

1 state employment with pay, for not more than fifteen work days in
2 each year, to provide disaster relief or emergency services in
3 areas of the state in which a state of emergency has been declared.
4 Leave shall be granted under this section upon: (1) Designation of
5 the employee as an essential member by the chief executive officer
6 or other officer or agent of the emergency aid provider who has
7 authority to act on its behalf; and (2) approval of that employee's
8 immediate supervisor. Leave shall be granted without loss of pay,
9 annual leave, sick leave, earned overtime compensation, seniority
10 or compensatory time. The state shall compensate an employee
11 granted leave under this section at the employee's regular rate of
12 pay for those regular work hours during which the employee is
13 absent from his or her state employment. Any supervisor granting
14 leave to an employee for purposes of participating in disaster
15 relief or emergency services pursuant to this section shall make a
16 report to the Governor which includes the name of the employee and
17 the cost of salary and benefits of that employee during the period
18 of the leave. The Governor shall keep a record of the total cost
19 of the salary and benefits of employees who have been granted leave
20 and in no event may the total cost for all state agencies exceed
21 \$300,000: *Provided*, That upon approval of the Governor and
22 repayment of the cost to the employing agency, from the Civil
23 Contingent Fund, leave may be granted in an excess of a total cost
24 of \$300,000.

1 (b) As used in this section:

2 (1) "Emergency aid provider" means a local emergency service
3 organization or a volunteer fire department that is providing
4 emergency services during a state of emergency as a result of the
5 circumstances that resulted in the declaration of the state of
6 emergency;

7 (2) "Essential member" means a person designated by an
8 emergency aid provider whose services are needed to provide
9 emergency services due to the circumstances that resulted in the
10 declaration of the state of emergency;

11 (3) "State of emergency" means the situation existing after
12 the occurrence of a disaster or circumstance in which a state of
13 emergency has been declared by the Governor or by the Legislature
14 pursuant to the provisions of section six of this article or in
15 which a major disaster declaration or emergency declaration has
16 been issued by the President of the United States.

17 (c) The provisions of this section enacted during 2014 regular
18 session of the Legislature shall be in effect retroactive to
19 January 1, 2014.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that certain state employees may be granted a leave of absence with pay while providing assistance as an essential member of an emergency aid provider during a declared state of emergency.

This section is new; therefore, it has been entirely underscored.
