B. 4146 1 2 3 (By Delegates Fragale and Iaguinta) [Introduced January 14, 2014; referred to the 4 5 Committee on Education.] 6 7 8 9 10 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by 11 adding thereto a new article, designated §5-30-1, §5-30-2 and 12 §5-30-3, all relating to the creation of the Governor's 13 Committee on School Board Unification; explaining the purpose 14 for creating the committee; establishing the committee; naming 15 the committee's members; listing the committee's reimbursable 16 expenses; setting a quorum for the committee; establishing the 17 committee's meeting schedule; planning for the committee's 18 termination; and specifying what the committee must include in 19 its report to the Governor. 20 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: 2.1 That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended 22 by adding thereto a new article, designated §5-30-1, §5-30-2 and 23 \$5-30-3, all to read as follows:

- 1 Article 30. Governor's Committee on School Board Unification.
- 2 §5-30-1. Legislative purpose.
- 3 (a) The Legislature finds that the fifty-five county school
- 4 boards across West Virginia face challenges related to
- 5 accessability, funding, population and topography. In many cases,
- 6 the challenges county school boards face are shared by bordering
- 7 county school boards. With this knowledge, the Legislature
- 8 recognizes the need to study:
- 9 <u>(1) The feasibility of unifying and consolidating county</u>
- 10 school boards;
- 11 (2) The possible benefits and detriments that may come with
- 12 unifying and consolidating county school boards;
- 13 (3) The challenges and political realities that would be
- 14 <u>encountered when unifying and consolidating school boards; and</u>
- 15 (4) How the county school boards could be unified and
- 16 consolidated into no more than twenty-seven districts.
- 17 (b) The Legislature therefore declares that creation of the
- 18 Governor's Committee on School Board Unification will enable the
- 19 study of the possibilities for and implications of school board
- 20 unification.
- 21 §5-30-2. Governor's Committee on School Board Unification;
- 22 establishment of committee; members; expenses;
- 23 quorum; meetings; termination.

- 1 (a) This section establishes the Governor's Committee on
- 2 School Board Unification. The committee consists of nine members
- 3 representing educational interests across West Virginia.
- 4 (b) The following people serve as ex officio members of the
- 5 committee:
- 6 (1) The State Superintendent of Schools, who serves as chair;
- 7 (2) The chair of the House of Delegates Committee on
- 8 Education; and
- 9 (3) The chair of the Senate Committee on Education.
- 10 (c) The Governor shall appoint members of the committee by
- 11 August 1, 2014, and shall appoint the following people to serve as
- 12 members of the committee:
- 13 (1) One person representing the interests of the West Virginia
- 14 School Board Association;
- 15 (2) One person representing the interests of the American
- 16 Federation of Teachers--West Virginia;
- 17 (3) One person representing the interests of the West Virginia
- 18 Education Association;
- 19 (4) A public school teacher currently teaching a kindergarten
- 20 through fifth grade class;
- 21 (5) A public school teacher currently teaching a sixth through
- 22 eighth grade class; and
- 23 (6) A public school teacher currently teaching a ninth through
- 24 twelfth grade class.

- 1 (d) Other than the State Superintendent of Schools, and the
- 2 chairpersons of the House of Delegates Education Committee and
- 3 Senate Education Committee, none of the committee members may
- 4 reside in the same county.
- 5 (e) Members of the committee who serve in the Legislature are
- 6 not entitled to compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement for
- 7 travel expenses as if on an interim assignment, pursuant to the
- 8 provisions of section seven, article two-a, chapter four of this
- 9 code.
- 10 (f) The State Superintendent of Schools and appointed members
- 11 of the committee are not entitled to compensation for service on
- 12 the committee but may be reimbursed by the West Virginia Department
- 13 of Education for all reasonable and necessary expenses actually
- 14 <u>incurred</u> in the performance of their duties in a manner consistent
- 15 with guidelines of the Travel Management Office of the Department
- 16 of Administration.
- 17 (g) A majority of the members constitutes a quorum for the
- 18 purpose of conducting business.
- 19 (h) The committee shall meet at least once per month between
- 20 August 1, 2014 and January 1, 2015. All committee meetings shall be
- 21 conducted in accordance with article nine-a, chapter six of this
- 22 code.
- 23 (i) The committee shall prepare a report of its findings to
- 24 present to the Governor no later than January 1, 2015. The

- 1 committee is terminated upon the Governor receiving the committee's
- 2 report.
- 3 §5-30-3. The Governor's Committee on School Board Unification
- 4 Report.
- 5 The committee shall:
- 6 (1) Study issues pertaining to the unification and
- 7 consolidation of county school board in West Virginia;
- 8 (2) Develop legislation for consideration during the 2015
- 9 Regular Session of the Legislature, that is designed to encourage
- 10 the unification and consolidation of existing county school
- 11 districts into not more than twenty-seven districts;
- 12 (3) Consider any recommendations or proposals for possible
- 13 school district unifications or consolidations that include:
- 14 (A) A regionally facilitated process that allows a school
- 15 district governing board to develop its own unification or
- 16 consolidation plans; and
- 17 (B) A process for a county superintendent to develop a school
- 18 district unification or consolidation plan.
- 19 (4) Submit to the Governor, the Senate President, and the
- 20 Speaker of the House of Delegates, a report regarding the
- 21 committee's activities and recommendations on or before January 1,
- 22 2015.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to establish the Governor's Committee on School Board Unification, which will prepare a report for the Governor on unifying and consolidating county school

boards.
