19	A law-enforcement officer, as defined in subdivision (6), section one of this article, who is
20	retiring or has retired from law enforcement employment with a state agency, shall be issued at the
21	$\underline{officer's\ request,\ a\ photographic\ identification\ card\ that\ is\ in\ compliance\ with\ 18\ U.S.\ Code\ \S\ 926C}$

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require state agencies to issue photographic identification cards to qualified retired law-enforcement officers that will enable the retired officers to carry a concealed weapon in compliance with the federal Law-Enforcement Officers Safety Act.
