H.B. 2201

A BILL to amend and reenact §24-2F-8 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to providing a definition for net metering, requiring the Public Service Commission to adopt certain net metering and interconnection rules and standards, and striking deadlines for rule-making by the Public Service Commission.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §24-2F-8 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2F.NET METERING OF CUSTOMER-GENERATORS.

§24-2F-8. Net metering and interconnection standards.

- 1 (a) "Net metering" means measuring the difference between
- 2 <u>electricity supplied by an electric utility and electricity generated</u>
- 3 from a facility owned or operated by an electric retail customer
- 4 when any portion of the electricity generated from the facility is
- 5 used to offset part or all of the electric retail customer's
- 6 requirements for electricity.
- 7 (b) The commission shall adopt a rule requiring that all
- 8 electric utilities provide a rebate or discount at fair value, to be
- 9 determined by the commission, to customer-generators for any
- 10 electricity generation that is delivered to the utility under a net
- 11 metering arrangement.
- 12 (b) (c) The commission shall also consider adopting, by rule,
- 13 a requirement that all sellers of electricity to retail customers in
- 14 the state, including rural electric cooperatives, municipally
- 15 owned electric facilities or utilities serving less than thirty
- 16 thousand residential electric customers in this state, offer net
- 17 metering rebates or discounts to customer-generators.

18 (c) (d) The commission shall institute a general investigation 19 for the purpose of adopting rules pertaining to net metering and 20 the interconnection of eligible electric generating facilities 21 intended to operate in parallel with an electric utility's system. 22 As part of its investigation, the commission shall take into 23 consideration rules of other states within the applicable region of 24 the regional transmission organization, as that term is defined in 25 18 C.F.R. §35.34, that manages a utility's transmission system 26 in any part of this state. Furthermore, the commission shall 27 consider increasing the allowed kilowatt capacity for commercial 28 customer-generators to an amount not to exceed five hundred 29 kilowatts and for industrial customer-generators to an amount 30 not to exceed two megawatts. The commission shall further 31 consider interconnection standards for combined heat and power. 32 (d) The commission shall promulgate these rules within 33 twelve months of the effective date of this article. 34 NOTE: The purpose of this bill is amend and add language 35 to West Virginia Code §24-2F-8 all relating to providing a 36 definition for net metering, requiring the Public Service 37 Commission to adopt certain net metering and interconnection 4
