

**H. B. 2594**

Committee on Education.]

A BILL to amend of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section, designated §18B-14-2, relating to transfer of course credit among higher education institutions; requiring that all higher education institutions in the state award credit to transfer students for similar courses completed at a different institution.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:*

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section, designated §18B-14-2, to read as follows:

**ARTICLE 14. MISCELLANEOUS.**

**§18B-14-2. Transfer of credit for courses completed.**

(a) This section may be known and shall be cited as the "Higher Education Opportunity Improvement Act".

(b) The Legislature finds that:

(1) The state has an increasing need for individuals with a post-secondary credential or degree;

1           (2) A growing number of hard-working individuals find community and technical colleges  
2 to be a more affordable option to start their college career; and

3           (3) The state can help students become successful by implementing a seamless education  
4 system and uniform transfer of credits with special attention to transfers between community and  
5 technical colleges and four-year institutions.

6           (c) Effective immediately, a public or private institution of higher education in this state shall  
7 award credit to a student transferring to the institution for a course successfully completed at a  
8 different institution of higher education, if the curriculum of that course includes seventy percent of  
9 the curriculum of a similar course at the receiving institution.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to require that all higher education institutions in the state award credit to transfer students for similar courses completed at a different institution.

This section is new; therefore, it has been completely underscored.
