staff and resources.* –

42 (A) The faculty, resources, facilities and peripherals that
43 constitute the center and the resources that will be dedicated
44 to support of the center and its mission;

45 (B) Existence of a critical mass in the specific or46 interdisciplinary area of research, including interdisciplinary

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- research activities that provide evidence of the potential for 47 collaboration of researchers within the center: 48 49 (C) The researchers, academic rank, department and expected contribution to the center to be made by each 50 51 member, including strengths that the researchers bring to the 52 center and a brief academic biography of each researcher; (D) A record of available funding and the potential for 53 54 attracting external funding to further the goals of the center and make it self supporting; 55 56 (E) Resources that have been secured from external 57 sources and a rationale for resources requested from the state;
- 58 and

(F) Documentation showing how the center's distinct mission and organization eliminate unnecessary competition for resources, students and faculty within the state; drive economic development; generate talent; and create an energized, entrepreneurial environment that retains top quality graduates. 65 (c) The center director shall provide a report to the 66 commission or council, as appropriate, annually on the 67 anniversary date of the center's creation giving details of the 68 center's activities for the past year, including funding 69 specifics.

(d) The commission or council, as appropriate, shall 70 71 analyze each proposal received and present a summary to the Legislative Oversight Commission on Education 72 Accountability within sixty days after receiving the 73 institution's proposal. The commission or council also shall 74 75 summarize the center's annual report and present to the 76 Legislative Oversight Commission on Education 77 Accountability and the Joint Committee on Government and 78 Finance within thirty days of receiving the report.

# ARTICLE 11D. SHALE RESEARCH, EDUCATION, POLICY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CENTER AT WEST VIRGINIA UNIVERSITY.

§18B-11D-1. Legislative findings.

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(a) The Legislature finds that advancements in 1 2 technology have made possible the efficient development of abundant natural gas and oil resources contained in 3 4 underground shales and other geologic formations in the 5 State of West Virginia. These resources have the potential to generate jobs, stimulate economic activity, ensure energy 6 security, reduce carbon and other emissions and provide 7 significant revenues to the state. 8

(b) The Legislature further finds that creation of a 9 10 research, education, policy and economic development entity at West Virginia University for the purpose of pursuing 11 independent, objective, research-driven analysis that can 12 13 improve the effective and efficient development of shale resources is in furtherance of the university's land grant 14 status. Creation of this entity will allow West Virginia to 15 16 focus on the prudent development and regulation of natural 17 gas and liquid hydrocarbon from the shale resources in the 18 state and throughout the world.

# §18B-11D-2. Creation of the Shale Research, Education, Policy and Economic Development Center at West Virginia University; purposes.

(a) In view of the findings set forth in section one of this
 article, there is created a research, education, policy and
 economic development entity known as the Shale Research,
 Education, Policy and Economic Development Center at
 West Virginia University. This center is not required to file
 a precreation proposal with the commission pursuant to
 section two, article eleven-c of this chapter.

8 (b) The purposes for which the center are established9 include, but are not limited to, the following:

10 (1) Providing an opportunity for West Virginia 11 University to partner with industry and government bodies in 12 the state, the nation and around the world to explore 13 opportunities and engage in scientific research and 14 development of shale resources;

(2) Promoting cooperative and collaborative partnershipsbetween research universities in the state in order to facilitate

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17 knowledge sharing that will benefit all areas of West18 Virginia;

19 (3) Generating and documenting best practices in the20 areas of environment, safety, business and health;

21 (3) Advancing environmental performance by garnering22 industry and regulatory commitment;

23 (4) Improving data and process transparency and
24 developing effective outreach and engagement of affected
25 communities;

26 (5) Protecting the environment of West Virginia and
27 surrounding states by minimizing methane, carbon dioxide
28 and any other potential emissions;

(6) Structuring legal frameworks and promulgating rules
to promote prudent development of and access to the state's
resources.

32 (7) Developing and maintaining a flexible structure to
33 accommodate the needs of the state and of West Virginia
34 University together with its partners in education,

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35 government and industry. This flexible structure can be
36 achieved by encouraging the following actions:

37 (A) Investment by state and federal sources in strategic38 research;

39 (B) Initiation of research and development programs that
40 are focused and cofunded by West Virginia University and its
41 government and industry partners;

42 (C) Development of applied research that is 43 industry-funded; and

44 (D) Provision of specialized services for government and45 industry partners.

