11	1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact \$17-16A-4,
12	\$17-16A-10 and $$17-16A-18$ of said code, all relating to
13	providing for the transfer of ownership, operation and
14	maintenance of certain assets of the West Virginia Parkways
15	Authority to the Division of Highways; requiring all debt
16	obligations of the Parkways Authority to be satisfied by
17	February 1, 2020; eliminating tolls on the West Virginia
18	Turnpike after debt obligations are satisfied; directing the
19	Governor to issue a proclamation that all obligations are
20	satisfied and transfer of assets; providing that certain
21	materials, equipment, assets and employees of the parkways
22	authority be transferred to the Division of Highways;
23	providing for employees of the Parkways Authority whose
24	positions are eliminated as result of the transfer: requiring

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certain moneys be used for operation and maintenance of, and

- for the provision of police services by the West Virginia
- 2 State Police on the West Virginia Turnpike; providing that all
- 3 obligations and responsibilities of the parkways authority for
- 4 the West Virginia Turnpike cease on January 1, 2035;
- 5 prohibiting new bonds from being issued; providing an
- 6 exception; requiring the Division of Highways to accept
- ownership of the West Virginia Turnpike when the bonds secured
- 8 by toll revenues have been paid; creating two funds; and
- 9 authorizing rule-making.
- 10 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
- 11 That \$15-2-12 of the code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended,
- 12 be amended and reenacted; and that \$17-16A-4, \$17-16A-10 and
- 13 \$17-16A-18 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as
- 14 follows:
- 15 CHAPTER 15. PUBLIC SAFETY.
- 16 ARTICLE 2. WEST VIRGINIA STATE POLICE.
- 17 §15-2-12. Mission of the State Police; powers of superintendent,
- officers and members; patrol of turnpike.
- 19 (a) The West Virginia State Police shall have the mission of
- 20 statewide enforcement of criminal and traffic laws with emphasis on
- 21 providing basic enforcement and citizen protection from criminal
- 22 depredation throughout the state and maintaining the safety of the
- 23 state's public streets, roads and highways.

- 1 (b) The superintendent and each of the officers and members of 2 the division are hereby empowered:
- 3 (1) To make arrests anywhere within the state of any persons
  4 charged with the violation of any law of this state, or of the
  5 United States, and when a witness to the perpetration of any
  6 offense or crime, or to the violation of any law of this state, or
  7 of the United States, to make arrests without warrant; to arrest
  8 and detain any persons suspected of the commission of any felony or
  9 misdemeanor whenever a complaint is made and a warrant is issued
  10 thereon for the arrest, and the person arrested shall be
  11 immediately brought before the proper tribunal for examination and
  12 trial in the county where the offense for which the arrest has been
  13 made was committed;
- 14 (2) To serve criminal process issued by any court or 15 magistrate anywhere within this state: *Provided*, That they may not 16 serve civil process; and
- (3) To cooperate with local authorities in detecting crime and in apprehending any person or persons engaged in or suspected of the commission of any crime, misdemeanor or offense against the law of this state, or of the United States, or of any ordinance of any municipality in this state; and to take affidavits in connection with any application to the Division of Highways, Division of Motor Vehicles and of West Virginia State Police for any license, permit or certificate that may be lawfully issued by these divisions of

1 state government.

- 2 (c) Members of the West Virginia State Police are hereby 3 designated as forest patrolmen and natural resources police 4 officers throughout the state to do and perform any duties and 5 exercise any powers of forest patrolmen and natural resources 6 police officers, and may apprehend and bring before any court or 7 magistrate having jurisdiction of these matters, anyone violating 8 any of the provisions of chapters twenty, sixty and sixty-one of 9 this code. The West Virginia State Police is at any time subject 10 to the call of the West Virginia Alcohol Beverage Control 11 Commissioner to aid in apprehending any person violating any of the 12 provisions of chapter sixty of this code. They shall serve and 13 execute warrants for the arrest of any person and warrants for the 14 search of any premises issued by any properly constituted 15 authority, and shall exercise all of the powers conferred by law 16 upon a sheriff. They may not serve any civil process or exercise 17 any of the powers of an officer in civil matters.
- (d) Any member of the West Virginia State Police knowing or having reason to believe that any person has violated the law may 20 make complaint in writing before any court or officer having 21 jurisdiction and procure a warrant for the offender, execute the 22 warrant and bring the person before the proper tribunal having 23 jurisdiction. The member shall make return on all warrants to the 24 tribunals and his or her official title shall be "Member of the

