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10	A BILL to amend and reenact $\$18-5-18a$ of the Code of West Virginia,

14	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
15	That §18-5-18a of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,	
16	be amended and reenacted to read as follows:	
17	ARTICLE 5. COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.	
18	§18-5-18a. Maximum teacher-pupil ratio.	
19	(a) County boards of education shall provide by the school	
20	year 1983-84, and thereafter, sufficient personnel, equipment and	
21	facilities as will ensure that each first and second grade	
22	classroom, or classrooms having two or more grades that include	
23	either the first or second grades shall not have more than twenty-	
24	five pupils for each teacher of the grade or grades and shall not	

1 have more than twenty pupils for each kindergarten teacher per 2 session, unless the state superintendent has excepted a specific 3 classroom upon application therefor by a county board.

4 <u>(b)</u> County boards shall provide by the school year 1984-85, 5 and continue thereafter, sufficient personnel, equipment and 6 facilities as will ensure that each third, fourth <u>and</u> fifth and 7 sixth grade classroom, or classrooms having two or more grades that 8 include one or more of the third, fourth <u>and</u> fifth and sixth 9 grades, shall not have more than twenty-five pupils for each 10 teacher of the grade or grades.

11 (c) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the 12 contrary, county boards shall provide sufficient personnel, 13 equipment and facilities as will ensure that sixth through twelfth 14 grade classrooms, or classrooms having two or more grades that 15 include one or more of the sixth through twelfth grades, may not 16 have more than thirty pupils for each teacher of the grade or 17 grades.

Beginning with the school year 1986-87, and thereafter, no county shall maintain a greater number of classrooms having two or more grades that include one or more of the grade levels referred to in this section than were in existence in said county as of January 1, 1983: *Provided*, That for the prior school years, and only if there is insufficient classroom space available in the school or county, a county may maintain one hundred ten percent of

1 such number of classrooms.

2 (d) During the school year 1984-85, and thereafter, the The 3 state superintendent is authorized, consistent with sound 4 educational policy, (a) to permit on a statewide basis, in grades 5 four through six and five, more than twenty-five pupils per teacher 6 in a classroom for the purposes of instruction in physical 7 education, and (b) to permit more than twenty pupils per teacher in 8 a specific kindergarten classroom and twenty-five pupils per 9 teacher in a specific classroom in grades one through six five 10 during a school year in the event of extraordinary circumstances as 11 determined by the state superintendent after application by a 12 county board of education.

13 <u>(e)</u> The state board shall establish guidelines for the 14 exceptions authorized in this section, but in no event shall may 15 the superintendent except classrooms <u>in kindergarten through fifth</u> 16 <u>grade</u> having more than three pupils above the pupil-teacher ratio 17 as set forth in this section, <u>nor may the superintendent except</u> 18 <u>classrooms containing more than thirty pupils in the sixth through</u> 19 <u>twelfth grades.</u>

(f) The requirement for approval of an exception to exceed the twenty pupils per kindergarten teacher per session limit or the twenty-five pupils per teacher limit in grades one through six five sis waived in schools where the schoolwide pupil-teacher ratio is twenty-five or less in grades one through six five: *Provided*, That

1 a teacher shall may not have more than three pupils above the 2 teacher/pupil ratio for grades one through five, nor may a teacher 3 have a classroom containing more than thirty pupils in the sixth 4 through twelfth grades. set forth in this section.

5 (g) Any kindergarten teacher who has more than twenty pupils 6 per session and any classroom teacher of grades one through six 7 <u>five</u> who has more than twenty-five pupils shall be paid additional 8 compensation based on the affected classroom teacher's average 9 daily salary divided by twenty for kindergarten teachers or twenty-10 five for teachers of grades one through six <u>five</u> for every day 11 times the number of additional pupils enrolled up to the maximum 12 pupils permitted in the teacher's classroom. All such additional 13 compensation shall be paid from county funds exclusively.

(h) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section to the contrary, commencing with the school year beginning on July 1, if 1994, a teacher in grades one, two or three or classrooms having two or more such of those grade levels shall not have more than two pupils above the teacher/pupil ratio as set forth in this section: *Provided*, That commencing with the school year beginning on July 1, 1995, such teacher shall not have more than one pupil above the teacher/pupil ratio as set forth in this section: *Provided*, 20 however, That commencing with the school year beginning on July 1, 21 teacher/pupil ratio as set forth in this section: *Provided*, 22 however, That commencing with the school year beginning on July 1, 23 to 1996, such teacher shall may not have any pupils above the 24 teacher/pupil ratio as set forth in this section.

1 <u>(i)</u> No provision of this section is intended to limit the 2 number of pupils per teacher in a classroom for the purpose of 3 instruction in choral, band or orchestra music.

4 <u>(j)</u> Each school principal shall assign students equitably 5 among the classroom teachers, taking into consideration reasonable 6 differences due to subject areas and/or grade levels.

7 <u>(k)</u> The state board shall collect from each county board of 8 education information on class size and the number of pupils per 9 teacher for all classes in grades seven <u>six</u> through twelve. The 10 state board shall report such information to the Legislative 11 Oversight commission on education accountability before January 1 12 of each year.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to set the maximum pupil to teacher ratio in grades six through twelve of public school classrooms at thirty to one.