46 (c) West Virginia University shall use its research
47 capabilities in support of the center, including, but not limited
48 to, the following:

49 (1) Technologies for efficient resource assessment and
50 efficient extraction. These include various improvements to
51 extraction technologies, earth imaging and other technologies
52 to map, evaluate and assess resources and to understand
53 geoprocesses;

(2) Models to predict and manipulate multiphase fluid
flow including gas, liquid hydrocarbons and hydraulic
fracture fluids; and water life cycle analysis from source
through staging, use, wastewater recycling and treatment.

(3) Environmental and economic impacts, such as fuel
cycle analysis and construction of statewide baselines for
water and air quality, control of emissions and fuel waste in
all cycles of energy production and delivery;

(4) Policy analysis to facilitate cost effective permitting,
industry management, regulation and acceptance; and
improved gathering, storage, analysis, transparency and
access of energy data to serve government, industry and the
public.

(5) Human dimensions, such as workforce development,
in cooperation with public education and state institutions of
higher education in programs specializing in energy and
environment fields; analysis of public health risks and
promotion of best practices to protect public health and work
place health and safety;

(6) Effective communication strategies to establish shared understandings of expectations and awareness of issues and facts and to assist state agencies in developing a transparent, efficient and effective environment to manage the oil and natural gas resources for the benefit of all the state's citizens. These agencies include the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection, West Virginia State Tax Division

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80 and the West Virginia Geologic and Economic Survey. The

81 purposes of the communication strategies are to ensure that

82 development of these resources is tracked accurately, that

83 appropriate revenue streams are captured by the state and that

84 royalties to mineral lessors are protected appropriately;

85 (7) Development of best business practices to assist in
86 creating and maintaining a robust and prudently positioned
87 industry in the state; and

88 (8) Tracking and analyzing the economic impact and89 effect of the industry upon the state.

#### §18B-11D-3. Funding.

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(a) Funding for the center is provided by legislative
 appropriation and through support received from private
 industry, federal and international sources.

4 (b) Nothing in this article requires an appropriation, nor5 any specific level of appropriation, by the Legislature.

## §18B-11D-4. Powers and duties of the board of governors and the Shale Research, Education, Policy and Economic Development Center at West Virginia University.

(a) West Virginia University Board of Governors. - The
 board is authorized to operate the center to further the
 purposes set forth in this article. Powers and duties include,

4 but are not limited to, the following:

5 (1) Acquisition by purchase, lease, gift or otherwise, of
6 necessary lands, and the construction of necessary buildings
7 and appropriate industrial operations equipment;

8 (2) Expansion, remodeling, altering or equipping9 necessary buildings;

(3) Making contracts with any state, county or municipal
agency or private entity necessary and incidental to the
performance of its powers and duties under this article;

(4) Providing for equipment, expenses, compensation of
personnel, operation and maintenance of any facility of an
agency or institution used for the purposes of this article; and
(5) Cooperating with other state research universities,
agencies of the state, county and federal governments.

18 (b) *The Shale Research, Education, Policy and Economic* 19 Development Center at West Virginia University. – Under the 20 supervision of the director, appointed pursuant to section five 21 of this article, and within the scope of the authority granted 22 by this article and by rules duly proposed and adopted by the board of governors pursuant to section six, article one of this 23 24 chapter, the center may take all actions necessary to fulfill the 25 established purposes including providing the research 26 capabilities set forth in section two of this article.

### §18B-11D-5. Powers and duties of the center director.

1 (a) Subject to rules promulgated by the board of 2 governors pursuant to section six of this article, the President 3 of West Virginia University shall appoint a director of the 4 center who will serve at the will and pleasure of the 5 president.

6 (b) The director has the following responsibilities:

7 (1) Within thirty days of appointment, provide to the
8 commission a proposal for operation of the center containing
9 information as set forth in section two, article eleven-c of this
10 chapter;

11 (2) Manage the day-to-day operations of the center;

(3) Coordinate the partnerships and act as the liaison
between education, industry and government bodies and
other entities as appropriate to address the findings set forth
in section one of this article;

16 (4) Develop and advocate for an annual budget for the17 center;

(5) Report to the board of governors annually or as
requested and provide an analysis of the center's activities
together with any recommendations for improvement;

(6) Provide to the commission a report annually on the
anniversary date of the center's creation giving details of the
center's activities for the past year, including funding
specifics; and

### §18B-11D-6. Rules.

(a) The board of governors shall propose and adopt rules
 pursuant to section six, article one of this chapter, for the
 establishment, operation, cost reimbursement, fees for
 services, maintenance and government control of the center
 established by this article.

(b) The board may propose and adopt rules necessary for
cooperation under and compliance with any existing or future
federal statutes pertaining to grants-in-aid and any other rules
necessary to effectuate the purposes of this article.
