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Senate Bill No. 420

(By Senators Plymale, Kessler (Mr. President), Beach, Cann, Chafin, Cookman, Facemire, Edgell, Kirkendoll, Laird, McCabe, Miller, Palumbo, Prezioso, Snyder, Stollings, Tucker, Williams, Wells and Barnes)

[Originating in the Committee on Finance; reported February 12, 2014.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §18B-1D-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to adding the Bureau for Children and Families, WorkForce West Virginia and the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals to the existing entities that are to enter into a state data-sharing compact; adding child care and workforce data to the data that is to be included in the P-20W Longitudinal Data System; revising

legislative findings; adding definitions; creating a governing board of the P-20W Longitudinal Data System; setting forth membership of the board; setting forth authority and duties of the board; adding requirements for the Bureau for Children and Families, the State Board of Education, the Higher Education Policy Commission, the Council for Community and Technical College Education and WorkForce West Virginia; requiring the data warehouse to be housed within the West Virginia Network for Educational Telecomputing; and adding components to the state data-sharing compact.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18B-1D-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 1D. HIGHER EDUCATION ACCOUNTABILITY.

§18B-1D-10. State data sharing compact; legislative intent; findings; definitions.

- 1 (a) The intent of the Legislature in enacting this section
- 2 is to direct the commission, council, and State Board of
- 3 Education, the Bureau for Children and Families, WorkForce
- 4 West Virginia and the West Virginia Supreme Court of
- 5 Appeals to enter into a state compact, consistent with the
- 6 provisions of section six of this article, on or before July 1,
- 7 2009 July 1, 2014, to develop and maintain a P-20W
- 8 Longitudinal education Data System and to share educational
- 9 <u>child care, education and workforce</u> information.
- 10 (b) The Legislature makes the following findings:
- 11 (1) Sound data collection, reporting and analysis are
- 12 critical to building an education system capable of
- 13 ensuring that all West Virginia students are adequately
- 14 prepared for college and the global workforce.
- 15 Elementary schools, middle schools, secondary schools
- 16 and higher education institutions can improve instructional
- 17 and educational decisionmaking using data that are
- 18 collected and made available to them.

- (2) State education policymaking benefits from 19 20 partnerships between state education agencies, the Bureau for Children and Families, WorkForce West Virginia, the 21 22 West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals and entities with expertise in child care, education and workforce research. 23 24 It is beneficial for West Virginia to establish systems and processes that permit qualified researchers to assist with 25 state evaluation and research functions in a manner that is 26 consistent with privacy protection laws. 27
- 28 (3) West Virginia is committed to establishing and maintaining a longitudinal child care, student and 29 workforce unit record data system that educators and 30 31 policymakers can use to analyze and assess student progress beginning with early learning care and education 32 and continuing through 33 programs post-secondary education and into employment. The commission, 34 council, and State Board of Education and WorkForce 35 36 West Virginia have designed, built and deployed some of

- the fundamental components of a longitudinal data system
 and have engaged in extensive efforts to link and use
 available education data effectively. Now, it is necessary to
 integrate and manage the various <u>child care</u>, education <u>and</u>
 workforce data components in a cooperative manner to
 establish a data-driven, decision-making environment for this
 state's child care, education system and workforce systems.
- 44 (4) Students will achieve improved learning <u>and</u>
 45 <u>workforce</u> outcomes because of the <u>P-20W</u> Longitudinal
 46 Data System established through the state compact
 47 mandated by this section.
- 48 (5) Examples of research that can be conducted using
 49 child care, education and workforce data include:
- 50 (A) The impact of state and federal education 51 programs;
- 52 (B) The impact of child care programs;
- 53 <u>(C) The performance of educator preparation</u> 54 programs;

- 55 (D) Best practices for classroom instruction, education
- 56 programs and curriculum; and
- 57 (E) Gauging success in preparing students for the 21st
- 58 century workforce.
- 59 (6) State use and management of child care, education
- and workforce data shall be in accordance with all legal
- 61 requirements protecting student privacy and shall protect
- 62 personal information from intentional or accidental release
- 63 to unauthorized persons and from intentional or accidental
- use for unauthorized purposes.
- 65 (c) Definitions:
- 66 (1) "Longitudinal Data System" means a student unit
- 67 record data system that links student records beginning
- 68 with early learning programs and continuing through
- 69 post-secondary education, entry into the workforce and
- 70 beyond. The system may consist of separate student unit
- 71 record systems integrated through agreement and data
- 72 transfer mechanisms.

