16	That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
17	section, designated §55-7-27, to read as follows:
18	ARTICLE 7. ACTIONS FOR INJURIES.
19	§55-7-27. Liability of possessor of real property for harm to a trespasser.
20	(a) A possessor of real property, including an owner, lessee or other lawful occupant, owes
21	no duty of care to a trespasser except in those circumstances where a common-law right-of-action
22	existed as of the effective date of this section, including the duty to refrain from willfully or wantonly
23	causing the trespasser injury.

- 1 (b) A possessor of real property may use justifiable force to repel a criminal trespasser as 2 provided by section twenty-two of this article.
- 3 (c) This section does not increase the liability of any possessor of real property and does not
- 4 affect any immunities from or defenses to liability established by another section of this code or
- 5 available at common law to which a possessor of real property may be entitled.
- 6 (d) The Legislature intends to codify and preserve the common law in West Virginia on the 7 duties owed to trespassers by possessors of real property as of the effective date of this section.
