A BILL to amend and reenact §29-19-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating generally to annual statements of charitable organizations; requiring reports of financial audits and financial reviews of certain registered charitable organizations; and requiring additional information on annual statement.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §29-19-5 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 19. SOLICITATION OF CHARITABLE FUNDS ACT.

§29-19-5. Registration of charitable organizations; fee.

- 1 (a) Every charitable organization, except as provided in 2 section six of this article, which intends to solicit contributions. 3 donations or grants within this state or to have funds solicited or 4 received on its behalf shall, prior to any solicitation, file a 5 registration statement with the Secretary of State upon forms prescribed by him or her, which shall be good for one full year 6 7 and which shall be refiled in the next and each following year in 8 which the charitable organization is engaged in solicitation 9 activities. If an organization discontinues solicitation at any time 10 after its last registration filing, then it shall file a registration 11 statement reflecting its activities during its last fiscal year in 12 which solicitation in West Virginia took place. It is the duty of 13 The president, chairman or principal officer of the charitable 14 organization to shall file the statements required under this 15 article. The statements shall be sworn to and shall contain the 16 following information: 17 (1) The name of the organization and the purpose for which
- 17 (1) The name of the organization and the purpose for which 18 it was organized;

- 19 (2) The principal address of the organization and the address
- 20 of any offices in this state. If the organization does not maintain
- 21 an office, the name and address of the person having custody of
- 22 its financial records;
- 23 (3) The names and addresses of any chapters, branches or
- 24 affiliates in this state:
- 25 (4) The place where and the date when the organization was
- 26 legally established and the form of its organization;
- 27 (5) The names and addresses of the officers, directors,
- 28 trustees and the principal salaried executive staff officer;
- 29 (6) A copy of a balance sheet and a statement or report of
- 30 income and expenses for the organization's immediately
- 31 preceding fiscal year or a financial statement reporting
- 32 information showing the kind and amount of funds raised during
- 33 the preceding fiscal year, the costs and expenses incidental to the
- 34 fundraising and showing how the funds were disbursed or
- 35 allocated for the same fiscal year: *Provided*, That in addition to
- 36 the financial documents required by this subdivision:
- 37 (A) Charitable organizations raising more than \$200,000
- 38 \$500,000 per year in contributions, excluding grants from

- 39 governmental agencies or private foundations, shall submit a
- 40 report of an audit by an independent certified public accountant;
- 41 and
- 42 (B) Charitable organizations raising more than \$100,000
- 43 \$200,000 per year, but less than \$200,001 \$500,000 per year in
- 44 contributions, excluding grants from governmental agencies or
- 45 private foundations, shall submit a statement of financial review
- 46 by an independent certified public accountant. Organizations are
- 47 required to report the amount of money received in the state and
- 48 the amount spent in the state for charitable purposes;
- 49 (7) A copy of any determination of the organization's tax
- 50 exempt status under the provisions of 26 U. S. C. §501(c)(3) and
- 51 a copy of the last filed Internal Revenue Service Form 990 and
- 52 Schedule A for every charitable organization and any parent
- 53 organization;
- 54 (8) Whether the organization intends to solicit contributions,
- 55 donations or grants from the public directly or have other
- solicitation done on its behalf by others;
- 57 (9) Whether the organization is authorized by any other
- 58 governmental authority to solicit contributions, donations or

- 59 grants and whether it is or has ever been enjoined by any court
- 60 from soliciting contributions;
- 61 (10) The general purpose or purposes for which the
- 62 contributions to be solicited shall be used;
- 63 (11) The name or names under which it intends to solicit
- 64 contributions;
- 65 (12) The names of the individuals or officers of the
- organization who will have final responsibility for the custody
- 67 of the contributions:
- 68 (13) The names of the individuals or officers of the
- 69 organization responsible for the final distribution of the
- 70 contributions: and
- 71 (14) Copies of all contract documentation from professional
- 72 fund-raising counsels and professional solicitors as provided in
- 73 subsection (d), section seven of this article; and
- 74 (15) The amount of money received in the state and the
- amount spent in the state for charitable purposes.
- 76 (b) Each chapter, branch or affiliate, except an independent
- 77 member agency of a federated fund-raising organization, may
- 78 separately report the information required by this section or

- 79 report the information to its parent organization which shall then 80 furnish the information regarding its West Virginia affiliates, 81 chapters and branches in a consolidated form to the Secretary of 82. State. An independent member agency of a federated fund-raising organization, as defined in section two of this 83 84 article, shall comply with the provisions of this article 85 independently. Each organization shall file a separate 86 registration form for each name under which funds will be 87 solicited.
- 88 (c) The registration forms and any other documents 89 prescribed by the Secretary of State shall be signed by an 90 authorized officer or by an independent public accountant and by 91 the chief fiscal officer of the charitable organization and shall be 92 verified under oath.
- 93 (d) Every charitable organization receiving less than \$1 94 million during any year which submits an independent 95 registration to the Secretary of State shall pay an annual 96 registration fee of \$15; every charitable organization collecting 97 more than \$1 million during one year which submits an 98 independent registration to the Secretary of State shall pay an

99 annual registration fee of \$50; and a parent organization filing on 100 behalf of one or more chapters, branches or affiliates or a single 101 organization filing under different names shall pay a single 102 annual registration fee of \$50 for itself and the chapters, 103 branches or affiliates included in the registration statement. All 104 fees and moneys collected by the Secretary of State pursuant to 105 the provisions of this article shall be deposited by the Secretary 106 of State as follows: One-half shall be deposited in the State 107 General Revenue Fund and one-half shall be deposited in the 108 services fees and collections account established by section two, 109 article one, chapter fifty-nine of this code for the operation of the 110 office of the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall 111 dedicate sufficient resources from that fund or other funds to 112 provide the services required in this article.

(e) For good cause shown, the Secretary of State may extend the due date for the annual filing of a registration statement or report by a charitable organization or a professional fundraiser for a period not to exceed ninety days. During that period, the previously filed registration statement or report of the charitable organization which has been granted the extension remains in effect.

(f) In addition to the registration fee required by this section, 120 121 a charitable organization or professional fundraiser, or both, 122 which fails to file a registration statement or report by the 123 original or extended due date for filing as required by this 124 section shall, for each month or part of the month thereafter in 125 which the registration statement or report is not filed, pay an additional fee of \$25: Provided, That the total amount of the 126 127 additional fees for a registration statement or report required to 128 be filed in any one year may not exceed \$500. All fees and 129 moneys collected by the Secretary of State pursuant to the 130 provisions of this article shall be deposited by the Secretary of 131 State as follows: One-half shall be deposited in the State General 132 Revenue Fund and one-half shall be deposited in the service fees 133 and collections account established by section two, article one, 134 chapter fifty-nine of this code for the operation of the office of 135 the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall dedicate sufficient resources from that fund or other funds to provide the 136 137 services required in this article.
