Exemptions from this article. 17 The following persons are exempt from licensure, unless specifically stated in writing by the 18 employer: 19 (1) A person employed as the director or administrative head of a social service agency or 20 division, or applicants for such employment; to be licensed; 21 (2) Licensed or qualified members of other professions, such as physicians, psychologists, 22 lawyers, counselors, clergy, or educators;

- 2 <u>section</u> engaged in social work-like activities, from doing social work consistent with their training

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to clarify the exemptions provided by statute for Social Work Licensing.
