- 1 A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
- designated §9-5-24, relating to providing pregnant women priority to substance abuse
- 3 treatment.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new section designated, §9-5-24, to read as follows:

ARTICLE 5. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

§9-5-24. Requiring substance abuse treatment providers to give pregnant woman priority access to services.

- 1 Substance abuse treatment or recovery service providers that accept Medicaid shall give
- 2 pregnant women priority in accessing services and shall not refuse access to services solely due
- 3 to pregnancy as long as the provider's services are appropriate for pregnant women.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to give pregnant women priority to substance abuse treatment.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