- 1 West Virginia State Police". Members of the West Virginia State
- 2 Police may execute any summons or process issued by any tribunal
- 3 having jurisdiction requiring the attendance of any person as a
- 4 witness before the tribunal and make return thereon as provided by
- 5 law. Any return by a member of the West Virginia State Police
- 6 showing the manner of executing the warrant or process has the same
- 7 force and effect as if made by a sheriff.
- 8 (e) Each member of the West Virginia State Police, when called
- 9 by the sheriff of any county, or when directed by the Governor by
- 10 proclamation, has full power and authority within the county, or
- 11 within the territory defined by the Governor, to direct and command
- 12 absolutely the assistance of any sheriff, deputy sheriff, chief of
- 13 police, policeman, natural resources police officer and peace
- 14 officer of the state, or of any county or municipality therein, or
- 15 of any able-bodied citizen of the United States, to assist and aid
- 16 in accomplishing the purposes expressed in this article. When
- 17 called, any officer or person is, during the time his or her
- 18 assistance is required, for all purposes a member of the West
- 19 Virginia State Police and subject to all the provisions of this
- 20 article.
- 21 (f)  $\underline{\text{(f)}}$  The superintendent may also assign members of the
- 22 division to perform police duties on any turnpike or toll road, or
- 23 any section of any turnpike or toll road, operated by the West
- 24 Virginia Parkways, Economic Development and Tourism Authority:

- 1 Provided, That the authority shall reimburse the West Virginia
- 2 State Police for salaries paid to the members and shall either pay
- 3 directly or reimburse the division for all other expenses of the
- 4 group of members in accordance with actual or estimated costs
- 5 determined by the superintendent.
- 6 (2) The superintendent may also assign members of the division
- 7 to perform police duties on the highway now known and designated as
- 8 the West Virginia Turnpike after it is transferred to the Division
- 9 of Highways pursuant to section four, article sixteen-a, chapter
- 10 seventeen of this code. The Division of Highways shall either
- 11 partially or fully reimburse the West Virginia State Police for the
- 12 cost of providing the police services in accordance with section
- 13 four, article sixteen-a, chapter seventeen of this code.
- 14 (g) The West Virginia State Police may develop proposals for
- 15 a comprehensive county or multicounty plan on the implementation of
- 16 an enhanced emergency service telephone system and may cause a
- 17 public meeting on the proposals, all as set forth in section six-a,
- 18 article six, chapter twenty-four of this code.
- 19 (h) By July 1, 1993, the superintendent shall establish a
- 20 network to implement reports of the disappearance of children by
- 21 local law-enforcement agencies to local school division
- 22 superintendents and the State Registrar of Vital Statistics. The
- 23 network shall be designed to establish cooperative arrangements
- 24 between local law-enforcement agencies and local school divisions

- 1 concerning reports of missing children and notices to
- 2 law-enforcement agencies of requests for copies of the cumulative
- 3 records and birth certificates of missing children. The network
- 4 shall also establish a mechanism for reporting the identities of
- 5 all missing children to the State Registrar of Vital Statistics.
- (i) The superintendent may at his or her discretion and upon
- 7 the written request of the West Virginia Alcohol Beverage Control
- 8 Commissioner assist the commissioner in the coordination and
- 9 enforcement of article sixteen, chapter eleven of this code and
- 10 chapter sixty of this code.
- 11 (j) Notwithstanding the provisions of article one-a, chapter
- 12 twenty of this code, the Superintendent of the West Virginia State
- 13 Police may sell any surplus real property to which the West
- 14 Virginia State Police or its predecessors retain title, and deposit
- 15 the net proceeds into a special revenue account to be utilized for
- 16 the purchase of additional real property and for repairs to or
- 17 construction of detachment offices or other facilities required by
- 18 the West Virginia State Police. There is hereby created a special
- 19 revolving fund in the State Treasury which shall be designated as
- 20 the "Surplus Real Property Proceeds Fund". The fund shall consist
- 21 of all money received from the sale of surplus real property owned
- 22 by the West Virginia State Police. Moneys deposited in the fund
- 23 shall only be available for expenditure upon appropriation by the
- 24 Legislature: Provided, That amounts collected which are found from

