13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
14	That §5-10-52 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted
15	to read as follows:
16	ARTICLE 10. WEST VIRGINIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT ACT.
17	§5-10-52. Specific provisions relating to certain members of the Legislature and certain
18	service by members of the Legislature.
19	(a) The provisions of this article specifying that a legislator may be a member of the
20	retirement system and at the same time also a member of another state or political subdivision
21	retirement program and may receive credit in the retirement system from two or more public
22	employments simultaneously and authorizing automatic increases in the annuities of retired
23	legislators based upon increases in compensation paid to members of the Legislature shall is not be

- 1 applicable to any member of the Legislature who first becomes a member of the retirement system
- 2 as a member of the Legislature during the year 1971, or any year thereafter after that, nor shall such
- 3 are these provisions be applicable to the computation of service, credited service or benefits for any
- 4 period of service as a member of the Legislature for the year 1971, or any year thereafter after that.
- 5 (b) Any member of the Legislature, or former member of the Legislature, who claims benefits
- 6 under the retirement system based, in whole or in part, on service as a member of the Legislature,
- 7 shall have his or her benefits calculated by averaging the compensation received for all years of
- 8 accumulated service and not merely for some portion of the service.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to address issues relating to the computation of legislative pensions. It provides for the calculation of benefits by averaging compensation received for all years of accumulated service.
