A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §5-5-2a, relating to increasing pay to state employees over a three-year
period.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
section, designated §5-5-2a, to read as follows:

### ARTICLE 5. SALARY INCREASE FOR STATE EMPLOYEES.

#### §5-5-2a. Graduated salary increase for state employees beginning in 2016.

1 The Legislature finds that it is in the best interest of the state to pay employees a

2 <u>competitive salary</u>. Therefore, the following adjustments to state employee salaries shall be

3 <u>made:</u>

4 (1) As an additional supplement to other salary increases provided by this article and in

5 addition to any amounts prescribed in the applicable state minimum salary schedule, effective

6 July 1, 2016, each eligible state employee shall receive an additional salary increase of \$1,000.

7 (2) As an additional supplement to other salary increases provided by this article and in

8 addition to any amounts prescribed in the applicable state minimum salary schedule, effective

9 July 1, 2017, each eligible state employee shall receive an additional salary increase of \$2,000.

10 (3) As an additional supplement to other salary increases provided by this article and in

11 addition to any amounts prescribed in the applicable state minimum salary schedule, effective

12 July 1, 2018, each eligible state employee shall receive an additional salary increase of \$2,000.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide graduated increases to state employee salaries over the next three years so that after three years state employees receive a salary that is \$5,000 greater than their current salary.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
