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16	A BILL to amend and reenact §18B-1D-10 of the Code of West
17	Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to adding the Bureau for
18	Children and Families, WorkForce West Virginia and the West
19	Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals to the existing entities
20	that are to enter into a state data-sharing compact; adding
21	child care and workforce data to the data that is to be
22	included in the P-20W Longitudinal Data System; revising
23	legislative findings; adding definitions; creating a governing
24	board of the P-20W Longitudinal Data System; setting forth

1 membership of the board; setting forth authority and duties of the board; adding requirements for the Bureau for Children and 2 3 Families, the State Board of Education, the Higher Education Policy Commission, the Council for Community and Technical 4 5 College Education and WorkForce West Virginia; requiring the 6 data warehouse to be housed within the West Virginia Network 7 for Educational Telecomputing; and adding components to the 8 state data-sharing compact.

9 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

10 That \$18B-1D-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as 11 amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

12 ARTICLE 1D. HIGHER EDUCATION ACCOUNTABILITY.

## 13 §18B-1D-10. State data sharing compact; legislative intent; 14 findings; definitions.

(a) The intent of the Legislature in enacting this section is to direct the commission, council, and State Board of Education, <u>the Bureau for Children and Families, WorkForce West Virginia and</u> <u>the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals</u> to enter into a state <u>compact</u>, consistent with the provisions of section six of this carticle, on or before <del>July 1, 2009</del> <u>July 1, 2014</u>, to develop and <u>carticle</u> and <u>P-20W</u> Longitudinal <del>education</del> Data System and to share <u>caucational</u> child care, education and workforce information.

23 (b) The Legislature makes the following findings:

24 (1) Sound data collection, reporting and analysis are critical

1 to building an education system capable of ensuring that all West 2 Virginia students are adequately prepared for college and the 3 global workforce. Elementary schools, middle schools, secondary 4 schools and higher education institutions can improve instructional 5 and educational decisionmaking using data that are collected and 6 made available to them.

7 (2) State education policymaking benefits from partnerships 8 between state education agencies, <u>the Bureau for Children and</u> 9 <u>Families, WorkForce West Virginia, the West Virginia Supreme Court</u> 10 <u>of Appeals</u> and entities with expertise in <u>child care</u>, education <u>and</u> 11 <u>workforce</u> research. It is beneficial for West Virginia to 12 establish systems and processes that permit qualified researchers 13 to assist with state evaluation and research functions in a manner 14 that is consistent with privacy protection laws.

(3) West Virginia is committed to establishing and maintaining a longitudinal <u>child care</u>, student <u>and workforce</u> unit record data r system that educators and policymakers can use to analyze and assess student progress beginning with early <del>learning</del> <u>care and</u> <u>education</u> programs and continuing through post-secondary education and into employment. The commission, council, <del>and</del> State Board of Education <u>and WorkForce West Virginia</u> have designed, built and deployed some of the fundamental components of a longitudinal data system and have engaged in extensive efforts to link and use available education data effectively. Now, it is necessary to

1 integrate and manage the various <u>child care</u>, education <u>and</u>
2 <u>workforce</u> data components in a cooperative manner to establish a
3 data-driven, decision-making environment for this state's <u>child</u>
4 care, education <del>system</del> and workforce systems.

5 (4) Students will achieve improved learning <u>and workforce</u> 6 outcomes because of the <u>P-20W</u> Longitudinal Data System established 7 through the state compact mandated by this section.

8 (5) Examples of research that can be conducted using child 9 care, education and workforce data include:

10 (A) The impact of state and federal education programs;

11 (B) The impact of child care programs;

12 (C) The performance of educator preparation programs;

13 (D) Best practices for classroom instruction, education 14 programs and curriculum; and

15 (E) Gauging success in preparing students for the 21st century 16 workforce.

17 (6) State use and management of <u>child care</u>, education <u>and</u> 18 <u>workforce</u> data shall be in accordance with all legal requirements 19 protecting student privacy and shall protect personal information 20 from intentional or accidental release to unauthorized persons and 21 from intentional or accidental use for unauthorized purposes.