- 1 time to time to exceed the funds needed for the purposes set forth
  2 in this subsection may be transferred to other accounts or funds
  3 and redesignated for other purposes by appropriation of the
  4 Legislature.
- (k) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, the agency for surplus property is hereby empowered to transfer funds generated from the sale of vehicles, other equipment and commodities belonging to the West Virginia State Police to a special revenue account within the West Virginia State Police entitled the West Virginia State Police surplus transfer account. Moneys deposited in the fund shall only be available for expenditure upon appropriation by the Legislature: Provided, That amounts collected which are found from time to time to exceed the funds needed for the purposes set forth in this subsection may be transferred to other accounts or funds and redesignated for other purposes by appropriation of the Legislature. Any funds transferred to this account may be utilized by the superintendent to defray the cost of normal operating needs of the division.
- (1) If the State Police or any other law-enforcement agency in 20 this state receives a report that a person who has Alzheimer's 21 disease and related dementia is missing, the State Police or any 22 other law-enforcement agency shall immediately open an 23 investigation for the purpose of determining the whereabouts of 24 that missing person. Any policy of the State Police or any other

- 1 law-enforcement agency relating to a waiting period prior to
- 2 initiation of an investigation of a missing person does not apply
- 3 in the case of a person who has Alzheimer's disease or other
- 4 related dementia of the type referred to in this subsection.
- 5 (m) Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the
- 6 contrary, effective on and after July 1, 2007, the expenses and
- 7 salaries paid to the members of the West Virginia State Police for
- 8 the monitoring and enforcement duties defined in chapter
- 9 seventeen-c of this code may not be paid from the State Road Fund
- 10 or subject to reimbursement from the Division of Motor Vehicles but
- 11 is subject to appropriation by the Legislature.
- 12 CHAPTER 17. ROADS AND HIGHWAYS.
- 13 ARTICLE 16A. WEST VIRGINIA PARKWAYS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND
- 14 TOURISM AUTHORITY.
- 15 §17-16A-4. Transfer of powers, duties, functions, assets and
- 16 liabilities of turnpike commission to parkways
- authority.
- 18 (a) The duties, powers and functions of the West Virginia
- 19 turnpike commission are hereby transferred to the parkways
- 20 authority.
- 21 (b) All obligations, indebtedness and other liabilities of,
- 22 and all rights, assets and other property owned by or used in the
- 23 administration of, the West Virginia turnpike commission as of June

- 1 1, 1989, and all personnel of said turnpike commission as of said
- 2 date are hereby assumed by and transferred to the parkways
- 3 authority, which is hereby constituted the successor in interest to
- 4 said commission in all respects.
- 5 (c) All books, papers, maps, charts, plans, literature and
- 6 other records in the possession of the West Virginia turnpike
- 7 commission as of June 1, 1989, shall be delivered or turned over to
- 8 the parkways authority.
- 9 (d) The unexpended balance of appropriations or other funds
- 10 available for use of the West Virginia turnpike commission as of
- 11 June 1, 1989, is hereby transferred to the parkways authority for
- 12 the use of the parkways authority.
- 13 (e) On or before February 1, 2020, all debt obligations held
- 14 by the Parkways Authority shall be satisfied.
- 15 (f) Upon the full satisfaction of the bond debt of the
- 16 Parkways Authority and the completion and affirmative finding of a
- 17 highway condition assessment measuring compliance with quality
- 18 standards promulgated by the Division of Highways, the Governor
- 19 shall issue a proclamation finding that the bond debt of the
- 20 authority is fully satisfied and that the West Virginia Turnpike
- 21 has been maintained at or above Division of Highways standards and
- 22 directing the immediate conveyance of the West Virginia Turnpike,
- 23 buildings and land dedicated exclusively to its maintenance,
- 24 current and future use, except for the travel plaza buildings,

