### Senate Bill No. 426

(By Senator Plymale)

[Introduced January 23, 2014; referred to the Committee on Education.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §18B-1B-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; to amend and reenact §18B-2A-1 of said code; and to amend and reenact §18B-2B-4 of said code, all relating to higher education; appointment of members to the Higher Education Policy Commission; appointment of members to the institutional boards of Governors; appointment of members to the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §18B-1B-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; that §18B-2A-1 of said code

S. B. No. 426] be amended and reenacted; and that §18B-2B-4 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE HIGHER EDUCATION POLICY 1**B**. COMMISSION.

#### §18B-1B-2. **Composition of commission; terms** and qualifications of members; vacancies; eligibility for reappointment; oath of office; removal from office.

1 (a) The commission is comprised of ten members, all of The membership of the 2 whom are entitled to vote. 3 commission is as follows:

4 (1) The Secretary of Education and the Arts, ex officio;

5 (2) The State Superintendent of Schools, ex officio;

(3) The chair of the West Virginia Council for 6 7 Community and Technical College Education, ex officio; and (4) Seven at-large members who are citizens of the state, 8 appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and 9 consent of the Senate: Provided, That prior to appointment, 10 the Governor shall interview each candidate to assure that the 11

12 person selected understands and is committed to achieving the goals and objectives as set forth in the institutional 13 compacts and in section one-a, article one of this chapter. 14 15 The Governor shall invite the President of the Senate, the 16 Speaker of the House of Delegates, the chairs of the Senate 17 and House of Delegates committees on finance and education 18 and such other legislative leaders as the Governor may 19 determine to participate in interviewing potential candidates. (b) Each of the at-large members appointed by the 20 21 Governor shall represent the public interest and shall be 22 committed to the legislative intent and goals set forth in state 23 law and policy.

(c) The Governor may not appoint any person to be a
member of the commission who is an officer, employee or
member of the council or an advisory board of any state
college or university; an officer or member of any political
party executive committee; the holder of any other public
office or public employment under the government of this
state or any of its political subdivisions; an appointee or

employee of any governing board; or an immediate family 31 member of any employee under the jurisdiction of the 32 commission, the council or any governing board. 33 34 (d) Of the seven at-large members appointed by the 35 Governor: 36 (1) No more than four may belong to the same political 37 party; 38 (2) At least two shall be appointed from each congressional district; and 39 40 (3) Effective July 1, 2008, no more than one member may 41 serve from the same county. (e) The at-large members appointed by the Governor 42 43 serve overlapping terms of four years. 44 (f) The Governor shall appoint a member to fill any 45 vacancy among the seven at-large members, by and with the 46 advice and consent of the Senate. Any member appointed to 47 fill a vacancy serves for the unexpired term of the vacating 48 member. The Governor shall fill the vacancy within thirty 49 days of the occurrence of the vacancy.

50	(g) An at-large member appointed by the Governor may
51	not serve more than two consecutive terms. If the Governor
52	intends to reappoint an at-large member for a second term,
53	the Governor shall do so within thirty days of the expiration
54	of that member's term. If reappointment does not occur
55	within thirty days, the at-large member's term shall be
56	deemed expired, effective upon the date of the expiration of
57	the member's term.
58	(h) Upon the expiration of an at-large member's term, the
59	Governor shall appoint a successor within thirty days of the
60	end of the member's term. The at-large member whose term
61	has expired shall not serve more than sixty days after the
62	expiration of his or her term.
63	(i) Refore exercising any authority or performing any

(h) (i) Before exercising any authority or performing any
duties as a member of the commission, each member shall
qualify as such by taking and subscribing to the oath of office
prescribed by section five, article IV of the Constitution of
West Virginia and the certificate thereof shall be filed with
the Secretary of State.

(i) (j) A member of the commission appointed by the
Governor may not be removed from office by the Governor
except for official misconduct, incompetence, neglect of duty or
gross immorality and then only in the manner prescribed by law
for the removal of the state elective officers by the Governor.

