10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$60-4-3a$ and $\$60-4-3b$ of the Code of
11	West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact
12	\$60-7-11 of said code, all relating to the sale of alcohol by
13	licensed manufacturers; authorizing licensed wineries, farm
14	wineries, distilleries and mini-distilleries to make retail
15	sales of wine and alcoholic liquors manufactured by the
16	winery, farm-winery, distillery or mini-distillery for
17	consumption off the premises on Sundays, beginning at ten
18	thirty a.m.; authorizing licensed wineries, farm wineries,
19	distilleries and mini-distilleries to offer complimentary
20	samples for consumption on the premises on Sundays, beginning
21	at ten thirty a.m.; and authorizing mini-distilleries which
22	manufacture less than fifty thousand gallons of alcoholic
23	liquor per year to seek and hold a separate license to operate
24	a private club on the premises of the distillery or
25	mini-distillery.

26 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

- 1 That \$60-4-3a and \$60-4-3b of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,
- 2 as amended, be amended and reenacted; and that §60-7-11 of said
- 3 code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
- 4 ARTICLE 4. LICENSES.
- $5\ \$60\text{-}4\text{-}3a.$ Distillery and mini-distillery license to manufacture
- 6 and sell.
- 7 (a) Sales of liquor. -- An operator of a distillery or a
- 8 mini-distillery may offer liquor for retail sale to customers from
- 9 the distillery or the mini-distillery for consumption off premises
- 10 only. Except for free complimentary samples offered pursuant to
- 11 section one, article six of this chapter, or sales for consumption
- 12 offered under a valid private club license held by a mini-
- 13 distillery pursuant to article seven, chapter sixty of this code,
- 14 customers are prohibited from consuming any liquor on the premises
- 15 of the distillery or the mini-distillery. Mini-distilleries that
- 16 produce fifty thousand or more gallons of alcoholic liquor per year
- 17 may not hold a private club license.
- 18 (b) Retail sales. -- Every licensed distillery or
- 19 mini-distillery shall comply with the provisions of sections nine,
- 20 eleven, thirteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen,
- 21 twenty-two, twenty-three, twenty-four, twenty-five and twenty-six,
- 22 article three-a of this chapter and the provisions of articles
- 23 three and four of this chapter applicable to liquor retailers and
- 24 distillers: Provided, That a licensed distillery or mini-distillery
- 25 may offer complimentary samples for consumption on premises and

- 1 make retail sales of alcoholic liquors manufactured by that
- 2 licensed distillery or mini-distillery, for consumption off the
- 3 premises on Sundays, beginning at ten thirty o'clock a.m.

- 4 (c) Payment of taxes and fees. -- The distillery or 5 mini-distillery shall pay all taxes and fees required of licensed 6 retailers and meet applicable licensing provisions as required by
- 8 (d) Payments to market zone retailers. -- Each distillery or 9 mini-distillery shall submit to the commissioner ten percent of the 10 gross sales price or each retail liquor sale for the value of all 11 sales at the distillery or the mini-distillery each month. This 12 collection shall be distributed by the commissioner, at least 13 quarterly, to each market zone retailer located in the distillery 14 or mini-distillery's market zone, proportionate to each market zone 15 retailer's annual gross prior years pretax value sales.
- 16 (e) Limitations on licensees. --No distillery 17 mini-distillery may sell more than three thousand gallons of 18 product at the distillery or mini-distillery location the initial 19 two years of licensure. The distillery or mini-distillery may 20 increase sales at the distillery or mini-distillery location by two 21 thousand gallons following the initial 24-month period of licensure 22 and may increase sales at the distillery or mini-distillery 23 location each subsequent 24-month period by two thousand gallons, 24 not to exceed ten thousand gallons a year of total sales at the mini-distillery location. 25 distillery or No licensed 26 mini-distillery may produce more than twenty thousand gallons per

- 1 calendar year at the mini-distillery location. No more than one
- 2 distillery or mini-distillery license may be issued to a single
- 3 person or entity and no person may hold both a distillery and a
- 4 mini-distillery license.

5 §60-4-3b. Winery and farm winery license to manufacture and sell.

