# Senate Bill No. 523

(By Senators Green, D. Hall, Facemire, Laird, McCabe, Miller, Prezioso, Wells, Plymale, Carmichael, Jenkins, Yost and Stollings)

> [Originating in the Committee on Finance; reported February 20, 2014.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §9A-1-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; to amend and reenact §16-1B-1 of said code; and to amend and reenact §19-1-4 of said code, all relating to authorizing the Secretary of the Department of Veterans' Assistance and the Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture to enter into an agreement to transfer certain property for construction of a veterans skilled nursing facility; and making legislative findings.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §9A-1-10 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; that §16-1B-1 of said code be amended and reenacted; and that §19-1-4 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

# CHAPTER 9A. VETERANS' ASSISTANCE. ARTICLE 1. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS' ASSISTANCE. §9A-1-10. Powers and duties of secretary.

- The director secretary is the executive and administrative
   head of the division department and has the power and duty,
   subject to the provisions of section four of this article, to:

   (a) Supervise and put into effect the purposes and
   provisions of this article and the rules for the government of
   the division department;

   (b) Prescribe methods pertaining to investigations and

  9 all veterans, their widows, dependents and orphans;

10 (c) Prescribe uniform methods of keeping all records and

13 (d) Sign and execute, in the name of the state by West 14 Virginia Division Department of Veterans' Affairs Assistance, and by and with the consent of the Veterans' 15 Council, any contract or agreement with the federal 16 government or its agencies, other states, subdivisions of this 17 18 state, corporations, associations, partnerships or individuals; 19 (e) Supervise the fiscal affairs and responsibilities of the 20 division department;

(f) Organize the division department to comply with the
requirements of this article and with the standards required
by any federal act or any federal agency;

(g) Establish any regional or area offices throughout the
state that are necessary to promote efficiency and economy
in administration;

(h) Make reports that comply with the requirements of
any federal act or federal agency and the provisions of this
article;

(i) Cooperate with the federal and state governments for
the more effective attainment of the purposes of this article;
(j) Keep a complete and accurate record of all
proceedings; record and file all contracts and agreements and
assume responsibility for the custody and preservation of all
papers and documents pertaining to his or her office and the
division department;

37 (k) Prepare for the Veterans' Council the annual reports

40 (1) Exercise any other powers necessary and proper to
41 standardize the work; to expedite the service and business; to
42 assure fair consideration of the rights and interests and claims
43 of veterans, their widows, dependents and orphans; to

48 (m) Invoke any legal, equitable or special remedies for
49 the enforcement of his or her orders or the provisions of this
50 article;

(n) Appoint the veterans' affairs assistance officers and
heads of divisions of the division department, and of regional
or area offices, and employ assistants and employees,
including case managers and counselors, that are necessary
for the efficient operation of the division department;

(o) Provide resources and assistance in the development
of an internet website which is to be used to inform veterans
of programs and services available to them through the
division department and the state and federal governments;

(p) Delegate to all or any of his or her appointees,
assistants or employees all powers and duties vested in the
director secretary, except the power to sign and execute
contracts and agreements, but the director secretary shall be

(q) Provide volunteers who will drive or transport
veterans to veterans' hospitals from the veteran's home or
local veterans' affairs offices and who shall be paid an
expense per diem of seventy-five dollars; <u>and</u>

  - CHAPTER 16. PUBLIC HEALTH.

# ARTICLE 1B. SKILLED NURSING FACILITIES FOR VETERANS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES.

§16-1B-1. Legislative findings.

1	The Legislature finds that the health and welfare of the
2	veterans of the armed forces who are citizens of our state will
3	be best served by the establishment of one or more skilled
4	nursing facilities exclusively for these veterans.
5	Furthermore, the Legislature finds that nearly two hundred
6	thousand veterans in this state have distinguished themselves
7	with the highest level of participation per capita of any state
8	in the wars fought by this nation. Further, an aging veterans'
9	population which suffers from wartime disabilities and
10	illnesses are, or will be, in need of skilled nursing care.
11	The Legislature further finds that construction of an

The Legislature further finds that construction of an 11 12 additional 120-bed veterans skilled nursing facility in southern West Virginia is needed, to be located on 13 Department of Agriculture property in Beckley, West 14 Virginia, adjacent to the Jackie Withrow Hospital which was 15 formerly known as Pinecrest Hospital. The West Virginia 16 veterans skilled nursing facility located in Clarksburg is 17 currently at its maximum capacity and has a large waiting list 18

# 19 for admission. With a veteran population that has now 20 reached over two hundred twenty thousand, there is an 21 overwhelming need for additional nursing home beds in other 22 areas of our state to accommodate our veterans as they 23 become unable to take care of themselves.

# CHAPTER 19. AGRICULTURE.

# **ARTICLE 1. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.**

- §19-1-4. Duties of commissioner.
  - The Commissioner of Agriculture shall perform the
     following duties:

3 (a) Devise means of advancing the agricultural interests 4 of the state and, in the performance of such duty, he or she 5 shall have authority to call upon any state department, or 6 officer of the state or county, to cooperate in promoting the 7 agricultural interests of the state. It shall be the duty of any 8 such department, or officer, upon request of the 9 commissioner to render the assistance desired;

10 (b) Promote and encourage the organization of such11 societies and associations as have for their object the

(c) Conduct cooperative work with the United States
Department of Agriculture in inspecting and determining the
grade and condition of farm produce at collecting centers,
receiving centers and shipping points;

(d) Induce the investment of capital in, and immigration
into, this state by the dissemination of information relative to
the soil, climate, health, natural resources, market
opportunities and advantages of the state;

(e) Investigate and report upon the kinds, conditions andextent of the mineral products of the state and their value;

(f) Take charge of the museum of the Department of
Agriculture, collect, preserve and exhibit therein specimens
of agricultural, horticultural and kindred products, products
of the forests, minerals, flora and fauna of the state;

(g) Publish and distribute, from time to time, such reports
and bulletins concerning agriculture, horticulture and kindred

32 conditions may demand, publish a handbook giving the
33 resources of the several counties of the state, the varieties of
34 soil and products, both mineral and vegetable, and the
35 adaptability of the different sections of the state to the
36 different branches of agriculture, horticulture and kindred