### ARTICLE 2A. INSTITUTIONAL BOARDS OF GOVERNORS.

## §18B-2A-1. Findings; composition of boards; terms and qualifications of members; vacancies; eligibility for reappointment.

(a) *Findings.* – The Legislature finds that the State of
 West Virginia is served best when the membership of each
 governing board includes the following:

4 (1) The academic expertise and institutional experience
5 of faculty members and a student of the institution governed
6 by the board;

7 (2) The technical or professional expertise and
8 institutional experience of a classified employee of the
9 institution governed by the board;

10 (3) An awareness and understanding of the issues11 facing the institution governed by the board; and

12 (4) The diverse perspectives that arise from a
13 membership that is balanced in terms of gender and varied
14 in terms of race and ethnic heritage.

(b) Boards of Governors established. - A board of 15 governors is continued at each of the following institutions: 16 Bluefield State College, Blue Ridge Community and 17 Technical College, Bridgemont Community and Technical 18 College, Concord University, Eastern West Virginia 19 Community and Technical College, Fairmont State 20 University, Glenville State College, Kanawha Valley 21 22 Community and Technical College. Mountwest 23 Community and Technical College, Marshall University, New River Community and Technical College, Pierpont 24 Community and Technical College, Shepherd University, 25 26 Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College, West Liberty University, West Virginia Northern 27

28 Community and Technical College, the West Virginia
29 School of Osteopathic Medicine, West Virginia State
30 University, West Virginia University and West Virginia
31 University at Parkersburg.

32 (c) Board membership. –

(1) An appointment to fill a vacancy on the board or
reappointment of a member who is eligible to serve an
additional term is made in accordance with the provisions of
this section.

37 (2) The Board of Governors for Marshall University
38 consists of sixteen persons. The Board of Governors for
39 West Virginia University consists of seventeen persons. The
40 boards of governors of the other state institutions of higher
41 education consist of twelve persons.

42 (3) Each board of governors includes the following43 members:

(A) A full-time member of the faculty with the rank of
instructor or above duly elected by the faculty of the
respective institution;

47	(B) A member of the student body in good academic
48	standing, enrolled for college credit work and duly elected by
49	the student body of the respective institution; and
50	(C) A member from the institutional classified employees
51	duly elected by the classified employees of the respective
52	institution;
53	(4) For the Board of Governors at Marshall University,
54	thirteen lay members appointed by the Governor, by and with
55	the advice and consent of the Senate, pursuant to this section;
56	(5) For the Board of Governors at West Virginia
57	University, twelve lay members appointed by the Governor,
58	by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, pursuant to
59	this section, and additionally:
60	(A) The Chairperson of the Board of Visitors of West
61	Virginia University Institute of Technology;
62	(B) A full-time faculty member representing the
63	extension service at the institution or a full-time faculty
64	member representing the health sciences, selected by the
65	faculty senate.

(6) For each board of governors of the other state
institutions of higher education, nine lay members appointed
by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the
Senate, pursuant to this section.

70 (A) Of the nine members appointed by the Governor, no 71 more than five may be of the same political party. Of the thirteen members appointed by the Governor to the 72 73 governing board of Marshall University, no more than eight 74 may be of the same political party. Of the twelve members 75 appointed by the Governor to the governing board of West 76 Virginia University, no more than seven may be of the same 77 political party.

(B) Of the nine members appointed by the Governor, at
least five shall be residents of the state. Of the thirteen
members appointed by the Governor to the governing board
of Marshall University, at least eight shall be residents of the
state. Of the twelve members appointed by the Governor to
the governing board of West Virginia University, at least
seven shall be residents of the state.

