A BILL to amend the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, by adding thereto a new section,
designated §49-1-6; and to amend and reenact §59-1-10 of said code, all relating to
requiring each judicial circuit to have a court-appointed special advocate program and
each county to have a special advocate for children in abuse and neglect proceedings;
raising price of certified copy of birth certificate, death certificate or marriage license from
\$5 to \$11; and creating a fund within the State Treasury to pay for implementation and
sustenance of court-appointed special advocate programs.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended by adding thereto a new
 section, designated §49-1-6; and that §59-1-10 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to
 read as follows:

CHAPTER 49. CHILD WELFARE.

ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS AND DEFINITIONS.

§49-1-6. Requirement for each county to have a special advocate.

1 (a) Every judicial circuit shall have a court appointed special advocate (CASA) program,

2 as defined in section three of this article. Each county in each judicial circuit shall have at least

- 3 <u>one special advocate working exclusively in that county.</u>
- 4 (b) The CASA program is paid for with funds from the Court Appointed Special Advocate
- 5 (CASA) Fund created under subsection (c) of this section.
- 6 (c) There is created within the State Treasury a special revenue fund designated the Court
- 7 Appointed Special Advocate Fund, which consists of money collected under subdivision (4),
- 8 <u>subsection (d), section ten, article one, chapter fifty-nine of this code.</u>
- 9 (d) Upon written request to the State Treasurer, the Supreme Court of Appeals may
- 10 withdraw moneys from the Court Appointed Special Advocate Fund to fund CASA programs.

CHAPTER 59. FEES, ALLOWANCES AND COSTS; NEWSPAPERS;

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LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS.

ARTICLE 1. FEES AND ALLOWANCES.

§59-1-10. Fees to be charged by clerk of county commission.

For the purpose of this section, the word "page" is defined as being a paper or electronic
 writing of not more than legal size, 8 1/2" x 14".

3 (a) When a writing is admitted to record, for receiving proof of acknowledgment thereof,
4 <u>of the writing</u> entering an order in connection therewith with the writing, endorsing clerk's
5 certificate of recordation thereon on the writing and indexing in a proper index, the clerk of the
6 county commission shall charge and collect the following fees:

7 (1) Fifteen dollars for a deed of conveyance (with or without a plat), trust deed, fixture filing
8 or security agreement concerning real estate lease.

9 (2) Forty dollars for a trustee's report of sale for any property for which additional 10 information and filing requirements are required by section eight-a, article one, chapter thirty-eight 11 of this code. Twenty dollars of each recording fee received pursuant to this subdivision shall be 12 deposited into the county's General Revenue Fund and \$20 paid quarterly by the clerk of the 13 county commission to the West Virginia Housing Development Fund established in article 14 eighteen, chapter thirty-one of this code.

(3) Ten dollars for a financing, continuation, termination or other statement or writing
permitted to be filed under chapter forty-six of this code.

17 (4) Ten dollars for a plat or map (with no deed of conveyance).

18 (5) No charge for a service discharge record.

(6) Ten dollars for any document or writing other than those referenced in subdivisions
(1), (2), (3), (4) and (5) of this subsection.

21 (7) One dollar for each additional page for documents or writings containing more than22 five pages.

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For any of the documents admitted to record pursuant to this subsection, if the clerk of the county commission has the technology available to receive these documents in electronic form or other media, the clerk shall set a reasonable fee to record these writings not to exceed the cost for filing paper documents.

27 (8) Of the fees collected pursuant to subdivision (1), subsection (a) of this section, \$10 28 shall be deposited in the county general fund in accordance with section twenty-eight of this article 29 and \$1 shall be deposited in the county general fund and dedicated to the operation of the county 30 clerk's office. Four dollars of the fees collected pursuant to subdivision (1), subsection (a) of this 31 section and \$5 of the fees collected pursuant to subdivision (6), subsection (a) of this section shall 32 be paid by the county clerk into the State Treasury and deposited in equal amounts for deposit 33 into the Farmland Protection Fund created in article twelve, chapter eight-a of this code for the 34 benefit of the West Virginia Agricultural Land Protection Authority and into the Outdoor Heritage Conservation Fund created in article two-g, chapter five-b of this code. The funds deposited in 35 36 the State Treasury pursuant to this subdivision may only be used for costs, excluding personnel 37 costs, associated with purpose of land conservation, as defined in subsection (f), section seven, 38 article two-g, chapter five-b of this code.