22 (c) Definitions:

23 (1) "Longitudinal Data System" means a student unit record 24 data system that links student records beginning with early

learning programs and continuing through post-secondary education,
 entry into the workforce and beyond. The system may consist of
 separate student unit record systems integrated through agreement
 and data transfer mechanisms.

5 <u>(1) "Child care data" means data relating to enrollment,</u> 6 <u>attendance, demographics, the quality of child care received and</u> 7 <u>any other nonconfidential data necessary for furthering the state's</u> 8 <u>child care, education and workforce systems and agreed to in the</u> 9 state compact required by this section.

10 (2) "Confidential information" means data relating to a 11 person's Social Security number or other identification number 12 issued by a state or federal agency except for a unique identifier 13 generated as part of the system mandated by this section, email 14 address, religious affiliation, whether the person or a member of 15 their household owns or possesses a firearm, whether the person or 16 their family are or were recipients of financial assistance from a 17 state or federal agency, medical, psychological or behavioral 18 diagnoses, criminal history, criminal history of parents, siblings 19 or any members of the person's household, IP address, vehicle 20 registration number, driver's license number, biometric 21 information, handwriting sample, credit card numbers, consumer 22 credit history, credit score, or genetic information.

23 (3) "Governing board" means the governing board of the P20-W
 24 Longitudinal Data System.

1 <u>(4) "P-20W Longitudinal Data System" means a child care,</u> 2 <u>student and workforce unit record data system that links child</u> 3 <u>care, student and workforce records beginning with early care and</u> 4 <u>education programs and continuing through post-secondary education,</u> 5 <u>entry into the workforce and beyond. The system may consist of</u> 6 <u>separate unit record systems integrated through agreement and data</u> 7 <u>transfer mechanisms.</u>

8 (5) "Personally identifiable information" means information 9 that can be used on its own or with other information to identify, 10 contact or locate a single person, or to identify an individual 11 within the context of other information disclosed pursuant to this 12 section.

13 (2) (6) "Privacy protection laws" means the federal Family 14 Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U. S. C. 1232g) and 15 any other state or federal laws relating to the confidentiality and 16 protection of personally identifiable information.

17 (3) (7) "Research organization" means a governmental entity, 18 institution of higher education, public policy organization or 19 other person or entity conducting educational research that meets 20 the following conditions:

(i) Qualified to perform educational child care, education and
workforce research and protect the privacy of student data;
(ii) Seeks to perform research for a noncommercial purpose
authorized by privacy protection laws; and

1 (iii) Agrees to perform the research pursuant to a written 2 agreement meeting the requirements of privacy protection laws and 3 best research practices.

<u>(8) "Student data" means data relating to student performance,</u>
and includes: State and national assessments; course taking and
completion; grade point average; remediation; retention; degree,
diploma or credential attainment; enrollment; attendance;
demographic data; and any other nonconfidential data necessary for
furthering the state's child care, education and workforce systems
and agreed to in the state compact required by this section.

11 (9) "Workforce data" means data relating to employment status 12 and includes: Wage information; geographic location of employment; 13 employer information; and any other nonconfidential data necessary 14 for furthering the state's child care, education and workforce 15 systems and agreed to in the state compact required by this 16 section.

17 (d) There is a governing board of the P-20W Longitudinal Data
 18 System which shall include the following members:

19 (1) A designee agreed to by the Chancellor for Higher
20 Education and the Chancellor for Community and Technical College
21 Education;

22 (2) The State Superintendent of Schools or designee;

23 (3) A representative of the Office of Data Management and
 24 Analysis within the Department of Education to be appointed by the

1 <u>State Superintendent of Schools;</u>

2 <u>(4) The Executive Director of WorkForce West Virginia or</u> 3 designee;

4 (5) The Chief Justice of the West Virginia Supreme Court of 5 Appeals or designee;

6 (6) The Director of the West Virginia Network for Educational
7 Computing or designee; and

8 (7) The state administrator responsible for the federal Child 9 Care and Development Block Fund.

10 (e) The governing board shall elect a chair from among its

11 <u>members.</u>

12 (f) The governing board may:

13 (1) Propose rules for legislative approval in accordance with

14 article three-a, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement

15 the provisions of this section;

16 (2) Create a working group responsible for the strategic
17 direction of the P-20W Longitudinal Data System; and

18 (3) Create a user forum responsible for carrying out the 19 day-to-day tasks identified by the working group.

