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13	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$7-7-3$, $\$7-7-4$ and $\$7-7-6b$ of the Code
14	of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to counties;
15	reclassifying counties from ten classes to five classes;
16	increasing the salaries of county commissioners and elected
17	county officials; clarifying that the salary increases for
18	county commissioners and elected county officials take effect
19	with the new term of office; authorizing an automatic salary
20	increase every two years; clarifying that the automatic salary
21	increases only take effect with the new term of office;
22	providing that the State Auditor shall not be held liable for
23	relying upon information and data provided by a county
24	commission in certifying a county's annual budget; and
25	clarifying assessors' additional compensation classifications.

26 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

- That \$7-7-3, \$7-7-4 and \$7-7-6b of the Code of West Virginia,
- 2 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
- 3 ARTICLE 7. COMPENSATION OF ELECTED COUNTY OFFICIALS.
- 4 §7-7-3. Classification of counties for purpose of determining
- 5 compensation of elected county officials.
- 6 (a) Effective July 1, 1996, and thereafter, for the purpose of
- 7 determining the compensation of elected county officials, the
- 8 counties of the State of West Virginia will be grouped into ten
- 9 classes based on their assessed valuation of property, all classes.
- 10 These ten classes and the minimum and maximum valuation of
- 11 property, all classes, established to determine the classification
- 12 of each county are as follows:

(b) Effective July 1, 2016, and thereafter, for the purpose of determining the compensation of elected county officials, the counties of the State of West Virginia will be grouped into five classes based on their assessed valuation of property. These five classes and the minimum and maximum valuation of property, all classes, established to determine the classification of each county

- (b) (c) The assessed valuation of property, all classes, that shall be used as the base to determine the class of a county shall be the assessed valuation of property, all classes, of the county as certified by the county assessor, State Auditor and county clerk prior to March 29, 1996.
- (c) (d) Prior to March 29, 1998, and each second year thereafter, the county commission of each county, shall determine if the assessed valuation of property, all classes, of the county, as certified by the county assessor, State Auditor and county clerk is within the minimum and maximum limits of a class above or below the class in which the county then is the county's current

- 1 <u>classification</u>. If the county commission so determines, it shall
- 2 record the new classification of the county with the State Auditor
- 3 and State Tax Commissioner and record its action on its county
- 4 commission record.
- 5 (d) (e) The classification of each county shall be is subject
- 6 to review by the State Auditor. He or she shall determine if the
- 7 classification of each county is correct based on the final
- 8 assessed valuation of property, all classes, certified to him or
- 9 her by the county assessor, State Auditor and county clerk. If he
- 10 or she finds that a county is incorrectly classified, he or she
- 11 shall notify the county commission of that county promptly of his
- 12 or her finding and in any case shall notify the county prior to
- 13 June 30 of that current fiscal year. Any county commission so
- 14 notified shall correct its classification immediately and make any
- 15 necessary corrections in the salaries of its elected county
- 16 officials for the next fiscal year.
- 17 (e) (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of this article,
- 18 whenever any other provision of this code refers to classifications
- 19 of counties for purposes of imposing any right, duty or
- 20 responsibility, the classification system set forth in subsection
- 21 (a) of this section shall be utilized for determining the
- 22 classification of a particular county.
- 23 §7-7-4. Compensation of elected county officials and county
- commissioners for each class of county; effective
- date.

- (1) (a) The increased salaries to be paid to the county commissioners and the other elected county officials described in this subsection section on and after July 1, 2006, are set out in subdivisions (5) and (7) subsections (j) and (l) of this subsection section. Every county commissioner and elected county official in each county, whose term of office commenced prior to, or on or after July 1, 2006, shall receive the same annual salary by virtue of the legislative findings of extra duties as set forth in section one of this article.
- 10 (b) On or after July 1, 2016, the salaries to be paid to the

 11 county commissioners and the other elected county officials

 12 described in this section are set out in subsections (c), (d) and

 13 (e) of this section: Provided, That the salaries set out in

 14 subsections (c), (d) and (e) shall not take effect until the county

 15 commissioners' or elected county officials' new term of office.

