A BILL to amend and reenact §18A-3-7 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, relating
to removing certain fees for teaching, administrative, and support certificates established
by the State Board of Education for out-of-state applicants with comparable out-of-state
certifications, and capping fees at in-state levels for teaching, administrative, and support
certificates for out-of-state applicants without comparable out-of-state certifications.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 3. TRAINING, CERTIFICATION, LICENSING, PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT.

§18A-3-7. Certificate fees.

- 1 The fee for the issuance or renewal of any certificate, if applicable, shall be established
- 2 by the State Board of Education: *Provided*, That no fees, other than fingerprint background check
- 3 fees, shall be charged to applicants for any teaching, administrative, or support certificates to out-
- 4 of-state applicants that hold a comparable certification in another state; and no fees greater than
- 5 in-state fees shall be charged to out-of-state applicants who do not hold a comparable certification
- 6 in another state for any teaching, administrative, or support certificates.

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to encourage out-of-state educational professionals to apply and work in West Virginia by removing certificate fees.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.
