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10	A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
11	designated §30-1-21, relating to health care professionals providing services in federal
12	veterans' affairs facilities in this state; authorizing those health care professionals to provide
13	services to patients or residents of state-run veterans' facilities without obtaining an
14	authorization to practice from the appropriate licensing agency of this state.
15	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
16	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted by adding
17	thereto a new section, designated §30-1-21, to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL STATE BOARDS OF
19	EXAMINATION OR REGISTRATION REFERRED TO IN CHAPTER.
20	§30-1-21. Exemption from professional licensure for veterans' providers.
21	(a) For the purposes of this section, "health care professional" means any individual
22	appointed by the federal government to provide services in a United States Veterans Affairs facility
23	within this state, pursuant to 38 U.S.C. § 7401, regardless of the jurisdiction in which that individual

1 holds a professional license in good standing.

2	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a health care professional providing
3	services within this state on behalf of a United States Veterans Affairs health care facility is exempt
4	from obtaining a license or authorization to practice from the appropriate professional licensing
5	board of this state while providing services to a patient of a state-run veterans' health care facility
6	or a resident of a state-run veterans' nursing home.
7	(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, any health care professional providing
8	services within this state on behalf of a United States Veterans Affairs health care facility is
9	authorized to provide services and prescribe pharmaceutical drugs to a patient of a state-run veterans'
10	health care facility or a resident of a state-run veterans' nursing home within the same limits as his
11	or her authorization to practice in a United States Veterans Affairs health care facility within this
12	state.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize health care professionals providing services in federal veterans' affairs facilities in this state to provide services to patients or residents of state-run veterans' facilities without obtaining an authorization to practice from the appropriate licensing agency of this state.

This section is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