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(1) "Child care data" means data relating to 73 74 enrollment, attendance, demographics, the quality of child care received and any other nonconfidential data necessary 75 76 for furthering the state's child care, education and workforce systems and agreed to in the state compact 77 78 required by this section. (2) "Confidential information" means data relating to 79 a person's Social Security number or other identification 80 number issued by a state or federal agency except for a 81 unique identifier generated as part of the system 82 mandated by this section, email address, religious 83 affiliation, whether the person or their family are or were 84 85 recipients of financial assistance from a state or federal agency, medical, psychological or behavioral diagnoses, 86

criminal history, criminal history of parents, siblings or

any members of the person's household, IP address,

vehicle registration number, driver's license number,

biometric information, handwriting sample, credit card

- 91 <u>numbers, consumer credit history, credit score or genetic</u>
- 92 <u>information.</u>
- 93 (3) "Governing board" means the governing board of
- 94 the P20-W Longitudinal Data System.
- 95 (4) "P-20W Longitudinal Data System" means a
- 96 child care, student and workforce unit record data
- 97 system that links child care, student and workforce
- 98 records beginning with early care and education
- 99 programs and continuing through post-secondary
- education, entry into the workforce and beyond. The
- system may consist of separate unit record systems
- 102 integrated through agreement and data transfer
- mechanisms.
- 104 (5) "Personally identifiable information" means
- information that can be used on its own or with other
- information to identify, contact or locate a single person,
- or to identify an individual within the context of other
- information disclosed pursuant to this section.

- 109 (2) (6) "Privacy protection laws" means the federal
- Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.
- 111 S. C. 1232g) and any other state or federal laws relating to
- the confidentiality and protection of personally identifiable
- 113 information.
- 114 (3) (7) "Research organization" means a
- governmental entity, institution of higher education,
- public policy organization or other person or entity
- 117 conducting educational research that meets the following
- 118 conditions:
- (i) Qualified to perform educational child care,
- 120 <u>education and workforce</u> research and protect the privacy
- of student data;
- 122 (ii) Seeks to perform research for a noncommercial
- 123 purpose authorized by privacy protection laws; and
- 124 (iii) Agrees to perform the research pursuant to a
- written agreement meeting the requirements of privacy
- protection laws and best research practices.

(8) "Student data" means data relating to student 127 128 performance, and includes: State and national assessments; course taking and completion; grade point average; 129 130 remediation; retention; degree, diploma or credential attainment; enrollment; attendance; demographic data; and 131 132 any other nonconfidential data necessary for furthering the state's child care, education and workforce systems and 133 agreed to in the state compact required by this section. 134 (9) "Workforce data" means data relating to 135 employment status and includes: Wage information; 136 geographic location of employment; employer 137 information; and any other nonconfidential data necessary 138 for furthering the state's child care, education and 139 workforce systems and agreed to in the state compact 140 required by this section. 141 (d) There is a governing board of the P-20W 142 Longitudinal Data System which shall include the 143 144 following members:

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145	(1) A designee agreed to by the Chancellor for Higher
146	Education and the Chancellor for Community and
147	Technical College Education;
148	(2) The State Superintendent of Schools or designee;
149	(3) A representative of the Office of Data Management
150	and Analysis within the Department of Education to be
151	appointed by the State Superintendent of Schools;
152	(4) The Executive Director of WorkForce West
153	Virginia or designee;
154	(5) The Chief Justice of the West Virginia Supreme
155	Court of Appeals or designee;
156	(6) The Director of the West Virginia Network for
157	Educational Computing or designee; and
158	(7) The state administrator responsible for the federal
159	Child Care and Development Block Fund.
160	(e) The governing board shall elect a chair from among
161	its members.
162	(f) The governing board may:

