10	A BILL to repeal §9A-1-13, §9A-1-14 and §9A-1-15 of the Code of
11	West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact §9A-
12	1-2, §9A-1-4, §9A-1-5, §9A-1-6, §9A-1-8, §9A-1-9, §9A-1-10,
13	9A-1-11 and $9A-1-12$ of said code, all relating to the
14	Department of Veterans' Assistance; removing outdated
15	language; providing additional powers to the Secretary of
16	Department of Veteran's Assistance; modifying the duties of
17	the Veterans' Council; and authorizing the Secretary to award
18	grants to provide transportation for veterans.
19	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
20	That §9A-1-13, §9A-1-14 and §9A-1-15 of the Code of West
21	Virginia, 1931, as amended, be repealed; and that $9A-1-2$, $9A-1-4$,
22	\$9A-1-5, \$9A-1-6, \$9A-1-8, \$9A-1-9, \$9A-1-10, \$9A-1-11 and \$9A-1-12
23	of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
24	CHAPTER 9A. VETERANS' AFFAIRS ASSISTANCE.
25	ARTICLE 1. DIVISION DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS ASSISTANCE.

1 §9A-1-2. Veterans' Council; administration of department.

2 (a) There is continued the "Veterans' Council" consisting of 3 nine members who must be citizens and residents of this state and 4 who have served in and been honorably discharged or separated under 5 honorable conditions from the Armed Forces of the United States and 6 whose service was within a time of war as defined by the laws of 7 the United States. either Public Law No. 2 -- 73rd Congress, or 8 Public Law No. 346 -- 78th Congress, and amendments thereto.

9 (b) Where feasible, two members of the council shall be 10 veterans of either World War II or the Korean Conflict, at least 11 two members of the council shall be veterans of the Vietnam era, at 12 least one member shall be a veteran of the first Gulf War and at 13 least one member shall be a veteran of the Afghanistan or Iraqi 14 Conflicts. The members of the veterans' council shall be selected 15 with special reference to their ability and fitness to effectuate 16 the purposes of this article. If an eligible veteran is not 17 available or cannot be selected, a veteran who is a citizen and 18 resident of this state, who served in and was honorably discharged 19 or separated under honorable conditions from the Armed Forces of 20 the United States and who served during any time of war or peace 21 may be selected.

22 (c) A The secretary and such veterans' affairs officers, 23 assistants and employees as the secretary considers advisable, 24 shall administer the West Virginia Department of Veterans' 25 Assistance.

26 §9A-1-4. Duties and functions of Veterans' Council; appointment of

secretary; honoring academic achievement at military
 academies.

3 (a) It is the duty and function of The Veterans' Council to 4 advise the secretary on the general administrative policies of the 5 department, to select, at their first meeting in each fiscal year 6 commencing on July 1, a chairperson to serve one year, to advise 7 the secretary on rules as may be necessary, to advise the Governor 8 and the Legislature with respect to legislation affecting the 9 interests of veterans, their widows, <u>widowers</u>, dependents and 10 orphans and to make annual reports to the Governor respecting the 11 service of the department. The secretary has the same eligibility 12 and qualifications prescribed for members of the Veterans' Council. 13 The secretary ex officio shall maintain all records of the 14 Veterans' Council.

15 (b) The Veterans' Council may annually honor each West 16 Virginian graduating from the U.S. Military Academy, the U.S. 17 Naval Academy, the U.S. Air Force Academy and the U.S. Coast Guard 18 Academy with the highest grade point average by bestowing upon him 19 or her the "West Augusta Award." The award shall be in a design and council and include established by the 20 form the famous 21 Revolutionary War phrase from which the award's name is derived: 22 "Once again our brethren from West Augusta have answered the call 23 to duty." The council shall coordinate the manner of recognition 24 of the recipient at graduation ceremonies with each academy.

25 §9A-1-5. Compensation of director, veterans' affairs officers,

assistants and employees; payment to and expenses of Secretary
 and Veterans' Council members; traveling expenses; meetings of
 Veterans' Council.

4 (a) The director secretary shall receive an annual salary as 5 provided in section two-a, article seven, chapter six of this code 6 and necessary traveling expenses incident to the performance of his 7 or her duties. The salaries of the veterans' affairs officers, 8 assistants and employees shall be fixed by the Veterans' Council. 9 (b) The members of the Veterans' Council shall receive no 10 salary, but each member shall receive the same compensation and 11 expense reimbursement as is paid to members of the Legislature for 12 their interim duties as recommended by the Citizens Legislative 13 Compensation Commission and authorized by law for each day or 14 portion thereof engaged in the discharge of official duties. The 15 requisition for such expenses and traveling expenses shall be 16 accompanied by a sworn and itemized statement, which shall be filed 17 with the Auditor and permanently preserved as a public record.

