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10	A BILL to amend and reenact §5-1-20 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating to
11	requiring reports to the Governor from state agencies to be made available electronically via
12	the Internet.
13	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
14	That §5-1-20 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted
15	to read as follows:
16	ARTICLE 1. THE GOVERNOR.
17	§5-1-20. Reports to the Governor; form and contents; transmission to the Legislature; special
18	reports.
19	(a) The secretaries of the executive department and the officers of all public institutions of
20	the state shall make an annual report to the Governor as soon as possible after the close of each fiscal
21	year, notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary.
22	(b) All state officers, boards, commissions, departments and institutions required by law to

make reports to the Governor, the Legislature or any administrative board or state official shall cover
 fiscal year periods.

3 (c) Annual reports shall be submitted in typewritten form, any legible form produced by
4 mechanical means, on electronic media, to be filed in the same manner as a printed annual report,
5 or transmitted electronically via the Internet. Any annual report filed in an electronic format shall
6 be considered as having satisfied the filing requirements.

7 (d) The Governor shall by executive order prescribe the general contents of the reports to be8 submitted to him or her. The form and format of the reports shall be as prescribed in this code.

9 (e) The Governor shall transmit, and may do so electronically, copies of the report to the 10 Legislature and provide a copy of all such reports with the Division of Archives and History where 11 the reports shall be kept as permanent records. <u>All the final reports shall be made available for</u> 12 <u>electronic access via the Internet.</u>

(f) All annual reports to the Legislature shall be submitted and may do so electronically, to
the Legislative Librarian and may be submitted electronically.

(g) The Governor may at any time require information in writing, under oath, from any officer, board, department or commission of the executive department or the principal officer or manager of any state institution, upon any subject relating to the condition, management and expense of their respective offices or institutions.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require reports to the Governor from state agencies to be made available electronically via the Internet.