(1) Propose rules for legislative approval in accordance 163 164 with article three-a, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to implement the provisions of this section; 165 166 (2) Create a working group responsible for the strategic direction of the P-20W Longitudinal Data 167 168 System; and (3) Create a user forum responsible for carrying out the 169 day-to-day tasks identified by the working group. 170 (g) The governing board shall: 171 (1) Develop an implementation plan to phase in the 172 establishment and operation of the P-20W Longitudinal 173 Data System in accordance with the requirements of this 174 section and the compact entered into pursuant to this 175 section by September 1, 2014; 176 (2) Provide general oversight and direction over the 177 P-20W Longitudinal Data System in accordance with this 178 section and the compact entered into pursuant to this 179 180 section;

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181	(3) Approve the annual budget for the P-20W
182	Longitudinal Data System;
183	(4) Create an inventory of the individual child care,
184	student and workforce data to be maintained in the system
185	and the data required to be reported by state and federal
186	education mandates;
187	(5) Propose rules for legislative approval in accordance
188	with article three-a, chapter twenty-nine-a of this code to
189	comply with privacy protection laws and the governing
190	board's detailed data security and safeguarding plan;
191	(6) Develop a detailed data security and safeguarding
192	plan that includes:
193	(i) Authorized access and authentication for authorized
194	access;
195	(ii) Privacy compliance standards;
196	(iii) Privacy and security audits;
197	(iv) Breach notification and procedures; and
198	(v) Data retention and disposition policies;

(7) Oversee routine and ongoing compliance with 199 privacy protection laws and the governing board's detailed 200 data security and safeguarding plan; 201 202 (8) Ensure that all data reside within the State of West Virginia including any data stored as backup; 203 204 (9) Ensure that any contracts entered into on or after the effective date of the amendments to this section during 205 the 2014 regular session of the Legislature that govern 206 databases and that are outsourced to private vendors 207 include express provisions that safeguard privacy and 208 security and include penalties for noncompliance; 209 (10) Designate a standard and compliance timeline for 210 211 electronic transcripts that includes the use of the State 212 Board of Education's unique identifier for all students who have attended public schools in West Virginia to ensure 213 the uniform and efficient transfer of student data between 214 local education agencies and institutions of higher 215 216 education;

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217	(11) Review research requirements and set policies for
218	the approval of data requests from state and local agencies,
219	the West Virginia Legislature and the public;
220	(12) Report the following to the Governor and the
221	Legislative Oversight Commission on Education
222	Accountability by November 15 of each year:
223	(A) An update on the implementation of the P-20W
224	Longitudinal Data System;
225	(B) A list of all data sharing arrangements entered into
226	with research organizations pursuant to this section, and a
227	summary of each data sharing arrangement;
228	(C) A list of currently warehoused data that are
229	determined to be no longer necessary;
230	(D) Any proposed or planned expansion of data
231	maintained in the database; and
232	(E) Any other recommendations made by the
233	governing board; and

(13) Prohibit the collection of confidential information 234 as defined in this section. 235 (h) The Bureau for Children and Families, the State 236 Board of Education, the Higher Education Policy 237 Commission, the Council for Community and Technical 238 College Education and WorkForce West Virginia shall: 239 (1) Make every effort to comply with the data 240 requirements and implementation schedule for the P-20W 241 Longitudinal Data System; and 242 (2) Transfer child care data, student data and 243 244 workforce data to the P-20W Longitudinal Data System in accordance with the data security and safeguarding plan 245 developed pursuant to this section. 246 (d) (i) The state data-sharing compact entered into by 247 the commission, council, and State Board of Education, 248 Bureau for Children and Families, WorkForce West 249 Virginia and West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals 250 shall contain the following: 251