18 (c) The Veterans' Council shall hold its initial meeting on 19 the call of the Governor, and thereafter shall meet on the call of 20 its chairman, except as otherwise provided. With the exception of 21 the first three meetings of the Veterans' Council, none of which 22 shall be of a duration longer than two weeks each, for 23 organizational purposes,

24 <u>(d)</u> The Veterans' Council shall meet not more than once every 25 two months at such times as may be determined by and upon the call

1 of the chairman for a period of not more than two days, unless 2 there should be an emergency requiring a special meeting or for a 3 longer period and so declared and called by the Governor or by the 4 chairman with the approval of the Governor.

5 <u>(e)</u> A majority of the members of the Veterans' Council <u>in</u> 6 <u>office</u> shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of official 7 business.

8 §9A-1-6. Oaths.

9 The members of the Veterans' Council, the <u>director secretary</u> 10 and the <u>veterans' affairs</u> officers <u>of the department</u> shall take and 11 subscribe to the oath prescribed by article four, section five of 12 the state Constitution before entering on their duties. Their 13 oaths shall be filed with the Secretary of State.

14 §9A-1-8. Offices.

15 <u>(a)</u> The offices of the director secretary shall be located at 16 the state capitol or other place provided in the capital city. The 17 director secretary shall keep his <u>or her</u> offices open at all 18 reasonable times for the transaction of business.

19 (b) The offices and meeting place of the Veterans' Council 20 shall be in the offices of the director secretary: Provided, That 21 the Veterans' Council with the approval of the Governor may hold 22 meetings at other places but not outside of this state, except in 23 the District of Columbia.

24 §9A-1-9. Duties of division department.

25 The division department of veterans' affairs assistance of

1 West Virginia shall:

2 (1) Assist veterans, their widows, <u>widowers</u>, dependents and 3 orphans within the state, in properly presenting their claims 4 before the United States Veterans' Administration, its 5 administrator, or any federal agency, the State of West Virginia, 6 or any of the several states of the United States, when the claims 7 arise out of service with the Armed Forces of the United States as 8 defined in section one of this article;

9 (2) Contact all veterans' organizations in this state through 10 their duly elected or appointive officers to effectuate the 11 purposes of this article and aid in the efficiency of the 12 operations of the <u>division department</u>;

(3) Render all possible and proper advice, assistance and 14 counsel to veterans, their families, and their widows, dependents 15 and orphans, within the state, and furnish them information on 16 compensation, allowances, pensions, insurance, rehabilitation, 17 hospitalization, education, vocational training, or refresher or 18 retraining courses in education or training, employment, loans or 19 aid for the purchase, acquisition or construction of homes, farms, 20 farm equipment and business property, preference in the purchase of 21 property and preference in employment, as provided or may be 22 provided by any federal act, any federal agency, this state or 23 other states;

(4) Make careful inquiry into all claims presented for payment
25 out of the State Treasury from any appropriation made for the
26 benefit of veterans, their widows, <u>widowers</u>, dependents and

1 orphans.

2 §9A-1-10. Powers and duties of director secretary.

3 The <u>director</u> <u>secretary</u> is the executive and administrative 4 head of the <u>division</u> <u>department</u> and has the power and duty, subject 5 to the provisions of section four of this article, to:

6 (a) Supervise and put into effect the purposes and provisions
7 of this article and the rules for the government of the division
8 department;

9 (b) Prescribe methods pertaining to investigations and 10 reinvestigations of all claims and to the rights and interests of 11 all veterans, their widows, <u>widowers</u>, dependents and orphans;

12 (c) Prescribe uniform methods of keeping all records and case 13 records of the veterans, their widows, <u>widowers</u>, dependents and 14 orphans;

(d) Sign and execute, in the name of the state by West Neuroperiod (d) Sign and execute, in the name of the state by West (d) Virginia <u>Division Department</u> of Veterans' <u>Affairs Assistance</u>, and by and with the consent of the Veterans' Council, any contract or agreement with the federal government or its agencies, other states, subdivisions of this state, corporations, associations, partnerships or individuals;

(e) Supervise the fiscal affairs and responsibilities of the
 22 division department;

