A BILL to amend and reenact §18C-3-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to providing state aid for certain students pursuing certain degrees; requiring a service commitment to state for future students; setting forth alternatives to service; requiring legislative rule; and specifying rule provisions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18C-3-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 3. HEALTH PROFESSIONALS STUDENT LOAN PROGRAMS.

§18C-3-2. State aid for students of optometry, podiatry or veterinary medicine.

- 1 (a) The board of trustees is hereby commission is
- 2 authorized to enter into a contract contracts with an
- 3 educational institution or institutions outside the state that
- 4 offer training in optometry, podiatry or veterinary medicine
- 5 by the terms of which the board of trustees commission may
- 6 obligate itself to pay the institution, within the limits of any
- 7 appropriation made for the purpose, a stated amount per year
- 8 for each West Virginia student the institution will agree to
- 9 accept for training in optometry, podiatry or veterinary
- 10 medicine.
- 11 (b) Each year the board of trustees commission shall each
- 12 year send to any such appropriate institution a certified list of
- 13 all persons applying to the trustees commission for training
- 14 in optometry, <u>podiatry or veterinary medicine</u> who are bona
- 15 fide citizens and residents of this state prior to the filing of

- 16 their applications, and who have completed either within or
- 17 without the state the course of study required by the
- 18 institution as a prerequisite to the study of optometry,
- 19 podiatry or veterinary medicine.
- 20 (c) Upon graduation from an educational institution for
- 21 <u>study of optometry, podiatry or veterinary medicine, a person</u>
- 22 who receives state aid under this section is required to:
- 23 (1) Practice full time in this state in the field for which he
- 24 or she obtained financial aid, one year for every year the
- 25 student received aid under this section; or
- 26 (2) Reimburse the commission for the amount received
- 27 under this section.
- 28 (d) The commission shall propose a legislative rule in
- 29 <u>accordance with the provisions of article three-a, chapter</u>
- 30 twenty-nine-a of this code to implement the provisions of this
- 31 section. The rule shall address at least the following items:
- 32 (1) Eligibility and selection criteria;
- 33 (2) Reimbursement and repayment;
- 34 (3) Forgiveness options for death or disability;

 - 35 (4) Forgiveness or deferment options for continuing
 - 36 education in the field of study;
 - 37 (5) Terms of an agreement to which the student must
 - 38 agree; and
 - 39 (6) An appeal process.
 - 40 (e) The provisions of subsection (c) of this section apply
 - 41 <u>only to those students entering into an agreement to receive</u>
 - 42 <u>state aid to study optometry, podiatry or veterinary medicine</u>
 - 43 <u>on or after July 1, 2015.</u>
 - 44 (f) If considered necessary by the commission, the
 - 45 provisions of this section may be extended by legislative rule
 - 46 to other professional degrees which are not provided in the
 - 47 state, but which are needed to enhance the state's economy.
