20	§61-11-27. Additional punishment for using minor in commission of

22	Notwithstanding any other provision of this code to the
23	contrary, when a person age twenty-one years or older is convicted

of an offense that provides for a punishment of confinement in a state correctional facility, and it is determined that the convicted person used a minor age fifteen years or younger to facilitate the commission of the offense, irrespective of whether the minor had actual knowledge of participating in the crime, the court shall add five years to the term of incarceration which the person is or would be otherwise sentenced. This additional time is mandatory.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to add five years to the term of incarceration to which a person would otherwise be sentenced for using a minor in the commission of a crime.

This section is new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
