13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:	
14	That $61-3B-2$ and $61-3B-3$ of the Code of West Virginia, 1931,	
15	as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:	
16	ARTICLE 3B. TRESPASS.	
17	<pre>§61-3B-2. Trespass in structure or conveyance.</pre>	
18	Any person who knowingly enters in, upon or under a structure	
19	or conveyance without being authorized, licensed or invited, or	
20	having been authorized, licensed or invited is requested to depart	
21	by the owner, tenant or the agent of such owner or tenant, and	
22	refuses to do so, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon	
23	conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100, or confined

## 1 in jail not more than ten days, or both fined and confined.

If the offender is armed with a firearm or other dangerous weapon while in the structure or conveyance, with the unlawful and felonious intent to do bodily injury to a human being in said structure or conveyance at the time the offender knowingly trespasses, such offender shall, notwithstanding the provisions of section one, article seven, chapter sixty-one of this code, be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$500, or <del>be</del> confined in <del>the</del> county jail for a period not to exceed twelve months, or both <del>such</del> fine and imprisonment fined or confined.

## 12 §61-3B-3. Trespass on property other than structure or conveyance.

(a) It is an unlawful trespass for any person to knowingly, 14 and without being authorized, licensed or invited, to enter or 15 remain on any property, other than a structure or conveyance, as to 16 which notice against entering or remaining is either given by 17 actual communication to such person or by posting, fencing or 18 cultivation.

19 (b) First offense conviction. -- Upon a first trespassing 20 conviction pursuant to subsection (a):

The person is guilty of a misdemeanor and, shall be fined not 22 less than \$100 nor more than \$500, <u>or confined in jail not more</u> 23 <u>than ten days</u>, or both fined and confined.

24 (c) Second offense conviction. -- Upon a second trespassing

1 conviction pursuant to subsection (a):

The person is guilty of a misdemeanor and, shall be fined not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000, <u>or confined in jail not more</u> <u>than ten days, or both fined and confined.</u>

5 (d) Third offense conviction. -- Upon a third and subsequent 6 trespassing conviction pursuant to subsection (a):

7 The person is guilty of a misdemeanor and, shall be fined not 8 less than \$1,000 nor more than \$1,500, <u>or confined in jail not more</u> 9 than ten days, or both fined and confined.

10 (e) If the offender defies an order to leave, personally 11 communicated to him <u>or her</u> by the owner, tenant or agent of such 12 owner or tenant, or if the offender opens any door, fence or gate, 13 and thereby exposes animals, crops or other property to waste, 14 destruction or freedom, or causes any damage to property by such 15 trespassing on property other than a structure or conveyance, he <u>or</u> 16 <u>she</u> shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, 17 shall be fined not less than \$100 nor more than \$500 or <u>imprisoned</u> 18 <u>confined</u> in the county jail for a period not to exceed six months, 19 or both <del>such fine and imprisonment</del> fined and confined.

20 (c) If the offender is armed with a firearm or other dangerous 21 weapon with the unlawful and felonious intent to do bodily injury 22 to a human being during his <u>or her</u> commission of the offense of 23 trespass on property other than a structure or conveyance, such 24 offender shall, notwithstanding section one, article seven, chapter

1 sixty-one of this code, be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon 2 conviction thereof, shall be confined in the county jail for a term 3 not to exceed six months, or fined not more than \$100, or both such 4 fine and imprisonment <u>f</u>ined and confined.

5 (d) Notwithstanding and in addition to any other penalties 6 provided by law, any person who performs or causes damage to 7 property in the course of a willful trespass shall be liable to the 8 property owner in the amount of twice the amount of such the 9 damage. However, this article shall not apply in a labor dispute.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to include jail time in the possible penalties for certain types of trespass.