85	(7) In making lay appointments, the Governor shall
86	consider the institutional mission and membership
87	characteristics including the following:
88	(A) The need for individual skills, knowledge and
89	experience relevant to governing the institution;
90	(B) The need for awareness and understanding of
91	institutional problems and priorities, including those related
92	to research, teaching and outreach;
93	(C) The value of gender, racial and ethnic diversity; and
94	(D) The value of achieving balance in gender and
95	diversity in the racial and ethnic characteristics of the lay
96	membership of each board.
97	(d) Board member terms. –
98	(1) The student member serves for a term of one year.
99	Each term begins on July 1.
100	(2) The faculty member serves for a term of two years.
101	Each term begins on July 1. Faculty members are eligible to
102	succeed themselves for three additional terms, not to exceed
103	a total of eight consecutive years.

(3) The member representing classified employees serves
for a term of two years. Each term begins on July 1.
Members representing classified employees are eligible to
succeed themselves for three additional terms, not to exceed
a total of eight consecutive years.

109 (4) The appointed lay citizen members serve terms of 110 four years each and are eligible to succeed themselves for no 111 more than one additional term, except that citizen members who are appointed to fill unexpired terms are eligible to 112 113 succeed themselves for two full terms after completing an unexpired term. If the Governor intends to reappoint a lay 114 115 citizen member for a second term, the Governor shall do so 116 within thirty days of the expiration of that member's term. If 117 reappointment does not occur within thirty days, the lay 118 citizen member's term shall be deemed expired, effective upon the date of the expiration of the member's term. 119

(5) A vacancy in an unexpired term of a member shall
be filled for the unexpired term within thirty days of the
occurrence of the vacancy in the same manner as the

original appointment or election. Except in the case of a 123 124 vacancy, all elections are held and all appointments are 125 made no later than June 30 preceding the commencement 126 of the term. A member whose term has expired shall not 127 serve more than sixty days after the expiration of his or her 128 Each board of governors shall elect one of its term. appointed lay members to be chairperson in June of each 129 130 year. A member may not serve as chairperson for more 131 than four consecutive years.

(6) The appointed members of the boards of governors
serve staggered terms of up to four years except that four of
the initial appointments to the governing boards of
community and technical colleges that became independent
July 1, 2008, are for terms of two years and five of the initial
appointments are for terms of four years.

138 (e) Board member eligibility, expenses. –

(1) A person is ineligible for appointment to membership
on a board of governors of a state institution of higher
education under the following conditions:

(A) For a baccalaureate institution or university, a person 142 143 is ineligible for appointment who is an officer, employee or member of any other board of governors; an employee of any 144 institution of higher education; an officer or member of any 145 political party executive committee; the holder of any other 146 147 public office or public employment under the government of this state or any of its political subdivisions; an employee of 148 149 any affiliated research corporation created pursuant to article twelve of this chapter; an employee of any affiliated 150 foundation organized and operated in support of one or more 151 state institutions of higher education; or a member of the 152 council or commission. This subsection does not prevent the 153 representative from the faculty, classified employees, 154 students or the superintendent of a county board of education 155 156 from being members of the governing boards.

(B) For a community and technical college, a person is
ineligible for appointment who is an officer, employee or
member of any other board of governors; a member of a
board of visitors of any public institution of higher education;

an employee of any institution of higher education; an officer 161 162 or member of any political party executive committee; the 163 holder of any other public office, other than an elected 164 county office, or public employment, other than employment by the county board of education, under the government of 165 166 this state or any of its political subdivisions; an employee of 167 any affiliated research corporation created pursuant to article twelve of this chapter; an employee of any affiliated 168 foundation organized and operated in support of one or more 169 state institutions of higher education; or a member of the 170 council or commission. This subsection does not prevent the 171 172 representative from the faculty, classified employees or students from being members of the governing boards. 173

(2) Before exercising any authority or performing any
duties as a member of a governing board, each member shall
qualify as such by taking and subscribing to the oath of office
prescribed by section five, article IV of the Constitution of
West Virginia and the certificate thereof shall be filed with
the Secretary of State.

