22	§8-5-7. Certain officers; wards or election districts; residency

- 1 (a) Unless otherwise provided in the charter of a 2 municipality, there shall be elected a mayor, a recorder and 3 councilmen council members, who together shall form the governing 4 body of the municipality.
- (b) When a municipality has not been divided into wards or 6 election districts, there shall be at least five councilmen council 7 members, but when the municipality has been divided into wards or 8 election districts, the governing body may, by ordinance, determine 9 the number of councilmen council members to be elected from each 10 ward or election district. When it is deemed considered necessary, 11 the governing body may, by ordinance, increase or decrease the 12 number of wards or election districts and change the boundaries 13 thereof, such the wards or election districts to be made as nearly 14 equal as may be, in population, and when the municipality shall be 15 is divided into wards or election districts, or there shall be is 16 an increase or decrease in the number of wards or election 17 districts as aforesaid, the governing body may increase or decrease 18 the number of councilmen council members and, in the case of an 19 increase in the number of council members, direct an election to be 20 held at the next regular municipal election in such the additional 21 ward or wards or election district or districts so that each ward 22 or election district may have its full number of councilmen council 23 members residing therein and may have equal representation on the 24 governing body. When a municipality has been divided into wards or

- 2 provide for the election of councilmen council members at large in
- 3 addition to the councilmen council members to be elected from each
- 4 ward or election district. The provisions of this subsection shall
- 5 be are applicable to any municipality except to the extent

- 7 (c) Unless otherwise provided by charter provision or 8 ordinance, the mayor, recorder and councilmen council members must 9 be residents of the municipality and must be qualified voters 10 entitled to vote for members of its governing body. A city manager 11 in a manager form of government need only be a resident of the city 12 at the time of his or her appointment.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make clear that municipalities have the power to both increase and decrease the number of voting wards and/or council members serving its governing body.
