Unlawful military organizations. 19 (a) It shall be is unlawful for any body of men whatever individuals other than the regularly 20 organized National Guard or the troops of the United States, to associate themselves together as a military company or organization in this state. *Provided*, That 22 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, the Governor may grant permission to 23 public or private schools of the state to organize themselves into companies of cadets, and may

- 4 (c) It is not a violation of this section for a group of individuals to associate as a military
- 5 company or organization for historical, artistic or fictional performances; or, for an individual or
- 6 group of individuals to drill, perform or parade at public ceremonies, including funerals.
- 7 (d) A person who violates subsection (a) of this section, or belongs to or parades with any
- 8 such unauthorized a body of men individuals with arms shall be punished with a fine of not
- 9 exceeding violating subsection (a) of this section, is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction,
- 10 shall be fined not more than \$100 or imprisoned for a term not exceeding confined in jail for not
- 11 more than six months.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide that historical reenactors are not violating the prohibition against unlawful military organizations.