- 6 (a) Sales of wine. -- An operator of a winery or farm winery
- 7 may offer wine produced by the winery or farm winery for retail
- 8 sale to customers from the winery or farm winery for consumption
- 9 off the premises only. Except for free complimentary samples
- 10 offered pursuant to section one, article six of this chapter,
- 11 customers are prohibited from consuming any wine on the premises of
- 12 the winery or farm winery, unless such winery or farm winery has
- 13 obtained a multicapacity winery or farm winery license.
- 14 (b) Retail sales. -- Every licensed winery or farm winery
- 15 shall comply with the provisions of articles three, four and eight
- 16 of this chapter as applicable to wine retailers, wineries and
- 17 suppliers when properly licensed in such capacities: Provided, That
- 18 <u>a licensed winery or farm winery may offer complimentary samples</u>
- 19 for consumption on premises and make retail sales of wine
- 20 manufactured by that licensed winery or farm winery, for
- 21 consumption off the premises on Sundays, beginning at ten thirty
- 22 o'clock a.m.
- 23 (c) Payment of taxes and fees. -- The winery or farm winery
- 24 shall pay all taxes and fees required of licensed wine retailers
- 25 and meet applicable licensing provisions as required by this
- 26 chapter and by rule of the commissioner. Each winery or farm

- 1 winery acting as its own supplier shall submit to the Tax 2 Commissioner the liter tax for all sales at the winery or farm 3 winery each month, as provided in article eight of this chapter.
- 4 (d) Advertising. -- A winery or farm winery may advertise a 5 particular brand or brands of wine produced by it, and the price of 6 the wine subject to federal requirements or restrictions.
- (e) Limitations on licensees. -- A winery or farm winery must 8 maintain separate winery or farm winery supplier, retailer and 9 direct shipper licenses when acting in one or more of those 10 capacities, and must pay all associated license fees, unless such 11 winery or farm winery holds a license issued pursuant to the 12 provisions of subdivision (12), subsection (b), section three, 13 article eight of this chapter. A winery or farm winery, if holding 14 the appropriate licenses or a multicapacity winery or farm winery 15 license, may act as its own supplier; retailer for off-premises 16 consumption of its wine as specified in section two, article six of 17 this chapter; private wine restaurant; and direct shipper for wine 18 produced by the winery or farm winery. All wineries must use a 19 distributor to distribute and sell their wine in the state, except 20 for farm wineries. No more than one winery or farm winery license 21 may be issued to a single person or entity, and no person may hold 22 both a winery and a farm winery license.
- 23 ARTICLE 7. LICENSES TO PRIVATE CLUBS.
- 24 §60-7-11. Licensee must purchase alcoholic liquors from or through
 25 commissioner or retail licensee; exceptions.
- 26 (a) (1) All licensees shall purchase all alcoholic liquors sold

- 1 by them from the West Virginia Alcohol Beverage Control
 2 Commissioner at prices established by the commissioner for sales of
 3 the alcoholic liquors to the public generally or from any retail
 4 licensee licensed under the provisions of article three-a of this
 5 chapter, except that the licensees may purchase those wines
 6 permitted to be sold at retail pursuant to article eight of this
 7 chapter from those distributors licensed pursuant to said article
 8 at the same prices the distributors sell the wines to retailers
 9 licensed pursuant to said that article and distilleries or
 10 mini-distilleries licensed under article four, chapter sixty of
 11 this code may sell alcoholic liquor manufactured on the premises of
 12 the distillery or mini-distillery, other than in sealed packages,
 13 at a separately licensed private club established on the premises
 14 of the mini-distillery.
- 15 (2) A licensee may by contract approved by the commissioner 16 receive deliveries of alcoholic liquor from a retail liquor store, 17 and the provisions of sections twelve and thirteen, article six of 18 this chapter shall not apply to the transportation of that 19 alcoholic liquor.
- 20 (b) In all reports filed under section sixteen, article 21 fifteen, chapter eleven of this code, retail licensees licensed 22 under the provisions of article three-a of this chapter shall 23 separately identify the amount of sales tax on sales of liquor to 24 licensees in the manner required by the Tax Commissioner.
- (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of section thirty, article fifteen, chapter eleven of this code to the contrary, the amount of the sales taxes collected by the Tax Commissioner shall be

- 1 deposited in a revolving fund account in the State Treasurer's
- 2 Office, designated the "Drunk Driving Prevention Fund", and
- 3 administered by the commission on drunk driving prevention, subject
- 4 to appropriations by the Legislature.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit the retail sale of wine produced by licensed wineries and farm wineries at the wineries and farm wineries between the hours of ten thirty a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on Sundays, and to permit the retail sale of alcoholic liquors manufactured and sold by licensed distilleries and mini-distilleries at the licensed distillery or mini-distillery on Sundays, beginning at 10:30 a.m. The bill would also permit licensed wineries, farm wineries, distilleries mini-distilleries to offer complimentary samples for consumption on premises on Sundays, beginning at 10:30 a.m. Finally, the bill would permit mini-distilleries which produce less than 50,000 gallons of alcoholic liquor per year to seek and hold a separate license for a private club located on the premises of the mini-distillery.