(b) Five dollars for administering any oath other than oaths by officers and employees of
the state, political subdivisions of the state or a public or quasi-public entity of the state or a
political subdivision of the state, taken in his or her official capacity.

42 (c) Fifty-five dollars for issuance of marriage license and other duties pertaining to the 43 marriage license (including preparation of the application, administrating the oath, registering and 44 recording the license, mailing acknowledgment of minister's return to one of the licensees and 45 notification to a licensee after sixty days of the nonreceipt of the minister's return). This fee is 46 reduced to \$35 if the applicants present a premarital education course completion certificate 47 issued pursuant to section seven hundred one, article two, chapter forty-eight of this code, and 48 dated within one year of the application for a marriage license.

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(1) One dollar of the marriage license fee received pursuant to this subsection shall be
paid by the county clerk into the State Treasury as a state registration fee in the same manner
that license taxes are paid into the Treasury under article twelve, chapter eleven of this code;

(2) Fifteen dollars of the marriage license fee received pursuant to this subsection shall
be paid by the county clerk into the State Treasury for the Family Protection Shelter Support Act
in the same manner that license taxes are paid into the Treasury under article twelve, chapter
eleven of this code;

(3) Ten dollars of the marriage license fee received pursuant to this subsection shall be
deposited in the Courthouse Facilities Improvement Fund created by section six, article twentysix, chapter twenty-nine of this code; and

(4) If a premarital education course completion certificate is not presented, the county
clerk shall, on or before the tenth day of each month, transmit \$20 of the marriage license fee
received pursuant to this subsection to the State Treasurer for deposit in the State Treasury as
follows:

(A) Five dollars to the credit of the Family Protection Shelter Support Act in the same
manner that license taxes are paid into the Treasury under article twelve, chapter eleven of this
code;

(B) Five dollars to the credit of the special revenue account, hereby created, designated 66 the "Fund for Civil Legal Services for Low Income Persons," which shall consists of all gifts, grants, 67 68 bequests, transfers, appropriations or other donations or payments which may be received and 69 administered by the Division of Justice and Community Services from any governmental entity or 70 unit or any person, firm, foundation, or corporation for the purposes of this section, and all interest 71 or other return earned from investment of the fund. Expenditures from the fund shall be made by 72 the Director of the Division of Justice and Community Services and shall be limited to grants to 73 nonprofit agencies which provide civil legal services to low income persons made at his or her 74 discretion. Any balance in the fund at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the General

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75 Revenue Fund but shall remain in the fund and be expended as provided by this section.

- (C) Ten dollars to the credit of the Marriage Education Fund created pursuant to section
 seven hundred two, article two, chapter forty-eight of this code.
- (d) (1) One dollar and fifty cents for a copy of any writing or document, if it is not otherwiseprovided for.
- 80 (2) One dollar for each additional page if the writing or documents contains more than two81 pages.
- 82 (3) One dollar for annexing the seal of the commission or clerk to any paper.
- 83 (4) Five <u>Eleven</u> dollars for a certified copy of a birth certificate, death certificate or marriage
- 84 license. Six dollars of each fee the county clerk collects for certified copies shall be remitted
- 85 guarterly to the Tax Commissioner. Upon remittance of the fee, the county clerk shall file returns
- 86 on forms and in the manner as prescribed by the Tax Commissioner. The Tax Commissioner shall
- 87 then remit accrued funds to the State Treasurer, who shall place the collected funds in the Court
- 88 Appointed Special Advocate Fund created in section six, article one, chapter forty-nine of this
- 89 <u>code.</u>
- 90 (e) For copies of any record in electronic form or a medium other than paper, a reasonable
- 91 fee set by the clerk of the county commission not to exceed the costs associated with document
- 92 search and duplication.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to provide for a court appointed special advocate (CASA) program in each judicial circuit and court appointed special advocates in each county for child abuse and neglect cases. The bill also provides for a revenue stream and a fund within the State Treasury to pay for the implementation and sustenance of court-appointed special advocate programs.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