- 1 roads and parking facilities and lease properties, all records,
- 2 maps, charts, schedules and plans relating to the West Virginia
- 3 Turnpike and all maintenance material and equipment assets not
- 4 specifically dedicated to the maintenance of travel plazas to the
- 5 Division of Highways.
- 6 (g) Upon the issuance of the proclamation provided in
- 7 <u>subsection</u> (f) of this section:
- 8 (1) All obligations, indebtedness and other liabilities
- 9 pertaining exclusively to the West Virginia Turnpike and other
- 10 <u>assets expressly described under subsection (f) of this section</u>,
- 11 as of the date of the proclamation, are hereby assumed by and
- 12 transferred to the Division of Highways.
- 13 (2) The Parkways Authority shall first liquidate all publicly
- 14 traded securities in its holdings and convey all of its monetary
- 15 assets in excess of \$5 million to the Division of Highways to be
- 16 deposited in the "Turnpike Transition Fund."
- 17 (3) All the Parkways Authority employees dedicated to highway
- 18 maintenance and upkeep shall be transferred to employment by the
- 19 West Virginia Division of Highways.
- 20 (4) All employees of the Parkways Authority dedicated to toll
- 21 collection and toll collection operations shall remain employees of
- 22 the Parkways Authority until the cessation of tolling as provided
- 23 by section eighteen of this article.
- 24 (5) The Commissioner of the Division of Highways and Director

- 1 of the Division of Personnel shall jointly provide for the 2 evaluation of the skills, education, experience and qualifications 3 of all full-time, permanent employees of the Parkways Authority 4 dedicated to toll collection and toll collection operations prior 5 to the cessation of tolling, as provided by section eighteen of 6 this article. All full-time, permanent employees that may be laid off by the authority or Division of Highways at the time of or 8 within six months following the date of the cessation of tolling as 9 provided by section eighteen of this article shall be entitled to 10 be placed on an appropriate reemployment list maintained by the 11 Division of Personnel and allowed a preference on that list. The 12 Division of Personnel shall maintain those employees on the 13 reemployment list indefinitely, or until an employee has declined 14 three offers of employment at a paygrade substantially similar to 15 that of his or her position at the time of the Governor's 16 proclamation, or until he or she is reemployed by the executive 17 branch of state government, whichever occurs earlier. 18 Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the contrary, the 19 Parkways Authority shall, to the greatest extent practical, fill 20 vacant toll collection and toll collection operations positions 21 with temporary employees until the cessation of tolling on the West 22 Virginia Turnpike. 23 (h) There is hereby established a special fund in the State
  - 12

24 Treasury known as the "Parkways Authority Future Trust Fund." The

1 fund shall be administered by the Auditor and shall consist of 2 twenty-five percent of all toll revenue received by the West 3 Virginia Turnpike from the date of satisfaction of all bonded 4 indebtedness until the date of the Governor's proclamation as 5 provided in subsection (f) of this section, at which time the 6 Auditor shall disburse the entire balance to the Parkways Authority 7 to provide for future operations. Balances in the fund shall not 8 be expended and at the end of any fiscal year shall not expire, but 9 shall be retained for the Parkways Authority until the Governor's 10 proclamation is made. (i) There is hereby established a special fund in the State 11 Treasury known as the "Turnpike Transition Fund." The fund shall 13 be administered by the Commissioner of the Division of Highways and 14 shall consist of monetary assets of the Parkways Authority to be 15 received under subsection (g) of this section. The Parkways 16 Authority shall also deposit fifty percent of all toll revenue received for the West Virginia Turnpike from the date of 18 satisfaction of all bonded indebtedness until the date that tolling 19 ceases in accordance with section eighteen of this article. The 20 fund also consists of revenues provided in subsection (j) of this 21 section and any other funds appropriated by the Legislature to 22 assist the transition to the Division of Highways and the State 23 Road Fund, and the interest or other earnings on the moneys in the 24 fund. The Commissioner of the Division of Highways shall administer

- 1 the fund to: (1) Provide for the costs of all West Virginia 2 Turnpike operations and maintenance within the Division of Highways 3 and; (2) pay directly or reimburse the West Virginia State Police 4 for the costs of police services performed by members of the State 5 Police assigned to the highway now known as the West Virginia 6 Turnpike, including salaries and all other expenses incurred to 7 provide the police services by its members so assigned, not to 8 exceed \$2 million per fiscal year, from the time the bonded 9 indebtedness is paid in full until its transfer to the Division of 10 Highways, and thereafter until January 1,2035, pursuant to section 11 twelve, article two, chapter fifteen of this code. Balances in the 12 fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not expire, but shall be 13 expended for those purposes in ensuing fiscal years pursuant to 14 appropriation by the Legislature. Upon the depletion of funds in 15 the account, the subject roadways shall be supported by the State 16 Road Fund and any other funds available to the Division of Highways 17 for general maintenance and support. 18 (j) The Parkways Authority shall transfer all remaining assets 19 relating to the West Virginia Turnpike, including travel plazas and 20 lease properties, to the Division of Highways on January 1, 2035.
- 23 <u>(k) All obligations and responsibilities of the Parkways</u> 24 Authority for any part or portion of the West Virginia Turnpike

21 All excess revenue produced by these assets shall be deposited into

22 the Turnpike Transition Fund.