20 (q) The governing board shall:

21 (1) Develop an implementation plan to phase in the 22 establishment and operation of the P-20W Longitudinal Data System 23 in accordance with the requirements of this section and the compact 24 entered into pursuant to this section by September 1, 2014;

1 (2) Provide general oversight and direction over the P-20W 2 Longitudinal Data System in accordance with this section and the 3 compact entered into pursuant to this section; (3) Approve the annual budget for the P-20W Longitudinal Data 4 5 System; (4) Create an inventory of the individual child care, student 6 7 and workforce data to be maintained in the system and the data 8 required to be reported by state and federal education mandates; 9 (5) Propose rules for legislative approval in accordance with 10 article three-a, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to comply with 11 privacy protection laws and the governing board's detailed data 12 security and safequarding plan; 13 (6) Develop a detailed data security and safequarding plan 14 that includes: (i) Authorized access and authentication for authorized 15 16 <u>access;</u> 17 (ii) Privacy compliance standards; 18 (iii) Privacy and security audits; 19 (iv) Breach notification and procedures; and 20 (v) Data retention and disposition policies; 21 (7) Oversee routine and ongoing compliance with privacy 22 protection laws and the governing board's detailed data security 23 and safeguarding plan; (8) Ensure that all data reside within the State of West 24

1 Virginia including any data stored as backup;

2 <u>(9) Ensure that any contracts entered into on or after the</u> 3 <u>effective date of the amendments to this section during the 2014</u> 4 <u>regular session of the Legislature that govern databases and that</u> 5 <u>are outsourced to private vendors include express provisions that</u> 6 <u>safeguard privacy and security and include penalties for</u> 7 <u>noncompliance;</u>

8 <u>(10) Designate a standard and compliance timeline for</u> 9 <u>electronic transcripts that includes the use of the State Board of</u> 10 <u>Education's unique identifier for all students who have attended</u> 11 <u>public schools in West Virginia to ensure the uniform and efficient</u> 12 <u>transfer of student data between local education agencies and</u> 13 <u>institutions of higher education;</u>

14 <u>(11) Review research requirements and set policies for the</u> 15 <u>approval of data requests from state and local agencies, the West</u> 16 <u>Virginia Legislature and the public;</u>

17 (12) Report the following to the Governor and the Legislative 18 Oversight Commission on Education Accountability by November 15 of 19 each year:

20 (A) An update on the implementation of the P-20W Longitudinal
21 Data System;

22 (B) A list of all data sharing arrangements entered into with 23 research organizations pursuant to this section, and a summary of 24 each data sharing arrangement;

1 (C) A list of currently warehoused data that are determined to 2 be no longer necessary;

3 (D) Any proposed or planned expansion of data maintained in 4 the database; and

5 <u>(E) Any other recommendations made by the governing board; and</u> 6 <u>(13) Prohibit the collection of confidential information as</u> 7 defined in this section.

8 (h) The Bureau for Children and Families, the State Board of 9 Education, the Higher Education Policy Commission, the Council for 10 Community and Technical College Education and WorkForce West 11 Virginia shall:

12 (1) Make every effort to comply with the data requirements and 13 implementation schedule for the P-20W Longitudinal Data System; and 14 (2) Transfer child care data, student data and workforce data 15 to the P-20W Longitudinal Data System in accordance with the data 16 security and safeguarding plan developed pursuant to this section. 17 (d) (i) The state data-sharing compact entered into by the 18 commission, council, and State Board of Education, <u>Bureau for</u> 19 Children and Families, WorkForce West Virginia and West Virginia 20 Supreme Court of Appeals shall contain the following:

(1) A plan to establish and maintain a <u>P-20W</u> Longitudinal Data 22 System that links <u>child care</u>, early learning, elementary, middle 23 and secondary school student unit records with higher education 24 institution student unit records <u>and WorkForce West Virginia</u>

1 records;

2 (2) A plan to establish a data warehouse that:

3 <u>(A)</u> Integrates data from multiple <u>child care</u>, student <u>and</u> 4 <u>workforce</u> unit record systems; <del>and</del>

5 (B) Supports all of the uses and functions of the P-20W
6 Longitudinal Data System; and

7 (C) Is housed within the West Virginia Network for Educational 8 Telecomputing (WVNET);

9 (3) A list of areas for collaborative research and a 10 preliminary plan for conducting that research;

(4) A system for entering into data sharing arrangements with l2 each other and with research organizations consistent with l3 subsection (f) (k) of this section; and

14 (5) A provision that allows another party to the compact to 15 review any draft report or study generated using that party's data 16 at least ten days before the report or study is released publicly. 17 During that ten-day period, each party shall be given the 18 opportunity to submit comments regarding the accuracy, conclusions 19 and recommendations of the report or study;

20 (6) A P-20W data dictionary in which all data within the P-20W
21 Longitudinal Data System will be defined. The P-20W data
22 dictionary shall minimally include the data element's definition,
23 agency ownership, contact information for information about the
24 data and the reason for collection of the data; and

1 <u>(7) A determination of which data are available to each party</u> 2 <u>of the compact based on ensuring that data are only shared when</u> 3 <u>necessary to further the state's child care, education and</u> 4 <u>workforce systems.</u>

5 (e) (j) To facilitate implementation of the requirements of 6 this section:

7 (1) The commission, council, <del>and</del> State Board of Education, 8 <u>Bureau for Children and Families and WorkForce West Virginia</u> are 9 authorized to disclose data to the <u>P-20W</u> Longitudinal Data System 10 and to each other consistent with the purposes of this section;

11 (2) With the assistance of the state <u>State</u> Board of Education, 12 the commission, council, state institutions of higher education <u>and</u> 13 <u>WorkForce West Virginia</u> shall collect the State Board of 14 Education's unique identifier for all students who have attended 15 public schools in West Virginia to facilitate better matching of 16 student unit record data; <u>and</u>

17 (3) The commission, council, and State Board of Education, 18 <u>Bureau for Children and Families and WorkForce West Virginia</u> shall 19 collect, use, maintain, disclose and share data in accordance with 20 personal privacy laws and shall develop security measures and 21 procedures that protect personal information from intentional or 22 accidental release to unauthorized persons and from intentional or 23 accidental use for unauthorized purposes.

24 (f) (k) A data sharing arrangement entered into with a

1 research organization pursuant to this section shall meet the 2 following criteria:

3 (1) Permitted by and undertaken in accordance with privacy
4 protection laws;

5 (2) Receives prior approval from the State Superintendent of 6 Schools or designee, the Chancellor for Higher Education or 7 designee, and the Chancellor for Community and Technical College 8 Education or designee, the state administrator responsible for the 9 federal Child Care and Development Block Fund and the Executive 10 <u>Director of WorkForce West Virginia or designee</u>, as appropriate, if 11 data from that entity are being utilized used in the research; 12 (3) Prohibits the personal identification of any person by 13 individuals other than authorized representatives of the research

15 (4) Ensures the destruction or return of the data when no 16 longer needed for the authorized purposes under the data sharing 17 arrangement; <u>and</u>

14 organization who have legitimate interests in the information;

18 (5) Performed pursuant to a written agreement with the 19 research organization that does the following:

20 (A) Specifies the purpose, scope and duration of the data 21 sharing arrangement;

(B) Requires the recipient of the data to use personally identifiable information from education records only to meet the purpose or purposes of the data sharing arrangement stated in the

1 written agreement;

2 (C) Describes specific data access, use and security 3 restrictions that the recipient will undertake; and

4 (D) Contains such other terms and provisions as the
5 commission, council, and State Board of Education, <u>Bureau for</u>
6 <u>Children and Families and WorkForce West Virginia</u>, as appropriate,
7 consider necessary or appropriate.

8 (g) (1) As a condition of participating in state-level 9 financial aid programs provided for in chapter eighteen-c of this 10 code, the commission may require nonpublic institutions of higher 11 education to provide data for the <u>P-20W</u> Longitudinal Data System 12 and data warehouse.