(f) Organize the division department to comply with the requirements of this article and with the standards required by any federal act or any federal agency;

26 (g) Establish any regional or area offices throughout the

1 state that are necessary to promote efficiency and economy in 2 administration;

3 (h) Make reports that comply with the requirements of any 4 federal act or federal agency and the provisions of this article; 5 (i) Cooperate with the federal and state governments for the 6 more effective attainment of the purposes of this article;

7 (j) Keep a complete and accurate record of all proceedings; 8 record and file all contracts and agreements and assume 9 responsibility for the custody and preservation of all papers and 10 documents pertaining to his or her office and the division 11 department;

12 (k) Prepare for the Veterans' Council the annual reports to 13 the Governor of the condition, operation and functioning of the 14 division department;

15 (1) Exercise any other powers necessary and proper to 16 standardize the work; to expedite the service and business; to 17 assure fair consideration of the rights and interests and claims of 18 veterans, their widows, <u>widowers</u>, dependents and orphans; to 19 provide resources for a program which will promote a greater 20 outreach to veterans and which will advise them of the benefits and 21 services that are available; and to promote the efficiency of the 22 <u>division</u> department;

23 (m) Invoke any legal, equitable or special remedies for the 24 enforcement of his or her orders or the provisions of this article; 25 (n) Appoint the veterans' affairs officers and heads of 26 divisions of the division department, and of regional or area

1 offices, and employ assistants and employees, including case 2 managers and counselors, that are necessary for the efficient 3 operation of the division department;

4 (o) Provide resources and assistance in the development of an 5 Internet website which is to be used to inform veterans of programs 6 and services available to them through the <u>division department</u> and 7 the state and federal governments;

8 (p) Delegate to all or any of his or her appointees, 9 assistants or employees all powers and duties vested in the 10 director secretary, except the power to sign and execute contracts 11 and agreements: but the director <u>Provided</u>, That the secretary shall 12 be responsible for the acts of his or her appointees, assistants 13 and employees; and

(q) Provide volunteers who will drive or transport <u>Award</u> for a provide volunteers who will drive or transport <u>Award</u> appropriations, in his or her discretion, subject to available appropriations, to provide for the transportation of veterans to veterans' hospitals from the veteran's home or local Veterans' affairs <u>Assistance</u> offices. and who shall be paid an expense per diem of seventy-five dollar.

20 §9A-1-11. Establishment of veterans facilities support fund;
 authorized expenditures.

22 <u>(a)</u> There is hereby created <u>continued</u> in the State Treasury a 23 special revenue fund to be designated and known as the Veterans 24 Facilities Support Fund <u>which shall be administered by the</u> 25 <u>secretary</u>.

26 (b) All interest or other returns earned on the investment of

1 the moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund.

2 (c) Funds paid into the account shall be derived from the 3 following sources: (1) Any gift, grant, bequest, endowed fund or 4 donation which may be received by any veterans facility created by 5 statute from any governmental entity or unit or any person, firm, 6 foundation or corporation; and (2) All interest or other return on 7 investment accruing to the fund.

8 (d) Moneys in the fund are to be used for the operational 9 costs of any veterans facility created by statute, the acquisition, 10 design, construction, equipping, furnishing, including, without 11 limitation, the payment of debt service on bonds issued to finance 12 the foregoing and/or as otherwise designated or specified by the 13 donor.

14 <u>(e)</u> Any balance, including accrued interest or other earnings, 15 in this special fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not revert 16 to the General Revenue Fund but shall remain in the fund.

17 <u>(f)</u> Funds from the Veterans Facility Support Fund for 18 operational costs <u>of any veterans' facility as defined in this</u> 19 section will be distributed by appropriation of the Legislature.

20 (g) Funds from the Veterans Facility Support Fund for the 21 acquisition, design, construction, equipping, furnishing, 22 including, without limitation, the payment of debt service on bonds 23 issued to finance the veterans nursing home shall be transferred to 24 the Veterans Nursing Home Building Fund upon written request of the 25 director <u>Secretary</u>. of the division of Veterans Affairs to the 26 Investment Management Board and the state Treasurer in accordance

1 with the provisions of this section.

2 §9A-1-12. Legal assistance.

3 The Attorney General of the state and his <u>or her</u> assistants, 4 and the prosecuting attorneys of the various counties, shall render 5 to the Veterans' Council or director <u>secretary</u>, without additional 6 compensation, such legal services as may be required in the 7 discharge of the provisions of this article.
