1 Senate Bill No. 381 2 (By Senators Stollings, Plymale and Unger) 3 4 [Introduced January 20, 2014; referred to the Committee on Health 5 and Human Resources; and then to the Committee on Education.] 6 7 8 9 10 A BILL to amend and reenact §18-2-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to required course of instruction 11 12 in all public schools in West Virginia; and requiring instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. 14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: 15 That \$18-2-9 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, 16 be amended and reenacted to read as follows: 17 ARTICLE 2. STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION. 18 \$18-2-9. Required courses of instruction; violation and penalty. (a) In all public, private, parochial and denominational 20 schools located within this state, there shall be given prior to 21 the completion of the eighth grade at least one year of instruction 22 in the history of the State of West Virginia. The schools shall 23 require regular courses of instruction by the completion of the

1 twelfth grade in the history of the United States, in civics, in 2 the Constitution of the United States, and in the government of the 3 State of West Virginia for the purpose of teaching, fostering and 4 perpetuating the ideals, principles and spirit of political and 5 economic democracy in America and increasing the knowledge of the 6 organization and machinery of the government of the United States 7 and of the State of West Virginia. The state board shall, with the 8 advice of the state superintendent, prescribe the courses of study 9 covering these subjects for the public schools. It shall be the 10 duty of the officials or boards having authority over the 11 respective private, parochial and denominational schools 12 prescribe courses of study for the schools under their control and 13 supervision similar to those required for the public schools. 14 further such study, every high school student eligible by age for 15 voter registration shall be afforded the opportunity to register to 16 vote pursuant to section twenty-two, article two, chapter three of 17 this code.

(b) The state board shall cause to be taught in all of the public schools of this state the subject of health education, 20 including instruction in any of the grades six through twelve as 21 considered appropriate by the county board, on: (1) The 22 prevention, transmission and spread of acquired immune deficiency 23 syndrome and other sexually transmitted diseases; (2) substance

1 abuse, including the nature of alcoholic drinks and narcotics, 2 tobacco products, and other potentially harmful drugs, with special 3 instruction as to their effect upon the human system and upon 4 society in general; (3) the importance of healthy eating and 5 physical activity to maintaining healthy weight; and (4) education 6 concerning CPR and First Aid. The course curriculum requirements 7 and materials for the instruction shall be adopted by the state 8 board by rule in consultation with the Department of Health and 9 Human Resources. The state board shall prescribe a standardized 10 health education assessment to be administered within health 11 education classes to measure student health knowledge and program 12 effectiveness. 13 (c) (1) The state board shall require to be taught in all of 14 the public schools of this state as a requirement for graduation, 15 thirty minutes of instruction on the subject of cardiopulmonary 16 resuscitation, which must include a psycho-motor skills component. 17 (2) Instruction may be given by community members such as 18 emergency medical technicians, paramedics, police officers, 19 firefighters, and representatives of the American Heart Association 20 or the American Red Cross. These community members are encouraged 21 to provide necessary training and instructional resources such as 22 cardiopulmonary resuscitation kits and other material at no cost to 23 the schools.

- (d) An opportunity shall be afforded to the parent or guardian of a child subject to instruction in the prevention, transmission and spread of acquired immune deficiency syndrome and other sexually transmitted diseases to examine the course curriculum requirements and materials to be used in the instruction. The parent or guardian may exempt the child from participation in the instruction by giving notice to that effect in writing to the school principal.
- 9 (c) (e) Any person violating the provisions of this section
 10 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof,
 11 shall be fined not exceeding \$10 for each violation, and each week
 12 during which there is a violation shall constitute a separate
 13 offense. If the person so convicted occupy a position in
 14 connection with the public schools, that person shall automatically
 15 be removed from that position and shall be ineligible for
 16 reappointment to that or a similar position for the period of one
 17 year.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require CPR to be taught in the public school system as a condition of graduation.