- (e) Notwithstanding provisions of the Code to this contrary,
- 14 on or after July 1, 2016, any prosecutor that is employed by a
- 15 county on a part-time basis shall be paid a salary of \$57,500.
- 16 (f) Beginning July 1, 2018, and every two years thereafter,
- 17 the county commissioners and the other elected county officials of
- 18 <u>each county shall receive a salary increase equal to three percent</u>
- 19 of the county commissioner's or elected county official's salary
- 20 during the preceding year so long as the requirements of subsection
- 21 (q) of this section are met: Provided, That the salary increase
- 22 does not take effect until the new term of office for the county
- 23 commissioner or elected county official.
- 24 (2) (g) Before the increased salaries, as set out in
- 25 subdivisions (5) and (7) of this subsection provided for in
- 26 subsection (f), are paid to the county commissioners and the

1 elected county officials, the following requirements must be met:

2 (A) (1) The Auditor has certified that the proposed annual

3 county budget for the fiscal year beginning the first days of July

4 1, 2006, has increased over the previous fiscal year in an amount

5 sufficient for the payment of the increase in the salaries, set out

6 in subdivisions (5) and (7) of this subsection section, and the

7 related employment taxes: Provided, That the Auditor may not

8 approve the budget certification for any proposed annual county

9 budget containing anticipated receipts which are unreasonably

10 greater or lesser than that of the previous year. For purposes of

11 this subdivision subsection, the term "receipts" does not include

12 unencumbered fund balance or federal or state grants: Provided,

13 further, That the Auditor shall not be held liable for relying upon

14 information and data provided by a county commission in certifying

15 that county's annual budget; and

16 (B) (2) Each county commissioner or other elected county
17 official, described in this subsection section, in office on the
18 effective date of the increased salaries provided by this
19 subsection section, who desires to receive the increased salary
20 has, prior to that date, filed in the office of the clerk of the
21 county commission his or her written agreement to accept the salary
22 increase. The salary for the person who holds the office of county
23 commissioner or other elected county official, described in this
24 subsection section, who fails to file the written agreement as
25 required by this paragraph, shall be is the salary for that office
26 in effect immediately prior to the effective date of the increased

- 1 salaries provided by this subsection <u>section</u> until the person
- 2 vacates the office or his or her term of office expires, whichever 3 first occurs.
- 4 (3) (h) If there is an insufficient projected increase in 5 revenues to pay the increased salaries and the related employment
- 6 taxes, then the salaries of that county's elected officials and
- 7 commissioners shall remain at the level in effect at the time
- 8 certification was sought.
- 9 (4) (i) In any county having a tribunal in lieu of a county 10 commission, the county commissioners of that county may be paid 11 less than the minimum salary limits of the county commission for
- 12 that particular class of the county.

(8) (m) Any county clerk, circuit clerk, county assessor or sheriff of a Class I through Class V county, inclusive, any 20 assessor or any sheriff of a Class VI through Class IX county, 21 inclusive, shall devote full-time to his or her public duties to 22 the exclusion of any other employment: *Provided*, That any public 23 official, whose term of office begins when his or her county's 24 classification imposes no restriction on his or her outside 25 activities, may not be restricted on his or her outside activities 26 during the remainder of the term for which he or she is elected.

$1\ \$7\mbox{-}7\mbox{-}6\mbox{b}.$ Additional compensation of assessors according to county

- 2 classification.
- 3 <u>(a)</u> For the purpose of determining the additional compensation
- 4 to be paid to the county assessor of each county for the additional
- 5 duties provided by section six-a of this article, the following
- 6 compensations for each county assessor by class, as provided in
- 7 section three of this article, are hereby established and shall be
- 8 used by each county commission in determining the compensation of
- 9 each county assessor: For assessors in Class I V counties,
- 10 inclusive, \$15,000; for assessors in Class VI and VII counties,
- 11 \$10,000; for assessors in Class VIII and IX counties, \$9,000; and
- 12 for assessors in Class X counties, \$6,500.
- 13 (b) Beginning July 1, 2016, for the purpose of determining the
- 14 additional compensation to be paid to the county assessor of each
- 15 county for the additional duties provided by section six-a of this
- 16 article, the following compensations for each county assessor by
- 17 class, as provided in section three of this article, are
- 18 established and shall be used by each county commission in
- 19 determining the compensation of each county assessor:
- 20 <u>(1) For assessors in Class I III counties, inclusive,</u>
- 21 \$15,000;
- 22 (2) For assessors in Class IV counties, \$10,000; and
- 23 (3) For assessors in Class V counties, \$9,000.
