22	(a) The board of trustees is hereby commission is authorized

- 8 (4) Terms of an agreement to which the student must agree; and
- 9 (5) An appeal process.
- 10 (e) If considered necessary by the commission, the provisions
- 11 of this section may be extended by legislative rule to other
- 12 professional degrees which are not provided in the state, but which
- 13 are needed to enhance the state's economy.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide financial aid to students who are pursuing certain professional degrees which are not offered in the state to pursue those degrees in another state in return for a service commitment in West Virginia.
