12	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18-2-9$ of the Code of West Virginia,
13	1931, as amended, relating to required course of instruction
14	in all public schools in West Virginia; and requiring
15	instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the Heimlich
16	maneuver.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That §18-2-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
19	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 2. STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.
21	<pre>\$18-2-9. Required courses of instruction; violation and penalty.</pre>
22	(a) In all public, private, parochial and denominational
23	schools located within this state, there shall be given prior to
24	the completion of the eighth grade at least one year of instruction

1 in the history of the State of West Virginia. The schools shall 2 require regular courses of instruction by the completion of the 3 twelfth grade in the history of the United States, in civics, in 4 the Constitution of the United States, and in the government of the 5 State of West Virginia for the purpose of teaching, fostering and 6 perpetuating the ideals, principles and spirit of political and 7 economic democracy in America and increasing the knowledge of the 8 organization and machinery of the government of the United States 9 and of the State of West Virginia. The state board shall, with the 10 advice of the state superintendent, prescribe the courses of study 11 covering these subjects for the public schools. It shall be the 12 duty of the officials or boards having authority over the 13 respective private, parochial and denominational schools to 14 prescribe courses of study for the schools under their control and 15 supervision similar to those required for the public schools. То 16 further such study, every high school student eligible by age for 17 voter registration shall be afforded the opportunity to register to 18 vote pursuant to section twenty-two, article two, chapter three of 19 this code.

(b) The state board shall cause to be taught in all of the public schools of this state the subject of health education, including instruction in any of the grades six through twelve as considered appropriate by the county board, on: (1) The prevention, transmission and spread of acquired immune deficiency

1 syndrome and other sexually transmitted diseases; (2) substance 2 abuse, including the nature of alcoholic drinks and narcotics, 3 tobacco products, and other potentially harmful drugs, with special 4 instruction as to their effect upon the human system and upon 5 society in general; (3) the importance of healthy eating and 6 physical activity to maintaining healthy weight; and (4) education 7 concerning CPR and first aid which includes instruction in the 8 Heimlich maneuver. The course curriculum requirements and 9 materials for the instruction shall be adopted by the state board 10 by rule in consultation with the Department of Health and Human 11 Resources. The state board shall prescribe a standardized health 12 education assessment to be administered within health education 13 classes to measure student health knowledge and program 14 effectiveness.

15 (c) (1) After July 1, 2015, the state board shall require to 16 be taught in all of the public schools of this state once during 17 grades nine through twelve as a requirement for graduation at least 18 thirty minutes of instruction on the subject of cardiopulmonary 19 resuscitation, which must include a psycho-motor skills component. 20 However, full certification is encouraged.

(2) Instruction may be given by community members such as
 emergency medical technicians, paramedics, police officers,
 firefighters and representatives of the American Heart Association
 or the American Red Cross. These community members are encouraged

1 to provide necessary training and instructional resources such as
2 cardiopulmonary resuscitation kits and other material at no cost to
3 the schools.

4 <u>(d)</u> An opportunity shall be afforded to the parent or guardian 5 of a child subject to instruction in the prevention, transmission 6 and spread of acquired immune deficiency syndrome and other 7 sexually transmitted diseases to examine the course curriculum 8 requirements and materials to be used in the instruction. The 9 parent or guardian may exempt the child from participation in the 10 instruction by giving notice to that effect in writing to the 11 school principal.

12 (c) (e) Any person violating the provisions of this section 13 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, 14 shall be fined not exceeding \$10 for each violation, and each week 15 during which there is a violation shall constitute a separate 16 offense. If the person so convicted occupies a position in 17 connection with the public schools, that person shall automatically 18 be removed from that position and shall be ineligible for 19 reappointment to that or a similar position for the period of one 20 year.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require CPR to be taught in the public school system as a condition of graduation.
