A BILL to amend and reenact §18A-2-1 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
 to hiring of professional personnel; permitting posting of vacancies; and providing for job
 applications.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 2. SCHOOL PERSONNEL.

§18A-2-1. Employment in general.

(a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, the employment of professional
 personnel shall be made by the board only upon nomination and recommendation of the
 superintendent, subject to the following:

4 (1) The superintendent shall provide the principal at the school at which the professional 5 educator or paraprofessional employee is to be employed an opportunity to interview all qualified 6 applicants and make recommendations to the county superintendent regarding their employment; 7 (2) The principal may not recommend for employment an individual who is related to him 8 or her as father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, first cousin, nephew, niece, 9 husband, wife, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-10 law, stepfather, stepmother, stepson, stepdaughter, stepbrother, stepsister, half-brother or half-11 sister:

12 (3) Nothing shall prohibit the timely employment of persons to perform necessary duties;

(4) In case the board refuses to employ any or all of the persons nominated, the
superintendent shall nominate others and submit the same to the board at such time as the board
may direct;

(5) All personnel so nominated and recommended for employment and for subsequent
assignment shall meet the certification, licensing, training and other eligibility classifications as
may be required by provisions of this chapter and by state board rule. In addition to any other
information required, the application for any certification or licensing shall include the applicant's
Social Security number.

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(b) Professional personnel employed as deputy, associate or assistant superintendents
by the board in offices, departments or divisions at locations other than a school and who are
directly answerable to the superintendent shall serve at the will and pleasure of the superintendent
and may be removed by the superintendent upon approval of the board. Such professional
personnel shall retain seniority rights only in the area or areas in which they hold valid certification
or licensure.

27 (c) The board may post future vacancies for professional personnel. Job applications may

28 be submitted to the board, the principal and the superintendent. The board may employ

29 professional personnel after due consideration of all applicants. The board shall include in its

30 consideration any nomination by the principal or a recommendation timely submitted to the board.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to permit county boards of education to post professional personnel job vacancies and provide for job applications to be submitted and considered in a timely fashion.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

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
