A BILL to amend and reenact §5A-1-2 of the Code of west Virginia, 1931, as amended; to amend
and reenact §5F-2-1 of said code; to amend said code by adding thereto twelve new
sections, designated §5F-2-1a, §5F-2-1b, §5F-2-1c, §5F-2-1d, §5F-2-1e, §5F-2-1f, §5F2-1g, §5F-2-1h, §5F-2-1i, §5F-2-1j, §5F-2-1k and §5F-2-1l; to amend and reenact §21A1-4 of said code; and to amend and reenact §29-15-1 of said code, all relating to the
reorganization of certain code provisions that organize the executive branch of state

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §5A-1-2 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; that §5F-2-1 of said code be amended and reenacted; that said code be amended by adding thereto twelve new sections, designated §5F-2-1a, §5F-2-1b, §5F-2-1c, §5F-2-1d, §5F-2-1e, §5F-2-1f, §5F-2-1g, §5F-2-1h, §5F-2-1i, §5F-2-1j, §5F-2-1k and §5F-2-1l; that §21A-1-4 of said code be amended and reenacted; and that §29-15-1 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

CHAPTER 5A. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION.

ARTICLE 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION.

§5A-1-2. Department of Administration and Office of Secretary; secretary; divisions; directors.

(a) The Department of Administration and the Office of Secretary of Administration are
 continued in the executive branch of state government. The secretary is the Chief Executive
 Officer of the department and shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and
 consent of the Senate, for a term not exceeding the term of the Governor.

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(b) The Department of Administration may receive federal funds.

6 (c) The secretary serves at the will and pleasure of the Governor. The annual 7 compensation of the secretary shall be as specified in section two-a, article seven, chapter six of

9 (d) There shall be in the Department of Administration a Finance Division, a General 10 Services Division, an Information Services and Communications Division, Division of Personnel 11 and a Purchasing Division. Each division shall be headed by a director who may also head any 12 and all sections within that division and who shall be appointed by the secretary.

(e) There shall also be in the Department of Administration those agencies, boards,
 commissions and councils specified in section one one-a, article two, chapter five-f of this code.

(f) The secretary may establish a Fleet Management Office within the Department ofAdministration to:

(1) Manage all motor vehicles and aircraft owned or possessed by the State of West
Virginia or any of its departments, divisions, agencies, bureaus, boards, commissions, offices or
authorities: *Provided*, That, such vehicles and aircraft shall not be used for personal purposes,
other than for de minimis personal use;

(2) Administer the rules, including emergency rules, promulgated under the provisions of
 sections forty-eight and forty-nine, article three of this chapter; and

(3) Perform any duties relating to motor vehicles and aircraft owned or possessed by the
State of West Virginia assigned by the secretary, which duties may include those set out in
sections fifty through fifty-three, article three of this chapter.

155 (a) The Legislature finds that in 1989, this chapter was enacted to provide for the

156 reorganization of the executive branch of state government pursuant to the findings set forth under

157 section one, article one of this chapter. This section was enacted as part of that legislation to

158	effect the transfer of agencies and boards and related entities into the various departments
159	created within the executive branch of government. Since its initial enactment, the Legislature
160	has amended and reenacted this section on a number of occasions, in most instances to modify
161	the initial reorganization within the executive branch of government. The Legislature further finds
162	that the structure of this section by which it provides an extensive list of executive agencies in a
163	single section of the Code of West Virginia renders this section unnecessarily lengthy and
164	complicated. The designation of a separate statute for each of the agencies and entities as they
165	are organized in subsections (a) through (I) of this section as provided pursuant to the amendment
166	and reenactment of this section in 2016 would reduce the unnecessary length and complexity of
167	the statute without altering the Legislature's intent in providing for the organization of the executive
168	branch of state government pursuant to the original findings set forth under section one, article
169	one of this chapter and the Legislature's subsequent amendments and reenactments of various
170	sections of this chapter. The Legislature therefore finds and declares that the amendment and
171	reenactment of this section and the further amendment of the Code of West Virginia by adding
172	thereto twelve new sections, designated sections one-a, one-b, one-c, one-d, one-e, one-f, one-
173	g, one-h, one-i, one-j, one-k, and one-I of this article, are solely for the purpose of designating a
174	separate statute for each of the agencies and entities as they are organized in subsections (a)
175	through (I) of this section as provided pursuant to the amendment and reenactment of this section
176	in 2016 and for the purpose of providing corrective descriptions of an agency and corrective code
177	references and deleting references to agencies, boards or commissions that have been repealed.
178	The Legislature further finds and declares that except as otherwise provided in this section, the
179	amendment and reenactment of this section and the enactment of the new sections may not be
180	construed to have altered or modified the application of any other provision of this code to the
181	agencies and entities described in those sections, and that all other provisions of this code, to the
182	extent applicable to those sections, as well as the remaining subsections of this section, shall
183	apply in like manner to the agencies and entities described in those new sections.

(m) (b) Except for powers, authority and duties that have been delegated to the secretaries
 of the departments by the provisions of section two of this article, the position of administrator and
 the powers, authority and duties of each administrator and agency are not affected by the
 enactment of this chapter.

(n) (c) Except for powers, authority and duties that have been delegated to the secretaries of the departments by the provisions of section two of this article, the existence, powers, authority and duties of boards and the membership, terms and qualifications of members of the boards are not affected by the enactment of this chapter. All boards that are appellate bodies or are independent decision makers shall not have their appellate or independent decision-making status affected by the enactment of this chapter.

(o) (<u>d</u>) Any department previously transferred to and incorporated in a department by prior enactment of this section means a division of the appropriate department. Wherever reference is made to any department transferred to and incorporated in a department created in section two, article one of this chapter, the reference means a division of the appropriate department and any reference to a division of a department so transferred and incorporated means a section of the appropriate division of the department.

CHAPTER 21A. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION.

ARTICLE 1. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION.

§21A-1-4. Workforce West Virginia created; divisions within Workforce West Virginia created; certain terms defined; employer violator system.

- 1 (a) There is continued an agency designated Workforce West Virginia, composed of:

CHAPTER 29. MISCELLANEOUS BOARDS AND OFFICERS.

ARTICLE 15. STATE COMMISSION ON MENTAL RETARDATION.

§29-15-1. Creation and composition.

There is created the state Commission on Intellectual Disability hereinafter referred to as
 the commission.

Pursuant to subsection (g), section one <u>one-h</u>, article two, chapter five-f of this code, the
commission created by this section is now incorporated into and administered as part of the
Department of Health and Human Resources. All references to the commission in this article shall
be construed to mean the Department of Health and Human Resources.
