B. 2780 2 3 (By Delegates Pasdon, Statler, Kurcaba, Duke, Sobonya, 4 Espinosa, Rohrbach, Fleischauer, Miller, Morgan and Frich) 5 6 [Introduced February 17, 2015; referred to the 7 Committee on Education then Finance.] 8 9 10 A BILL to amend and reenact §18B-4-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, and to 11 amend and reenact §30-29-8 of said code, all relating to enhancing the ability of campus 12 police officers at state institutions of higher education to perform their duties; authorizing 13 certain higher education campus police officers to receive compensation for attending 14 law-enforcement training academies; authorizing governing boards to apply for certain funds 15 available to law-enforcement agencies; authorizing governing boards to compensate campus 16 police officers for attending law-enforcement training academies; and providing for 17 agreements to reimburse employers for wages and expenses of employees trained but not 18 continuing employment. 19 Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia: 20 That §18B-4-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; and that §30-29-8 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows: 22 CHAPTER 18B. HIGHER EDUCATION. 23 ARTICLE 4. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION.

1 §18B-4-5. Campus police officers; appointment; qualifications; authority; compensation and

- 2 removal; law enforcement grants.
- 3 (a) The governing boards may appoint bona fide residents of this state to serve as campus 4 police officers upon any premises owned or leased by the State of West Virginia and under the 5 jurisdiction of the governing boards, subject to the conditions and restrictions established in this 6 section.
- 7 (1) A person who previously was qualified for employment as a law-enforcement officer for 8 a state agency or political subdivision of the state is considered certified for appointment as a campus 9 police officer at the state institutions of higher education under the jurisdiction of the governing 10 boards of Marshall University and West Virginia University.
- 11 (2) Before performing duties as a campus police officer in any county, a person shall qualify 12 as is required of county police officers by:
- 13 (A) Taking and filing an oath of office as required by article one, chapter six of this code; and
- 14 (B) Posting an official bond as required by article two, chapter six of this code.
- 15 (b) A campus police officer may carry a gun and any other dangerous weapon while on duty
 16 if the officer fulfills the certification requirement for law-enforcement officers under section five,
 17 article twenty-nine, chapter thirty of this code or meets the requirements of subsection (a) of this
 18 section.
- 19 (c) It is the duty of a campus police officer to preserve law and order:
- 20 (1) On the premises under the jurisdiction of the governing board; and
- 21 (2) On any street, road or thoroughfare, except controlled access and open country highways, 22 immediately adjacent to or passing through premises, to which the officer is assigned by the

- 2 (A) For the purpose of this subdivision, the campus police officer is a law-enforcement
- 3 officer pursuant to the provisions of section one, article twenty-nine, chapter thirty of this code.
- 4 (B) The officer has and may exercise all the powers and authority of a law-enforcement 5 officer as to offenses committed within the area assigned;
- 6 (C) The officer is subject to all the requirements and responsibilities of a law-enforcement 7 officer;
- 8 (D) Authority assigned pursuant to this subdivision does not supersede in any way the 9 authority or duty of other law-enforcement officers to preserve law and order on such premises.
- 10 (E) Campus police officers may assist a local law-enforcement agency on public highways.
- 11 The assistance may be provided to control traffic in and around premises owned by the state when:
- 12 (i) Traffic is generated as a result of athletic or other activities conducted or sponsored by a
- 13 state the institution; of higher education and

- (ii) The assistance has been requested by the local law-enforcement agency; and
- 15 (F) Campus police officers may assist a local law-enforcement agency in any location under 16 the agency's jurisdiction at the request of the agency.
- (d) The salary of a campus police officer is paid by the appropriate employing governing board. Each A state institution may furnish each campus police officer with a firearm and an official uniform to be worn while on duty. The institution shall furnish and require each officer while on duty to wear a shield with an appropriate inscription and to carry credentials certifying to the person's identity and authority as a campus police officer.
- 22 (e) A governing board may at its pleasure revoke the authority of any campus police officer

- 1 and such officers serve at the will and pleasure of the governing board. The president of the state
- 2 institution shall report the termination of employment of a campus police officer by filing a notice
- 3 to that effect in the office of the clerk of each county in which the campus police officer's oath of
- 4 office was filed.
- 5 (f) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this code to the contrary, and for purposes of
- 6 enhancing the ability of campus police officers to perform their duties, a governing board may apply
- 7 for and receive any public or private grant or other financial award that is available to other
- 8 law-enforcement agencies in the state.
- 9 CHAPTER 30. PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS.
- 10 ARTICLE 29. LAW-ENFORCEMENT TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION.
- 11 §30-29-8. Compensation for employees attending law-enforcement training academy;
- limitations; agreements to reimburse employers for wages and expenses of
- employees trained but not continuing employment.
- 14 (a) A West Virginia law-enforcement agency shall, and a governing board may, pay
- 15 compensation to employees, including wages, salaries, benefits, tuition and expenses, for the
- 6 employees' attendance at a law-enforcement training academy. The compensation paid to the
- 17 employees of a law-enforcement agency for such attendance at a law-enforcement training academy
- 18 as provided in this section shall may not include overtime compensation under the provisions of
- 19 section three, article five-c, chapter twenty-one of this code and shall be at the regular rate to which
- 20 the each employee would be entitled for a workweek of forty hours in regular employment with the
- 21 agency employer.
- 22 (b) In consideration for such compensation, the governing board, county commission or

- 1 municipal government may require of its employees by written agreement entered into with each of
- 2 them each employee to enter into a written agreement in advance of such attendance at a training
- 3 academy that, if an employee should voluntarily discontinue employment any time that obligates the
- 4 employee to repay the employer if he or she voluntarily discontinues employment within one year
- 5 immediately following completion of the training curriculum. he or she shall be obligated to pay to
- 6 such county commission, or municipal government The amount of repayment shall be a pro rata
- 7 portion of the sum of such total compensation which is equal to that part of such the portion of the
- 8 year which the employee has chosen chose not to remain in the employ of the county commission,
- 9 or municipal government employed.
- 10 (c) As used in this section, "governing board" has the meaning ascribed in section two, article
- 11 one, chapter eighteen-b of this code.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to authorize governing boards to apply for funds available to law-enforcement agencies for the benefit of campus police officers and to enter into agreements for compensation of employees for attending law-enforcement training academies.
