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\$18-2B-6. Vocational certification for military training and experience.

3 (a) The Legislature finds that veterans returning from the 4 conflicts in Afghanistan and Iraq face unique challenges in coming 5 home. One of these challenges is finding good career opportunities 6 that allow veterans to provide for themselves and their loved ones. 7 Upon returning home, many veterans have already developed skills 8 suitable to many jobs that require vocational certification and 9 licensure. Rather than make these veterans take classes for skills 10 they have already developed, the Legislature finds it is in these 11 veterans' best interest to provide them with certification or 12 licensure so that they may obtain employment in their area of 13 skill.

(b) The Division of Vocational Education shall propose legislative rules pertaining to a policy and procedure for the acceptance of credit toward certification or licensure programs radministered by the division if an applicant provides satisfactory sevidence of successful completion of relevant military education, raining, or service as a member of the Armed Forces of the United States, the United States Reserves, the National Guard of any state, the Military Reserves of any state, or the Naval Militia of any state.

23 CHAPTER 18B. HIGHER EDUCATION.

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1 ARTICLE 20. COLLEGE CREDIT FOR MILITARY TRAINING.

2 §18B-20-1. Legislative findings.

The Legislature finds that veterans returning from the 3 4 conflicts in Afghanistan and Iraq face unique challenges in coming 5 home. One of these challenges is finding good career opportunities 6 that allow veterans to provide for themselves and their loved ones. 7 Upon returning home, many veterans have already acquired knowledge 8 similar to what they would gain in many college classrooms. In 9 fact, many veterans already have college experience. Between 2000 10 and 2009 statistics from the Veterans Administration showed that 11 over thirty percent of veterans had some college experience while 12 just over twenty-five percent of the general population did. 13 Unfortunately, fewer veterans end up graduating from college than 14 civilians for a variety of reasons. This Legislature finds that one 15 way to make up the gap between veterans and civilians graduating 16 from college is to give veterans college credit for classes where 17 their military service and training has already provided them with 18 the same knowledge they would gain in the classroom.

19 §18B-20-2. College credit for military training and experience.

20 The State Higher Education Policy Commission shall propose 21 legislative rules pertaining to a policy and procedure for the 22 acceptance of academic credit toward a degree or technical program 23 offered by public baccalaureate and graduate institutions if an 24 applicant provides satisfactory evidence of successful completion

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of relevant military education, training, or service as a member of
the Armed Forces of the United States, the United States Reserves,
the National Guard of any state, the Military Reserves of any
state, or the Naval Militia of any state.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide veterans with vocational certification or licensure or college credit for military training and experience that is close to what they would gain in the educational setting.

All sections in this bill are new; therefore, strike-throughs and underscoring have been omitted.
