10	A BILL to amend and reenact §30-30-16 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
11	to requirements for provisional social worker licenses.
12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:
13	That §30-30-16 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted
14	to read as follows:
15	ARTICLE 30. SOCIAL WORKERS.
16	§30-30-16. Provisional License to practice as a social worker.
17	(a) To be eligible for a provisional license to practice as a social worker, the applicant must:
18	(1) Submit an application to the board;
19	(2) Be at least eighteen years of age;
20	(3) Be of good moral character;
21	(4) Have a baccalaureate degree; in a related field, as provided by legislative rule;
22	(5)Have obtained regular supervised employment, or the reasonable promise of regular

- 1 supervised employment contingent upon receiving a provisional license, in a critical social work
- 2 workforce shortage position, area or setting requiring a social work license: *Provided*, That such
- 3 employment shall may not be as an independent practitioner, contracted employee, sole proprietor,
- 4 consultant, or other nonregular employment;
- 5 (6) Have satisfied the board that he or she merits the public trust by providing the board with
- 6 three letters of recommendation from persons not related to the applicant;
- 7 (7) Not be an alcohol or drug abuser, as these terms are defined in section eleven, article one-
- 8 a, chapter twenty-seven of this code: Provided, That an applicant in an active recovery process,
- 9 which may, in the discretion of the board, be evidenced by participation in an acknowledged
- 10 substance abuse treatment and/or recovery program may be considered;
- 11 (8) Not have been convicted of a felony in any jurisdiction within five years preceding the
- 12 date of application for license which conviction remains unreversed;
- 13 (9) Not have been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony in any jurisdiction if the offense for
- 14 which he or she was convicted related to the practice of social work, which conviction remains
- 15 unreversed; and
- 16 (10) Meet any other requirements established by the board.
- 17 (b) A provisionally licensed social worker may become a licensed social worker, by 18 completing the following:
- 19 (1) Be continuously employed for four years as a social worker and supervised. The board 20 shall promulgate by legislative rule the supervision requirements;
- 21 (2) Complete twelve credit hours of core social work study from a program accredited by the
- 22 council on social work education, as defined by legislative rule, within the four-year provisional

1 license period;

- 2 (3)(2) Complete continuing education as required by legislative rule; and
- $\frac{4}{3}$ Pass an examination approved by the board.
- 4 (c) A provisionally licensed social worker or a person previously licensed as a provisionally
- 5 licensed social worker may not reapply for licensure through this process for a period of one year
- 6 from the time the process set forth in this section is stopped, if the process is not completed.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to clarify the exemptions provided by statute for Social Work Licensing.
