15	Elkins-Randolph County Landfill, the Webster County Landfill
16	and the Prichard Landfill once obtained by Wayne County.
17	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
18	That $\$22-16-11$ and $\$22-16-12$ of the Code of West Virginia,
19	1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:
20	ARTICLE 16. SOLID WASTE LANDFILL CLOSURE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.
21	§22-16-11. Application for closure assistance.
22	(a) The director shall provide an application and application
23	procedure for all permitees of solid waste landfills desiring to

1 receive closure assistance under this article. At a minimum the 2 procedure shall require that:

3 (1) The permittee of a landfill that does not have a liner 4 system must submit its application no later than September 15, 5 1992, except the permittee of a landfill that has been allowed to 6 accept solid waste pursuant to the provisions of section seventeen, 7 article fifteen of this chapter must submit its application no 8 later than the eleven months following the expiration of the 9 extension;

10 (2) The permittee of a landfill that has only a single liner 11 system must submit its application no later than eleven months 12 following the date of closure of the landfill. and

13 (3) The permittee of a landfill as provided for in subsection 14 (g), section twelve, article sixteen of this chapter must submit 15 its application for assistance on or before December 31, 2000: 16 *Provided*, That no landfill is eligible for closure assistance if 17 any portion of the landfill remains open or application is made for 18 reopening with the Division of Environmental Protection or the 19 Public Service Commission.

(b) The director shall, within a reasonable time after receipt 21 of a complete application, notify the applicant of the acceptance 22 or rejection of the application. If the application is rejected the 23 notice shall contain the reasons for the rejection.

24 §22-16-12. Solid Waste Facility Closure Cost Assistance Fund;

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closure extension; reporting requirements.

2 (a) The "Closure Cost Assistance Fund" is continued continues 3 as a special revenue account in the State Treasury. The fund shall 4 operate operates as a special fund whereby in which all deposits 5 and payments thereto do not expire to the General Revenue Fund, but 6 shall remain in such the account and be are available for 7 expenditure in the succeeding fiscal year. Separate subaccounts may 8 be established within the special account for the purpose of 9 identification of various revenue resources and payment of specific 10 obligations.

11 (b) Interest earned on any money in the fund shall be 12 deposited to the credit of the fund.

13 (c) The fund consists of the following:

(1) Moneys collected and deposited in the State Treasury which 15 are specifically designated by Acts of the Legislature for 16 inclusion in the fund, including moneys collected and deposited 17 into the fund pursuant to section four of this article;

18 (2) Contributions, grants and gifts from any source, both 19 public and private, which may be used by the secretary for any 20 project or projects;

(3) Amounts repaid by permitees pursuant to section eighteen,22 article fifteen of this chapter; and

(4) All interest earned on investments made by the state from24 moneys deposited in this fund.

(d) The Solid Waste Management Board, upon written approval of 1 2 the secretary, has the authority to pledge all or such part of the 3 revenues paid into the Closure Cost Assistance Fund as may be 4 needed to meet the requirements of any revenue bond issue or issues 5 of the Solid Waste Management Board authorized by this article, 6 including the payment of principal of, interest and redemption 7 premium, if any, on such the revenue bonds and the establishing and 8 maintaining of a reserve fund or funds for the payment of the 9 principal of, interest and redemption premium, if any, on such the 10 revenue bond issue or issues when where other moneys pledged may be 11 insufficient therefor. Any pledge of moneys in the Closure Cost 12 Assistance Fund for revenue bonds shall be is a prior and superior 13 charge on such the fund over the use of any of the moneys in such 14 the fund to pay for the cost of any project on a cash basis. 15 Expenditures from the fund, other than for the retirement of 16 revenue bonds, may only be made in accordance with this article.

(e) The amounts deposited in the fund may be expended only on the cost of projects as provided for in sections three and fifteen of this article, as provided in subsection (f) of this section and for payment of bonds and notes issued pursuant to section five of this article. No more than two percent of the annual deposits to such the fund may be used for administrative purposes.

23 (f) Notwithstanding any provision of this article, upon 24 request of the Solid Waste Management Board, and with the approval

1 of the projects by the Secretary of the Department of Environmental 2 Protection, the secretary may pledge and place into escrow accounts 3 up to an aggregate of \$2,000,000 of the fund to satisfy two years 4 debt service requirement that permitees of publicly-owned landfills 5 and transfer stations are required to meet in order to obtain 6 loans. Pledges shall be made on a project-by-project basis, may not 7 exceed \$500,000 for a project and shall be <u>are</u> made available after 8 loan commitments are received. The secretary may pledge funds for 9 a loan only when the following conditions are met:

10 (1) The proceeds of the loan are used only to perform 11 construction of a transfer station or a composite liner system that 12 is required to meet title forty-seven, series thirty-eight, solid 13 waste management rules;

14 (2) The permittee dedicates all yearly debt service revenue, 15 as determined by the Public Service Commission, to meet the 16 repayment schedule of the loan, before it uses available revenue 17 for any other purpose; and

18 (3) That any funds pledged may only be paid to the lender if 19 the permittee is in default on the loan.

(g) Any landfills which were ordered to close by December 31, 1994, and which have been granted a certificate of need pursuant to subsection (b), section one-c, article two, chapter twenty-four of this code or section one-I of said article are hereby granted a closure extension until January 1, 1996. No landfill which closed

1 on or before September 30, 1994, shall be eligible for such an 2 extension. Notwithstanding any provision of this code to the 3 contrary, the Elkins-Randolph County Landfill, located in Randolph 4 County, and the Webster County Landfill, located in Webster County, 5 are eligible for funds from the Solid Waste Facility Closure Cost 6 Assistance Fund necessary to complete their closure upon the filing 7 of appropriate application. The Prichard Landfill, located in Wayne 8 County, will also be eligible for funds necessary to complete its 9 closure from the Solid Waste Facility Closure Cost Assistance Fund 10 necessary to complete its closure upon it being obtained by the 11 Wayne County Commission. Upon the filing of an appropriate 12 application, the Department of Environmental Protection shall work 13 with applicants to ensure that applications meet the department's 14 requirements.

(h) The Department of Environmental Protection is required to file, by January 1 of each ensuing year, an annual report with the Joint Committee on Government and Finance providing details on the manner in which the landfill closure assistance funds were expended for the prior fiscal year.

(I) Notwithstanding any other contrary provision of this code,
the secretary shall place as a top priority to expend any and all
funds derived from the Solid Waste Facility Closure Cost Assistance
Fund necessary to facilitate the complete closure forthwith of the
now-defunct Gwinn or otherwise known as the Midwest Landfill,

1 located in Summers County.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require the Secretary of the Department of Environmental Protection to make money available in the Solid Waste Facility Closure Cost Assistance Fund to facilitate the complete closure of the Elkins-Randolph County Landfill, the Webster County Landfill and the Prichard Landfill after it is obtained by the Wayne County Commission.
