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1 or availability of broadband service provided to the end-user.

2 (b) The commission has the authority to: 3 (1) Require an incumbent local exchange carrier to provide 4 open access to federally funded broadband facilities under rates 5 and terms that are reasonable and nondiscriminatory; (2) Arbitrate and enforce interconnection agreements as 6 7 provided by 47 U.S.C. §§251 and 252; and 8 (3) Investigate and resolve consumer service complaints. 9 (c) The provisions of subsection (a) do not limit or modify 10 the duties of any telecommunication carrier regarding the provision 11 of network interconnection, unbundled network elements and resold 12 services under 47 U.S.C. §251(c).

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide the Public Service Commission jurisdiction to regulate broadband services under certain circumstances, including arbitrating and enforcing interconnection agreements.

\$24-2-19 is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