- 1 shall cease on January 1, 2035.
- 2 (1) The Commissioner of the Division of Highways and the
- 3 Director of the Division of Personnel shall jointly propose for
- 4 legislative approval rules pursuant to article three, chapter
- 5 twenty-nine-a of this code as may be necessary to provide for the
- 6 evaluation, transition, termination, and reemployment of Authority
- 7 and Division of Highways employees during the transition and to
- 8 otherwise carry out the purposes of this article as they relate to
- 9 personnel matters.
- 10 (m) The Commissioner of the Division of Highways shall propose
- 11 for legislative approval rules pursuant to article three, chapter
- 12 twenty-nine-a of this code as may be necessary to carry out the
- 13 purposes of this article as they relate to all matters not
- 14 concerning personnel.
- 15 §17-16A-10. Parkway revenue bonds generally.
- 16 (a) The Parkways Authority is authorized to provide by
- 17 resolution for the issuance of parkway revenue bonds of the state
- 18 for the purpose of paying all or any part of the cost of one or
- 19 more parkway projects: Provided, That this section shall not be
- 20 construed as authorizing the issuance of parkway revenue bonds for
- 21 the purpose of paying the cost of the West Virginia Turnpike, which
- 22 parkway revenue bonds may be issued only as authorized under
- 23 section eleven of this article: Provided, however, That no bonds
- 24 may be issued following the reenactment of this section during the

- 1 2014 Regular Legislative Session, except as provided in subsection
- 2 (i) of this section or except as existing bond debt may be reissued
- 3 to produce a financial savings or accelerate repayment: Provided
- 4 further, That in no such reissue may the amount of principal be
- 5 <u>increased or the final maturity be extended.</u> The principal of and
- 6 the interest on bonds shall be payable solely from the funds
- 7 provided for payment.
- 8 (b) The bonds of each issue shall be dated, shall bear
- 9 interest at a rate as may be determined by the Parkways Authority
- 10 in its sole discretion, shall mature at a time not exceeding forty
- 11 years from their date or of issue as may be determined by the
- 12 Parkways Authority, and may be made redeemable before maturity, at
- 13 the option of the Parkways Authority at a price and under the terms
- 14 and conditions as may be fixed by the Parkways Authority prior to
- 15 the issuance of the bonds.
- 16 (c) The Parkways Authority shall determine the form of the
- 17 bonds, including any interest coupons to be attached thereto, and
- 18 shall fix the denomination of the bonds and the place of payment of
- 19 principal and interest, which may be at any bank or trust company
- 20 within or without the state.
- 21 (d) The bonds shall be executed by manual or facsimile
- 22 signature by the chair of the Parkways Authority, and the official
- 23 seal of the Parkways Authority shall be affixed to or printed on
- 24 each bond, and attested, manually or by facsimile signature, by the

- 1 secretary and treasurer of the Parkways Authority. Any coupons
- 2 attached to any bond shall bear the manual or facsimile signature
- 3 of the chair of the Parkways Authority.
- 4 (e) In case any officer whose signature or a facsimile of
- 5 whose signature appears on any bonds or coupons shall cease to be
- 6 an officer before the delivery of the bonds, the signature or
- 7 facsimile shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all
- 8 purposes the same as if he or she had remained in office until
- 9 delivery. In case the seal of the Parkways Authority has been
- 10 changed after a facsimile has been imprinted on the bonds, then the
- 11 facsimile seal will continue to be sufficient for all purposes.
- 12 (f) All bonds issued under the provisions of this article
- 13 shall have all the qualities and incidents of negotiable
- 14 instruments under the negotiable instruments law of the state. The
- 15 bonds may be issued in coupon or in registered form, or both, as
- 16 the Parkways Authority may determine, and provision may be made for
- 17 the registration of any coupon bonds as to principal alone and also
- 18 as to both principal and interest, and for the recorders into
- 19 coupon bonds of any bonds registered as to both principal and
- 20 interest.
- 21 (g) The Parkways Authority may sell the bonds at a public or
- 22 private sale at a price it determines to be in the best interests
- 23 of the state.
- 24 (h) The proceeds of the bonds of each issue shall be used

1 solely for the payment of the cost of the parkway project or 2 parkway projects for which the bonds were issued, and shall be 3 disbursed in a manner consistent with the resolution authorizing 4 the issuance of the bonds or in the trust agreement securing the

5 bonds.

