Senate Bill 620

A BILL to amend and reenact §17C-7-1 and §17C-7-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend and reenact §17C-8-8 of said code, all relating to traffic regulations; increasing fines; permitting visible instead of audible signal when passing to the left of an overtaken vehicle; and clarifying that an appropriate signal is required when moving right or left upon a roadway.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

That §17C-7-1 and §17C-7-3 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, be amended and reenacted; and that §17C-8-8 of said code be amended and reenacted, all to read as follows:

ARTICLE 7. DRIVING ON RIGHT SIDE OF ROADWAY, OVERTAKING AND PASSING, ETC.

§17C-7-1. Driving on right side of roadway; exceptions; penalty.

- (a) Upon all roadways of sufficient width a vehicle shall be driven upon the right half of the roadway, except as follows:
- (1) When overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction under the rules governing such movement;
 - (2) When the right half of a roadway is closed to traffic while under construction or repair;
- (3) Upon a roadway divided into three marked lanes for traffic under the rules applicable thereon; or
 - (4) Upon a roadway designated and signposted for one-way traffic.
- (b) Upon all roadways any vehicle proceeding at less than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place and under the conditions then existing shall be driven in the right-hand lane then available for traffic, or as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway, except when overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction or when preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into a private road or driveway.

(c) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100 \$250; upon a second conviction within one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200 \$350; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500.

§17C-7-3. Overtaking and passing vehicle or bicycle proceeding in same direction — passing on the left generally; penalty.

- (a) The following rules govern the overtaking and passing of vehicles proceeding in the same direction subject to these limitations, exceptions and special rules hereinafter stated:
- (1) The driver of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle proceeding in the same direction shall give an audible <u>or visible</u> signal and pass to the left of the overtaken vehicle at a safe distance and may not again drive to the right side of the roadway until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle.
- (2) The driver of a vehicle overtaking a bicycle traveling in the same direction shall pass to the left of the bicycle at a distance of not less than three feet at a careful and reduced speed, and may not again drive to the right side of the roadway until safely clear of the overtaken bicycle.
- (3) Except when overtaking and passing on the right is permitted, the driver of an overtaken vehicle shall give way to the right in favor of the overtaking vehicle on audible <u>or visible</u> signal and may not increase the speed of his or her vehicle until completely passed by the overtaking vehicle.
- (b) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100 \$250; upon a second conviction within one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200 \$350; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500.

ARTICLE 8. TURNING AND STARTING, AND SIGNALS ON STOPPING AND TURNING.

§17C-8-8. Turning movements and required signals; penalty.

(a) No person shall turn a vehicle at an intersection unless the vehicle is in proper position upon the roadway as required in section two, three, four or five of this article, or turn a vehicle to

- enter a private road or driveway or otherwise turn a vehicle from a direct course or move right or

 left upon a roadway unless and until such movement can be made with reasonable safety. No

 person shall so turn <u>or so move</u> any vehicle without giving an appropriate signal in the manner

 hereinafter provided in the event any other traffic may be affected by such movement.
 - (b) A signal of intention to turn <u>or move</u> right or left when required shall be given continuously during not less than the last one hundred feet traveled by the vehicle before turning <u>or moving</u>.
 - (c) No person shall stop or suddenly decrease the speed of a vehicle without first giving an appropriate signal in the manner provided herein to the driver of any vehicle immediately to the rear when there is opportunity to give such signal.
 - (d) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$100 \$250; upon a second conviction within one year thereafter, shall be fined not more than \$200 \$350; and upon a third or subsequent conviction, shall be fined not more than \$500.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to increase penalties for vehicles driving slow in the passing lane or for overtaking a vehicle or turning or making a lane change without giving a signal; to clarify that signaling is required when changing lanes; and to permit a visual instead of audible signal when overtaking or passing a vehicle.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
