Senate Bill No. 366

(By Senators Kessler (Mr. President) and M. Hall, By Request of the Executive)

[Introduced January 16, 2014; referred to the Committee on Health and Human Resources; and then to the Committee on the Judiciary.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §5-16B-1 and §5-16B-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to moving the Children's Health Insurance Program from the Department of Administration to the Department of Health and Human Resources; and providing for the orderly transfer of functions, funds and accounts.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §5-16B-1 and §5-16B-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows: ARTICLE 16B. WEST VIRGINIA CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM.

§5-16B-1. Expansion of health care coverage to children; creation of program; legislative directives.

1 (a) It is the intent of the Legislature to expand access to 2 health services for eligible children and to pay for this 3 coverage by using private, state and federal funds to purchase those services or purchase insurance coverage for those 4 5 services. To achieve this intention, the West Virginia Children's Health Insurance Program is hereby created. The 6 program shall be administered by the Children's Health 7 8 Insurance Agency within the Department of Administration in accordance with the provisions of this article and the 9 applicable provisions of Title XXI of the Social Security Act 10 of 1997: Provided, That beginning on and after July 1, 2014, 11 12 the agencies, boards and programs, including all of the allied, 13 advisory, affiliated or related entities and funds, associated 14 with the Children's Health Insurance Program and Children's 15 Health Insurance Agency are incorporated in and 16 administered as a part of the Department of Health and Human Resources. Participation in the program may be made 17

available to families of eligible children, subject to eligibility 18 criteria and processes to be established, which shall not 19 20 create an entitlement to coverage in any person. Nothing in 21 this article may be construed to require any appropriation of 22 state general revenue funds for the payment of any benefit provided for in this article. In the event that this article 23 24 conflicts with the requirements of federal law, federal law 25 governs.

(b) In developing a children's health insurance program
that operates with the highest degree of simplicity and
governmental efficiency, the board shall avoid duplicating
functions available in existing agencies and may enter into
interagency agreements for the performance of specific tasks
or duties at a specific or maximum contract price.

32 (c) In developing benefit plans, the board may consider
33 any cost savings, administrative efficiency or other benefit to
34 be gained by considering existing contracts for services with
35 state health plans and negotiating modifications of those
36 contracts to meet the needs of the program.

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(d) Upon For the transfer of the functions of the 37 38 Children's Health Insurance Program and the Children's 39 Health Insurance Agency from the department of health and 40 human resources to the children's health insurance agency 41 within the Department of Administration to the Department 42 of Health and Human Resources, the Secretary of the 43 Department of health and human resources Administration and the Secretary of the Department of administration Health 44 45 and Human Resources, acting jointly, are empowered to 46 authorize and shall authorize such transfers of program and 47 agency funds including, but not limited to, the West Virginia Children's Health Fund created in section seven of this article 48 49 and associated investment accounts; and transfers of 50 Children's Health Insurance Program and Children's Health 51 Insurance Agency personnel and equipment, as are necessary, 52 to facilitate an orderly transfer of the functions of the 53 Children's Health Insurance Program and Children's Health 54 Insurance Agency. Authority to make transfers pursuant to 55 this subsection expires on the thirty-first day of December, 56 two thousand

(e) In order to enroll as many eligible children as possible 57 58 in the program created by this article and to expedite the 59 effective date of their health insurance coverage, the board 60 shall develop and implement a plan whereby applications for 61 enrollment may be taken at any primary care center or other health care provider, as determined by the director, and 62 transmitted electronically to the program's offices for 63 eligibility screening and other necessary processing. The 64 board may use any funds available to it in the development 65 66 and implementation of the plan, including grant funds or other private or public moneys. 67

§5-16B-2. Definitions.

As used in this article, unless the context clearly requires
 a different meaning:

3 (a) "Agency" means the Children's Health Insurance4 Agency; within the department of administration;

5 (b) "Board" means the Children's Health Insurance6 Program Board;

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7 (c) "Director" means the Director of the Children's8 Health Insurance Agency;

9 (d) "Essential community health service provider" means10 a health care provider that:

(1) Has historically served medically needy or medically
indigent patients and demonstrates a commitment to serve
low-income and medically indigent populations which
constitute a significant portion of its patient population or, in
the case of a sole community provider, serves medically
indigent patients within its medical capability; and

(2) Either waives service fees or charges fees based on a
sliding scale and does not restrict access or services because
of a client's financial limitations. Essential community health
service provider includes, but is not limited to, community
mental health centers, school health clinics, primary care
centers, pediatric health clinics or rural health clinics.

23 (e) "Program" means the West Virginia Children's Health24 Insurance Program.