- 6 (i) If the proceeds of the bonds of any issue, by error of
  7 estimates or otherwise, shall be less than the cost, then
  8 additional bonds may in like manner be issued to provide the amount
  9 of the deficit. Unless otherwise provided in the resolution
  10 authorizing the issuance of the bonds or in the trust agreement
  11 securing the bonds, the additional bonds shall be deemed to be of
  12 the same issue and shall be entitled to payment from the same fund
  13 without preference or priority of the bonds first issued.
- (j) If the proceeds of the bonds of any issue exceed the cost of the parkway project or parkway projects for which the bonds were issued, then the surplus shall be deposited to the credit of the sinking fund for the bonds.
- (k) Prior to the preparation of definitive bonds, the Parkways

  19 Authority may, under like restrictions, issue interim receipts or

  20 temporary bonds, with or without coupons, exchangeable for

  21 definitive bonds when the bonds have been executed and are

  22 available for delivery. The Parkways Authority may also provide

  23 for the replacement of any bonds that become mutilated or are

  24 destroyed or lost.

1 (1) Bonds may be issued under the provisions of this article
2 without obtaining the consent of any department, division,
3 commission, board, bureau or agency of the state in accordance with
4 this article: *Provided*, That the Parkways Authority shall comply
5 with the provisions of section twenty-eight, article one, chapter
6 five of this code.

## 7 \$17-16A-18. Cessation of tolls.

- 8 (a) Except as provided herein in this section, when all bonds
  9 issued under the provisions of this article in connection with any
  10 parkway project or projects and the interest thereon shall on those
  11 bonds secured by West Virginia Turnpike toll revenues have been
  12 paid or a sufficient amount for the payment of all such those bonds
  13 and the interest thereon on them to the their maturity thereof
  14 shall have has been set aside in trust for the benefit of the
  15 bondholders, such project or projects, if then in good condition
  16 and repair to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of the state
  17 Division of Highways, shall be transferred to the state Division of
  18 Highways and shall thereafter be maintained by the state Division
  19 of Highways free of tolls.
- (b) No later than February 1, 1990 On July 1 of the calendar year beginning after the date the bond indebtedness is satisfied, as provided in section four of this article, the parkways authority Division of Highways shall discontinue remove and not relocate all toll collection facilities on the West Virginia Turnpike as the

- 1 same it existed on June 1, 1989, except for the three main toll
- 2 barriers and collection facilities and, provided solely that the
- 3 provisions of section eighteen-a are complied with, including the
- 4 toll collection facilities at the intersection of U.S. Route 19
- 5 (Corridor "L") and said the turnpike: Provided, That the bonds
- 6 secured by West Virginia Turnpike toll revenues have been paid as
- 7 scheduled.
- 8 (c) The highway now known and designated as the West Virginia
- 9 Turnpike shall continue to be maintained to the standards
- 10 promulgated by the West Virginia Division of Highways, and shall be
- 11 conveyed to the Division of Highways, as provided by section four
- 12 of this article. The Division of Highways shall accept ownership of
- 13 the highway at that time.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide for the transfer of ownership, operation and maintenance of certain assets of the West Virginia parkways authority, including the road now known as the West Virginia to the Division of Highways. The bill requires all debt obligations of the Parkways Authority to be satisfied by February 1, 2020. The bill eliminates tolls on the West Virginia Turnpike after debt obligations are satisfied. The bill directs the Governor to issue a proclamation that all obligations are satisfied and transfer of assets. The bill provides that certain materials, equipment, assets and employees of the parkways authority be transferred to the Division of Highways. The bill provides for employees of the Parkways Authority whose positions are eliminated as result of the transfer. The bill requires certain moneys be used for operation and maintenance of, and for the provision of police services by the West Virginia State Police on the West Virginia The bill provides that all obligations Turnpike. responsibilities of the parkways authority for the West Virginia Turnpike cease on January 1, 2035. The bill prohibits new bonds from being issued. The bill provides an exception. The bill

requires the Division of Highways to accept ownership of the West Virginia Turnpike when the bonds secured by toll revenues have been paid. The bill creates two funds and authorizes rule-making.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
