A BILL to repeal §16-4C-6c of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended; and to amend said
code by adding thereto a new section, designated §22A-10-3, relating to emergency

3 medical technicians – mining; and transferring certification requirements for emergency

4 medical technician – mining to the chapter governing miners' health, safety and training.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 4C. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACT.

§16-4C-6c. Certification requirements for emergency medical technician - mining.

ARTICLE 10. EMERGENCY MEDICAL PERSONNEL.

§22A-10-3. Certification requirements for emergency medical technician – mining.

- 1 (a) An applicant for certification as an emergency medical technician mining shall:
- 2 (1) Be at least 18 years old;
- 3 (2) Apply on a form prescribed by the Director of Miners' Health, Safety and Training;
- 4 (3) Pay the application fee;
- 5 (4) Possess a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification;
- 6 (5) Successfully complete an emergency medical technician mining education program
- 7 authorized by the Director of Miners' Health, Safety and Training in consultation with the Board of
- 8 Coal Mine Health and Safety; and
- 9 (6) Successfully complete emergency medical technician mining cognitive and skills
- 10 examinations authorized by the Director of Miners' Health, Safety and Training in consultation
- 11 with the Board of Coal Mine Health and Safety.
- 12 (b) The emergency medical technician mining certification is valid for three years.
- 13 (c) A certified emergency medical technician mining may only practice on mining
- 14 operations, as defined in §11-13C-3 of this code.
- 15 (d) To be recertified as an emergency medical technician mining, a certificate holder
- 16 <u>shall:</u>
- 17 (1) Apply on a form prescribed by the Director of Miners' Health, Safety and Training;

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18	(2) Pay the application fee:
19	(3) Possess a valid cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification;
20	(4) Successfully complete one of the following:
21	(A) A one-time 32-hour emergency medical technician - mining recertification course
22	authorized by the Director of Miners' Health, Safety and Training in consultation with the Board of
23	Coal Mine Health and Safety; or
24	(B) Three annual eight-hour retraining and testing programs authorized by the Director of
25	Miners' Health, Safety and Training in consultation with the Board of Coal Mine Health and Safety;
26	and
27	(5) Successfully complete emergency medical technician - mining cognitive and skills
28	recertification examinations authorized by the Director of Miners' Health, Safety and Training in
29	consultation with the Board of Coal Mine Health and Safety.
30	(e) The education program, training, courses, and cognitive and skills examinations
31	required for certification and recertification as an emergency medical technician - miner, also
32	known as emergency medical technician - mining, in existence on January 1, 2014, shall remain
33	in effect for the certification and recertification of emergency medical technician - industrial until
34	they are changed by legislative rule by the commissioner in consultation with the Board of Coal
35	Mine Health and Safety.
36	(f) The administration of the emergency medical technician - mining certification and
37	recertification program by the Director of Miners' Health, Safety and Training shall be done in
38	consultation with the Board of Coal Mine Health and Safety.
39	(g) The Director of Miners' Health, Safety and Training shall propose rules for legislative
40	approval, pursuant to the provisions of §29A-3-1 et seq. of this code, in consultation with the
41	Board of Coal Mine Health and Safety and may propose emergency rules to:
42	(1) Establish emergency medical technician - mining certification and recertification
43	courses and examinations;

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- 44 (2) Authorize providers to administer the certification and recertification courses and
- 45 examinations, including mine training personnel, independent trainers, community and technical
- 46 colleges, regional education service agencies, and educational service cooperatives: Provided,
- 47 That the mine training personnel and independent trainers must have a valid cardiopulmonary
- 48 resuscitation certification and must be an approved Mine Safety and Health Administration- or
- 49 Occupational Safety and Health Administration-certified instructor;
- 50 (3) Establish a fee schedule: *Provided*, That the application fee may not exceed \$10 and
- 51 there shall be no fee for a certificate; and
- 52 (4) Implement the provisions of this section.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to transfer the governance of emergency medical technicians – mining from the code addressing public health to the code addressing miners' health and safety.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