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252	(1) A plan to establish and maintain a P-20W
253	Longitudinal Data System that links child care, early
254	learning, elementary, middle and secondary school student
255	unit records with higher education institution student unit
256	records and WorkForce West Virginia records;
257	(2) A plan to establish a data warehouse that:
258	(A) Integrates data from multiple child care, student
259	and workforce unit record systems; and
260	(B) Supports all of the uses and functions of the P-20W
261	Longitudinal Data System; and
262	(C) Is housed within the West Virginia Network for
263	Educational Telecomputing (WVNET);
264	(3) A list of areas for collaborative research and a
265	preliminary plan for conducting that research;
266	(4) A system for entering into data sharing
267	arrangements with each other and with research
268	organizations consistent with subsection (f) (k) of this
269	section; and

(5) A provision that allows another party to the 270 compact to review any draft report or study generated 271 using that party's data at least ten days before the report or 272 study is released publicly. During that ten-day period, each 273 party shall be given the opportunity to submit comments 274 regarding the accuracy, conclusions and recommendations 275 of the report or study; 276 (6) A P-20W data dictionary in which all data within 277 the P-20W Longitudinal Data System will be defined. The 278 P-20W data dictionary shall minimally include the data 279 element's definition, agency ownership, contact 280 information for information about the data and the reason 281 for collection of the data; and 282 (7) A determination of which data are available to each 283 party of the compact based on ensuring that data are only 284 shared when necessary to further the state's child care, 285 education and workforce systems. 286

- (e) (j) To facilitate implementation of the requirements
- of this section:
- 289 (1) The commission, council, and State Board of
 290 Education, <u>Bureau for Children and Families and</u>
 291 <u>WorkForce West Virginia</u> are authorized to disclose data
 292 to the <u>P-20W</u> Longitudinal Data System and to each other
 293 consistent with the purposes of this section;
 - (2) With the assistance of the state State Board of Education, the commission, council, state institutions of higher education and WorkForce West Virginia shall collect the State Board of Education's unique identifier for all students who have attended public schools in West Virginia to facilitate better matching of student unit record
- 301 (3) The commission, council, and State Board of
 302 Education, <u>Bureau for Children and Families and</u>
 303 <u>WorkForce West Virginia</u> shall collect, use, maintain,
 304 disclose and share data in accordance with personal

- privacy laws and shall develop security measures and procedures that protect personal information from intentional or accidental release to unauthorized persons and from intentional or accidental use for unauthorized purposes.
- 310 (f) (k) A data sharing arrangement entered into with a
 311 research organization pursuant to this section shall meet
 312 the following criteria:
- 313 (1) Permitted by and undertaken in accordance with 314 privacy protection laws;
- 315 (2) Receives prior approval from the State Superintendent of Schools or designee, the Chancellor for 316 317 Higher Education or designee, and the Chancellor for Community and Technical College Education or designee, 318 319 the state administrator responsible for the federal Child Care and Development Block Fund and the Executive Director of 320 WorkForce West Virginia or designee, as appropriate, if data 321 from that entity are being utilized used in the research; 322

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323	(3) Prohibits the personal identification of any person
324	by individuals other than authorized representatives of the
325	research organization who have legitimate interests in the
326	information;
327	(4) Ensures the destruction or return of the data when
328	no longer needed for the authorized purposes under the
329	data sharing arrangement; and
330	(5) Performed pursuant to a written agreement with the
331	research organization that does the following:
332	(A) Specifies the purpose, scope and duration of the
333	data sharing arrangement;
334	(B) Requires the recipient of the data to use personally
335	identifiable information from education records only to
336	meet the purpose or purposes of the data sharing
337	arrangement stated in the written agreement;
338	(C) Describes specific data access, use and security

restrictions that the recipient will undertake; and

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(D) Contains such other terms and provisions as the 340 commission, council, and State Board of Education, 341 Bureau for Children and Families and WorkForce West 342 Virginia, as appropriate, consider necessary or appropriate. 343 (g) (l) As a condition of participating in state-level 344 financial aid programs provided for in chapter eighteen-c 345 of this code, the commission may require nonpublic 346 institutions of higher education to provide data for the 347 P-20W Longitudinal Data System and data warehouse. 348
