3	(a) The Board of Medicine, Board of Examiners for Registered

7	Education Policy Commission and the Legislative Oversight

13	(b) Each of the boards listed in subsection (a) shall inquire

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require certain professional boards governing various health care professions to inquire of their licensees' anticipated retirement dates, and to provide that information to the Higher Education Policy Commission and the Legislative Oversight Commission on Health and Human Resources Accountability to enable better planning for future workforce needs.