(3) A member of a governing board appointed by the
Governor may not be removed from office by the Governor
except for official misconduct, incompetence, neglect of duty
or gross immorality and then only in the manner prescribed
by law for the removal of the state elective officers by the
Governor.

(4) The members of the board of governors serve without
compensation, but are reimbursed for all reasonable and
necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of
official duties under this article upon presentation of an
itemized sworn statement of expenses.

(5) The president of the institution shall make available
resources of the institution for conducting the business of its
board of governors. All expenses incurred by the board of
governors and the institution under this section are paid from
funds allocated to the institution for that purpose.

# ARTICLE 2B. WEST VIRGINIA COUNCIL FOR COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE EDUCATION.

#### §18B-2B-4. Appointment, composition and terms of council.

(a) The council is comprised of thirteen members selected
 as follows:

3 (1) Eight members appointed by the Governor, with the4 advice and consent of the Senate:

5 (A) One member shall be appointed from each 6 community and technical college consortia district as 7 established in this section.

(B) Prior to appointment, the Governor shall interview 8 9 each candidate to assure that the person selected understands 10 and is committed to achieving the goals and objectives as set 11 forth in the institutional compacts and in section one-a, 12 article one of this chapter. The Governor shall invite the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 13 14 Delegates, the chairs of the Senate and House of Delegates committees on finance and education and such other 15 16 legislative leaders as the Governor may determine to 17 participate in interviewing potential candidates. Each member appointed to the council by the Governor shall 18

represent the public interest and shall be committed to the legislative intent and goals set forth in section one-a, article one of this chapter.
(2) The Chairperson of the West Virginia Workforce Investment Council;
(3) The Executive Director of the West Virginia Development Office, or designee;
(4) The President of the West Virginia AFL-CIO, or a designee;

(5) The Chair of the Higher Education Policy
Commission who serves as an ex officio, nonvoting member
of the council; and


31 (6) The Assistant Superintendent for Technical and Adult
32 Education of the State Department of Education who serves
33 as an ex officio, nonvoting member of the council;

(b) Any appointed member shall be a citizen of the state,
shall represent the public interest and shall understand and be
committed to achieving the goals and objectives set forth in
section one-a, article one of this chapter, the essential

38 conditions set forth in article three-c of this chapter, and the 39 goals for secondary and post-secondary vocational-technical-40 occupational and adult basic education in the state. Any 41 appointed member shall represent the interests of the 42 business, labor and employer communities and demonstrate 43 knowledge of the education needs of the various regions, 44 attainment levels and age groups within the state.

45 (c) The Governor may not appoint any person to be a member of the council who is an officer, employee or 46 member of an advisory board of any state college or 47 university, the holder of any other public office or public 48 49 employment under the government of this state or any of its political subdivisions, an appointee or employee of any 50 51 governing board or an immediate family member of any employee under the jurisdiction of the commission or any 52 53 governing board. An individual may not serve on the council 54 who is engaged in providing, or employed by a person or 55 company whose primary function is to provide, workforce 56 development services and activities.

57	(d) Members of the council serve for staggered terms of
58	four years. Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision
59	(1), subsection (a) of this section, on the effective date of this
60	section any current member of the council maintains his or
61	her appointment to the council and continues to serve for the
62	remainder of the term for which originally appointed. Any
63	additional appointment required by the provisions of said
64	subdivision shall represent a consortia district not otherwise
65	represented on the council.

78	(g) The Governor shall appoint a member to fill any
79	vacancy among the eight appointed members, by and with the
80	advice and consent of the Senate. Any member appointed to
81	fill a vacancy serves for the unexpired term of the vacating
82	member. The Governor shall fill the vacancy within thirty
83	days of the occurrence of the vacancy.

(NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to alleviate any lapse in filling vacancies and to ensure that members are not forced to serve beyond their appointment time.
