4 (b) The seminar may include the following topics:

5 (1) Powers and duties of the boards and board members;

6 (2) The financial procedures for boards;

7 (3) Purchasing requirements;

8 (4) Open meeting requirements;

9 (5) Ethics;

10 (6) Rule-making procedures;

11 (7) Procedures for the handling of complaints, investigations
12 and administrative hearings;

13 (8) Disciplinary actions available to boards;

14 (9) Records management procedures;

15 (10) Annual reports; and

16 (11) Any other topics the Auditor determines necessary or
17 informative.

18 (c) (1) The board members and the executive director or the
19 chief financial officer of a board newly created under the
20 provisions of this chapter shall attend a seminar provided under
21 this section within one year of the creation of the board.

22 (2) The chairperson, the executive director or the chief
23 financial officer of the board shall annually attend a seminar
24 provided under this section.

1 (3) Each board member shall attend at least one seminar
2 provided under this section during each term of office.

3 (d) The Auditor may charge a registration fee for the seminar
4 to cover the cost of providing the seminar. The fee may be paid
5 from funds available to a board and a board may approve an expense
6 reimbursement for the attendance of its members, executive director
7 and the chief financial officer of the board.

8 (e) An orientation session shall be conducted by
9 teleconferencing if the Auditor determines teleconferencing is
10 feasible. If it is determined that sessions are not feasible by
11 teleconferencing then an in person seminar shall be held in a state
12 owned facility, if one is available, or in a state park, if one is
13 available.

14 ~~(e)~~ (f) Prior to January 1 of each year, the Auditor shall
15 provide to the chairs of the Joint Standing Committee on Government
16 Organization a list of:

17 (1) The names and titles of the persons who attended the
18 seminar;

19 (2) The boards represented; and

20 (3) The number and dates of the seminars offered by the
21 Auditor during the previous year.

22 ~~(f)~~ (g) Ex officio members who are elected or appointed state
23 officers or employees and members of boards that have purely
24 advisory functions with respect to a department or agency of the

1 state are exempt from the requirements of this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the Auditor to hold orientation sessions for state licensing boards by teleconferencing, if feasibility. It further provides that in person sessions are to be held in available state owned facilities or state parks.
